I saw this reflection in Living With Christ, published by Bayard Inc., written by Rev. George M. Smiga and wanted to share it with you.

Overcoming the Fear of Fire

When we come to Jesus, we do not expect fire. But this is what we receive in the Gospel reading for today.

Jesus announces that his mission is to set the world on fire and to cause divisions rather than peace. This seems so contrary to our understanding of Jesus. We usually see him as an agent of harmony and reconciliation. What is going on here? It is important to understand that Jesus is not encouraging violence or divisions on earth. Rather, he is describing what will often happen in our lives when we follow him. In the imperfect and often unjust world in which we live, speaking the truth, standing up for what is right, is not always welcome. It often causes fires.

Being a disciple does not mean that our attitude must always be docile and agreeable. Standing for what is right, even if it causes division, is compatible with the gospel. In fact, it is essential to it.

You tell your teenager that he cannot go to an unsupervised party with his friends. There is an angry comment, a slam of the bedroom door, and smoldering silence. You have made the right call, but now there is fire.

You terminate a worker whom you supervise because of long-standing negligence. She cleans out her desk and comes into your office to turn in her keys. Not a word is spoken, but you can see in her eyes the rejection and resentment. You have made the right decision, but you have also sent things ablaze.

You are out with friends when one of them cruelly demeans someone because of the person's religion, race, sexual orientation. For a minute you think you will let it pass, but then you speak out against the comment. Some of the people around you hear what you are saying, but others dismiss you as overly sensitive. You have said the right thing, but you have also caused division.


Speak the Truth

How wonderful it would be if following Jesus was easy. How satisfying it would be to speak the truth and be greeted with applause. But this is not the world which we live. That is why Jesus' words last Sunday are so important: "Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom." We can draw courage from Jesus' presence and overcome the fear of displeasing others, so that we can make the tough decisions necessary to build God's kingdom. None of us desires to anger or upset others. But avoiding unpleasant reactions cannot be our top priority. Our fundamental obligation is to speak truth and to make choices that foster God's will in our world.

If we do this, we will be following Jesus—even if we set things on fire.



Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

During my baseball career, my best coach often said, "You shouldn't be worried if I yell at you. Be worried if I don't. If I stop pushing you, it means I don't think you have any more potential." He demanded a lot, and I knew it meant he saw that I could be something special on the baseball field.

Jesus says some demanding words to us this week.

"Do you think I have come to establish peace on the earth?" he asks, "No, tell you, but rather division"

(Luke 12:51). He wants you and me-in fact, all the earth-to participate in the luminous glory of God. That's why he speaks of himself as a divine arsonist. Divine fire is like a good coach: it demands the removal of all that obstructs the achievement of the lofty goal.

How is your life demanding right now? That inconvenient family situation, the unfair boss at work, the kids who reject their parents' wishes, the nagging health issue? Maybe things would be more peaceful devoid of these seemingly arbitrary difficulties. But for us who believe in the one who comes to set the earth of fire, we should be much more worried if he stops demanding so much from us. In fact, let's thank him for it. He sees how glorious we can become.


