Dear Brothers and Sister in Christ,

I saw this reflection in Living Faith, by Sr. Melannie Svoboda, S.N.D. and wanted to share it with you.

What Does God Desire of Us?

*The command I give you is something very near to you, already in your mouths and in your hearts.
~ Deuteronomy 30:14*

What does God desire of us? Today's readings help answer that question. Deuteronomy says we don't have to go high up into the sky or far across the sea to discover God's will for us. It is in our hearts. It is in the specific circumstances of our everyday life. St. Paul gives us another clue. Although God may be invisible, he says Jesus is not. In fact, Jesus is the very "image of the invisible God" (Colossians 1:15). We have only to look to Jesus — his life and his teachings—to discover God's will for us.

And finally, Jesus' parable of the Good Samaritan gives a concrete example of what God Desires of us —compassion. And what is compassion? It is love made visible. It is putting aside our own prejudices and agenda to help someone in need. It is going out of our way, sharing our resources, opting for tenderness.

Good and gracious God, help me to listen to my heart, to follow Jesus and to make compassion visible in my life.

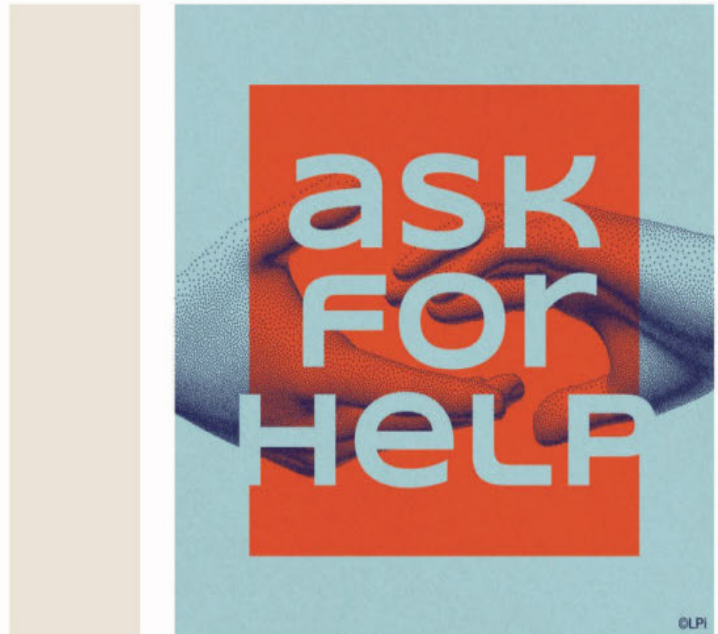

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

I used to be a bad neighbor. I'd get wrapped up in my life and ignore those around me. Then I found sage advice from Benjamin Franklin to this effect: to be a better neighbor, ask someone to do a favor for you. It's counterintuitive, isn't it? Tell strangers that I need their help? Yuck. I'll risk looking needy. Worse, I'll be indebted to them. But I tried it, and it works like a charm. Recently I asked my neighbor Alan for a hacksaw, and Inga for an egg. They kindly obliged, and our friendship is growing.

This week we hear a scribe of the law cynically ask Jesus, **"And who is my neighbor?" (Luke 10:29)**. Like him, we prefer to keep the list of our "neighbors" as short as possible. It requires less interruption and inconvenience. But when Jesus tells the parable of the Good Samaritan, he exposes the lonely, cold-heartedness tendency of the scribe's (and our) heart. My "neighbor" is anyone I encounter who manifests a concrete need. There isn't time to require any other credential because human need opens us to the happy reciprocity which is love.

Jesus' words challenge us this week to ask a neighbor for help in some small way. How marvelous that God himself shows us how. He moves into our world and asks us to love Him with small deeds of love. Maybe that's where Ben Franklin got the idea.

THE SPIRITUAL EXERCISES OF ST. IGNATIUS: RETREAT IN DAILY LIFE

St. Ignatius in the Spiritual Exercises asks us to consider in light of the Sacrifice Jesus made for us: "...what have I done for Christ, what am I doing for Christ, what ought I do for Christ." How would you answer those questions? Is Jesus asking you spend more time with him? To give him the better part of your day? Leah heard the call and answered with a "yes." This is what happened:

This time last year, I saw a testimonial in the bulletin for the St. Ignatius Spiritual Exercises and it piqued my interest. But I had no idea what it was. I wanted to increase my prayer time and liven up my spiritual life, and the timing seemed right for me. As I began, I quickly learned that God had much more in store for me. We have all heard priests and religious leaders encourage us to just sit with God. Just be in His presence. Give Him time. These exercises taught me how simply doing that could take me on a wild adventure in my spiritual life that I never saw coming. Some days were quieter than others. Some were filled with visible signs from God. These signs could seem random and separate from each other at first, but then I would see how God was weaving a beautiful tapestry for me. This tapestry involved everything and everyone in my life. I was blown away. What touched me most was seeing how deep and intense God's love is for me. The Exercises have been a major turning point in my life and I am forever grateful for them and for the team that facilitates it. I will continue onward with all that I have learned and been graced with, knowing that God is always there, never changing, and calling me toward him in every moment of my life.

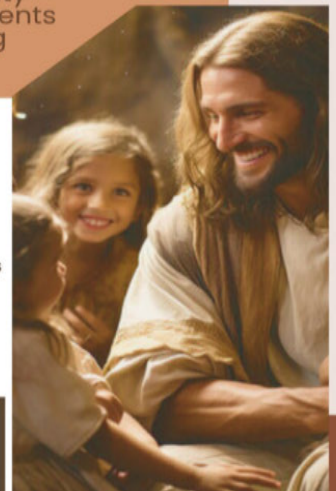

Bishop Joseph M. Sartoris



With faith in the promises of our Lord Jesus Christ, we inform you of the death of [Bishop Joseph M. Sartoris who went home to the Lord](#) on Friday, June 27, 2025, the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. He was 97 years old.

Bishop Joseph was ordained a priest on May 30, 1953, and consecrated a Bishop for the Archdiocese of Los Angeles on March 19, 1994. While serving in the Archdiocese, these were his assignments:

Child sexual abusers often target nurturing, child-friendly environments, where parents and participants assume that no one would ever want to harm a child. The Archdiocese of Los Angeles began implementing the VIRTUS® Protecting God's Children sexual abuse prevention program in 2004 to send a message to potential predators that child sexual abuse is not tolerated. Through this program, adults learn that through early identification, awareness, and education they can be "proactive" in protecting children and young people from child sexual abuse. Since the program began, more than 405,000 adults have been trained in abuse prevention. Additionally, more than 165,000 Catholic school and religious education students are trained annually with an age-appropriate curriculum on boundary awareness and how to communicate if violations of those safe boundaries occur.
