Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I saw this reflection in "Sunday Preaching" by Rev. Charles Miller, C.M. published by Alba House and wanted to share it with you.

FAITH, LIKE LOVE, IS THE WAY TO SEE

We have a saying that "love is blind."

You might hear this statement at a wedding from young men who wonder how a beautiful bride could possibly see anything in a groom who is, in their judgement, much less handsome than they.

"What does she see in that guy?" they ask.

I believe it is a mistake to think that love is blind. I think that love, and love alone, can truly see all the wonderful qualities in a human person which those without love fail to perceive.

Love gives a vision, a deeper way of seeing.

Faith is something like that.

Faith, and faith alone, can truly see all the wonders of God.

In the Gospel of this Sunday Jesus gives us sight to a man who had been born blind.

Jesus' miracle in today's gospel is a symbol of faith which comes to us when we are washed in the water of baptism.

We were chosen like David in the first reading, and after our baptism we were anointed like him to share in the kingship of Christ.

Those without faith look at a fellow human being and see only a rational animal.

Those WITH FAITH see a child of God.

Those WITHOUT FAITH pick up a bible and find only words.

Those WITH FAITH discover the Word of God.

Those **WITHOUT FAITH** look at the Eucharist and see only bread and wine.

Those **WITH FAITH** experience the reality of the Lord's body given up for us and his blood poured out for us.

Those WITHOUT FAITH look at suffering and only see tragedy.

Those WITH FAITH believe that suffering is a sharing in the cross of Christ.

Those WITHOUT FAITH look at death and see separation and oblivion.


Those **WITH FAITH** accept death as a step which leads to a new, fuller life through the resurrection of Christ.

SPIRITUALLY 101: PREPARING FOR OUR PENANCE SERVICE THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN RECONCILIATION AND FORGIVENESS

Compared with reconciliation, forgiveness is a piece of cake. Forgiveness by God is, of course, a great and undeserved blessing.

Forgiveness and Reconciliation

Forgiveness is different from reconciliation. Forgiveness requires only one; a forgiver. Reconciliation takes at least two, a forgiver and a recipient. God will always forgive us, but we will not always accept the forgiveness. For example, the story of the prodigal son does not reveal whether the two sons were reconciled with their father, even though he forgave them both.

New Name for Sacrament of Penance

In the renewal of the Sacraments mandated by the Second Vatican Council (1965), the Sacrament of Penance received a new name: "Sacrament of Reconciliation". This was not done suddenly but was carefully studied for several years before Pope Paul VI approved the new name in 1973. "Reconciliation" describes much more adequately the purpose of the Sacrament, which is to reconcile the sinner to God and to the Church, and to set the stage for reconciliation within the person, healing the wounds of sin.

Sin can be forgiven from the outside, but it has originated from the inside and must be healed from the inside.

Reconciliation with God and Community

Reconciliation is very different from simple forgiveness. Most of the time, a person entering the confessional has already been forgiven, because God forgives us the moment we turn to Him. There is an initial reconciliation with God at that same moment, but it may be very fragile. There may still be no reconciliation with the Church, the community of faith, and no healing of the fissure that has been opened in the heart of sin.

It is like going to the doctor with a tourniquet to stop profuse bleeding so that attention to the cause of the bleeding can be addressed and healing from the inside may begin.

Sin can be forgiven from the outside, but it has originated from the inside and must be healed from the inside. We may confess a lie, for example, and it is forgiven. But the lie did not spring up without roots. There was a cause, and the cause was a diseased organ, the heart. It doesn't help much to attend to the mouth that told the lie if there is no attention to the heart that spawned it.

During Lent we desire to open ourselves to the reconciliation that reunited us to God and to God's people and brings healing to the heart. Then the wonderful gift of divine forgiveness will be able to achieve its total purpose in freeing us from our sins.

Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Our national pastime isn't baseball. It's what the Bible calls "condemning the world." We generally enjoy pronouncing curses upon those whom we see as trouble, wrong, or evil. Don't believe me? Listen to almost any podcast, cable news network, or social media platform to hear it. It will be some version of: "We all agree that if *they* are eradicated, things will be great." Condemning is almost always clothed in virtue. It basks in its good intentions. That's why it is so attractive. Condemning seems like our best path to saving what is good.

What a shock, then, to hear Jesus announce: "For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him" (Jn 3:17). He comes to save the world, as we all want, but he will accomplish it without an act of condemnation. How hard it is to accept this! Condemning feels godlike. I judge who and what must be lost to protect the good. But in the light of Jesus' endless mercy and love, this is the least godlike thing we can do.

Lenten challenge: This week, I invite you to give up the delicious experience of condemning whomever in the world you most would like to see gone. Perhaps write down their names. Secondly, I invite you to consider fasting from any media that feeds the tasty but deadly tendency to condemn.


