Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I wanted to share with you, this reflection is from Desert Blessings, Lent 2003.

ASK AND IT SHALL BE GIVEN

“Sir, we should like to see Jesus.” (Jn 12:20-33)

A third - year theology student decided to go after the same thing the Greeks in the gospel wanted: to see Jesus, up close and in the flesh. So his spiritual director took him to a local convalescent home and told him to walk around the place for the afternoon. The student sat with an angry old woman cutting up magazines and muttering about the state of the world. He encountered an Alzheimer's patient crying out pitifully and weeping without comfort. He visited with ancient men drooling at the mouth and no one to wipe them. Finally, he wound up in the room of a blind woman who was over a hundred years old. She told him stories about the way the world was when she was a girl, about the man who romanced her and won her heart, the children she bore and loved. Eventually it became clear to the student that everyone this woman had known and loved was dead, and only her memories remained to sustain her.

The student returned to his spiritual director's office and told him that he could not find Jesus anywhere in that awful place, “Really?” the director replied. “The woman at the front desk just called to say he had been there all afternoon, visiting with the residents.”

“ When have you been Jesus for others?”

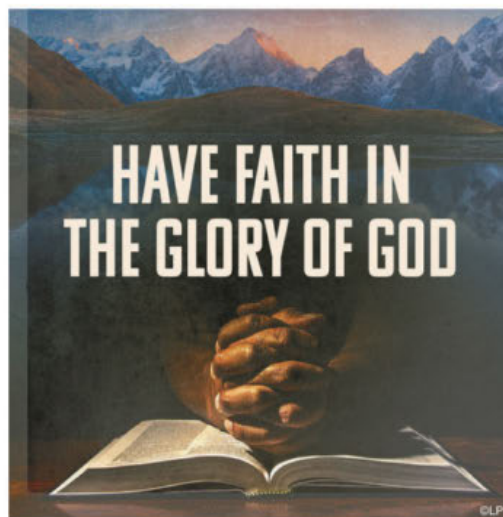

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

A middle-aged woman sat on the couch in my parish office and recounted to me a shocking list of terrible calamities in her life: addictions, terminal illnesses, financial loss, broken relationships, and so on. She smiled as she did so. "Please forgive me," I asked, "but you seem to be smiling as you share this." She said, "Father John, I am totally overwhelmed. But I'm smiling because I just can't wait to see what good things God does with this mess." She expected God would manifest His glory when she most needed it.

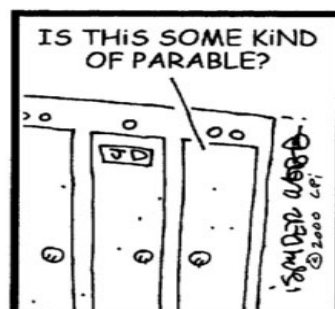
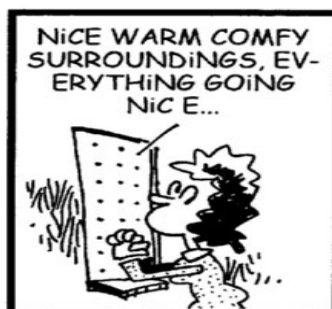
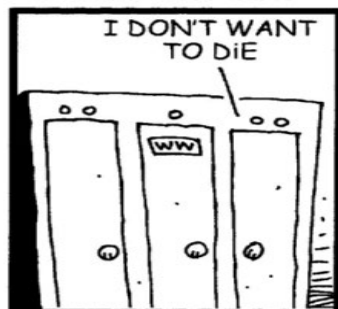
This week in the Gospel, God speaks from heaven for the third and final time in Jesus' earthly ministry. It's at a tough moment. Gentiles seek Jesus, who announces his terrible suffering, and then boldly prays, "**Father, glorify your name!**" John then writes: **Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it and will glorify it again."** Was the task of drawing the whole non-Jewish world to himself overwhelming? Or was it the terrible specter of crucifixion? Whatever it was, the crushing weight triggers his turning to the Father with an unshakeable expectation of divine glory to burst through. And indeed, it did on Easter Sunday. In our burdens, our greatest strength is to turn to God and boldly ask Him for His glory.

Lenten challenge: This week, I invite you to list out everything which is a burden to you. Write it down. Then add these words: "Father, glorify Your name in all these things!" Put that paper in your pocket or purse when you come to Holy Week liturgies next week. You might smile at the most unlikely times.

SPIRITUAL REFLECTION FOR LENT

TEACH US TO PRAY: PRAYING WITH A CONTRITE HEART

In an interview for Jesuit magazines across the world in 2013, Pope Francis was asked to define himself. His first words in response were “I am a sinner.”

Some people professed surprise that a pope would categorize himself as sinful, but for most Christians the response was probably, “So am I.”

The Catholic Church has been criticized for over emphasizing sin, for overwhelming people with guilt, and even for causing people to be ashamed of whom they are.

But lost in some of these critiques is an important truth: we are all indeed sinners.

This is not to say that we are all unredeemed reprobates or terrible criminals; rather, we are all imperfect human beings who sin.

Thus, a humble stance before God is natural.

Yet there is another equally important part of this equation.

We are sinners—but we are loved passionately by God.

That was the second part of Pope Francis’ answer: “I am a sinner whom the Lord has looked upon.”

When praying, we must keep both realities in mind: we are

sinful,
we are
loved.

Lent is a time of penance, and a time of prayer with a contrite heart.

But it also is a time to pray with a heart that trusts in the love of God and hopes in the mercy of God.

If you doubt that, think about the Parable of the Prodigal Son, or the Parable of the Lost Sheep, or the Parable of the Lost Coin.

God welcomes us, seeks us out, searches for us, sinners though we may be—and loves us all the while.

Child sexual abusers often target nurturing, child-friendly environments, where parents and participants assume that no one would ever want to harm a child. The Archdiocese of Los Angeles began implementing the VIRTUS® Protecting God’s Children sexual abuse prevention program in 2004 to send a message to potential predators that child sexual abuse is not tolerated. Through this program, adults learn that through early identification, awareness, and education they can be “proactive” in protecting children and young people from child sexual abuse. Since the program began, more than 405,000 adults have been trained in abuse prevention. Additionally, more than 165,000 Catholic school and religious education students are trained annually with an age-appropriate curriculum on boundary awareness and how to communicate if violations of those safe boundaries occur.
