Dear Brothers and Sister in Christ,

I read this reflection in Living Liturgy 2013 and wanted to share it with you.

There are many treasures found in this life, for example, family, home, community, friendship, integrity. Good as these are, they are nonetheless exhaustible. What the Father offers us is an inexhaustible Treasure: the fullness of the Life of the risen Lord. Possessing this divine Life is possessing the Spirit of the risen Son who dwells within those of us who are faithful stewards.

We live according to where our treasure is. This is why the way we live as disciples is so critical. This is why being a disciple is not something we slot into our already to busy schedules: one hour a week at Mass, so much money into the collection basket, another hour a week doing some volunteer work. Being a disciple to the "master's will" which means, first, being true to making present the kingdom which is already within and among us. This is the "much" with which we have been entrusted: who we are and how we live makes present God's kingdom.

The way we live, therefore, witnesses to where our treasure is. Our very living challenges others to prioritize their own treasures. Clearly, God must have priority in our lives. We make this apparent when religion is not so much practices we do as a loving relationship we develop as we encounter God and then extend that life we are given to others.

Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

There was a young mother in my parish community who was depressed due to financial strain. She prayed for help. One morning before Mass, she placed on the counter a zip-lock bag filled with jewelry and old coins. Smiling, she explained she had been fixing an old cabinet and found the items hidden deep within the walls of her home. One particular coin could be worth as much as \$900,000. The contents of the bag-previously unknown to them-were now their prized possession. Their plans changed that week. They had to learn how much it was worth.

This week, the Lord tells us, "For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be" (Luke 12:34). Our lives revolve around what we treasure. When we discover the treasure the Father gives us-the kingdom of God-everything changes. We might not know its precise value, but we rearrange our lives around it. The joy of this discovery should never be far from our minds.

Sometimes we go through times when we can't find this treasure. It seems hidden. Or it appears like dirty old coins and worthless jewelry in a Ziploc bag. But how crazy would my parishioners be if they tossed it away without knowing the cash value? How much crazier are we if we center our hearts on any treasure except that of Jesus and his kingdom? Remember, the Father is pleased to give it to us. That's why we put our hearts there, even when it is hidden.



August 15, 2025—Feast of the Assumption

In compliance with the Decree outlined below, the precept to attend Mass on August 15, 2025, the Feast of the Assumption, is abrogated for this year. However, because this is a Holy Day in the eyes of the Church, although not a day of obligation for this year, we do invite you to celebrate. The Feast of the Assumption celebrates both the happy departure of Mary from this life by her assumption bodily into heaven. Along with the Feast of the Immaculate Conception (December 8), the Assumption is a principal feast of the Blessed Virgin and a Holy Day. This is one of the most important feast of the Church year.

The Feast of the Assumption is a sign to us that someday, through God's grace and efforts, we too may join the Blessed Mother in giving glory to God. We seek to imitate her self - sacrificing love, her indestructible faith and her perfect obedience. Furthermore, the Church, in her love and wisdom for her children, gives us these HOLY DAYS, whether they be obligatory or not, so that we may have the gift of setting aside the routines and challenges of daily life in order to encounter once more God's deep and abiding love for us. Therefore, we invite you to celebrate the Great Feast of Mary's Assumption into Heaven on August 15. Mass times will be Thursday August 14th at 6:00 p.m. and Friday August 15th at 8:00a.m. and 6:00 p.m.

At their plenary assembly in November 1991, the National Conference of Catholic Bishops approved a motion which affected the observance of Holy Days of Obligation.

The Decree of Promulgation read as follows: "In addition to Sunday, the days to be observed as holy days of obligation in the Latin Rite diocese of the United States of America, in conformity with canon 1246, are:

January 1, the Solemnity of Mary Mother of God;

Thursday of the sixth week of Easter, the Solemnity of the Ascension; (in the majority of the U.S. diocese including Los Angeles, this feast is transferred to the following Sunday).

August 15, the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary;

November 1, the Solemnity of ALL Saints;

December 8, the solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, Patroness of the United States of America;

December 25, Solemnity of the Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

In addition the bishops approved a motion that whenever January 1, the Solemnity of Mary of God; **August 15**, the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary; **November 1**, the Solemnity of All Saints, falls on Saturday or on a Monday the precept to attend Mass is abrogated.



Child sexual abusers often target nurturing, child-friendly environments, where parents and participants assume that no one would ever want to harm a child. The Archdiocese of Los Angeles began implementing the VIRTUS® Protecting God's Children sexual abuse prevention program in 2004 to send a message to potential predators that child sexual abuse is not tolerated. Through this program, adults learn that through early identification, awareness, and education they can be "proactive" in protecting children and young people from child sexual abuse. Since the program began, more than 405,000 adults have been trained in abuse prevention. Additionally, more than 165,000 Catholic school and religious education students are trained annually with an age-appropriate curriculum on boundary awareness and how to communicate if violations of those safe boundaries occur. The training makes participants aware of the signs of child sexual abuse, the methods and means by which offenders commit abuse, and five easy steps one can use to prevent child sexual abuse. Two videos are the centerpiece of the training: A Time to Protect God's Children™ and A Plan to Protect God's Children™. The facilitators incorporate policies and procedures into the training defining child sexual abuse, addressing the reporting of child sexual abuse, the screening and selection of employees and volunteers, and victim advocacy.


