The Surprising Kingdom of God

... some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last.. ~ Luke 13:30

Jesus challenges human standards of fairness and righteousness. When the crowds think they have figured out the ways of God, Jesus challenges then to look deep from God's perspective.

Taking on God's viewpoint marks the transformative journey of living faith. The question posed to Jesus in the Gospel expresses the human desire to know with certainty who will be saved. But Salvation cannot be fully known or understood precisely because it comes from God, not from us. And God's desire to save all in the mystery of divine measures of mercy and justice transcends our limited vision and narrow calculations.

So, some who are last will be first, and some who are first will be last. Only complete and trusting faith in God matters.

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

I've been hiking Camelback Mountain in Phoenix, Arizona most of my life. It is a vigorous forty-five minutes to the top. Near the peak, the end suddenly appears much further away, and steeper. At that moment, a descending hiker often offers encouragement: "Keep going! The peak is right there. It's not as far as it looks. You can do it!" It usually works. After another five minute push, you summit and enjoy a glorious panorama of the Sonoran Desert in the Valley of the Sun.

When Jesus is asked about how many people are saved, he says: "Strive to enter through the narrow gate" (Luke 13:24). How many? Strive! Focus on your journey. What does heavenly census taking have to do with you or me? How would it help a hiker on a mountain to ask the others coming down, "How many people are going to make it to the top?" A normal response would be something like: "How is that a relevant question? Carry on!"

Jesus links one virtue directly to salvation: perseverance (cf. Matt 24:13; hypomone in Greek). Strive! Endure! Keep going! The one absolutely necessary virtue is perseverance, to not give up on our journey. The mountain we struggle to climb is often our own weakness, failures, and sins. Persevere in prayer. Keep celebrating the sacraments. Embrace daily duties. With God's grace, you are strong enough to keep going. Perhaps the peak is not as far away as you might fear. Keep going!

With faith in the Resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ, we inform you of the death of Reverend Séamus Anthony Glynn, Jr., who passed into eternal life on Monday, July 14, 2025. He was 91 years old.

Fr. Séamus was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Los Angeles on June 8, 1958. and later incardinated into the Diocese of Orange, California, on March 24, 1976.

Child sexual abusers often target nurturing, child-friendly environments, where parents and participants assume that no one would ever want to harm a child. The Archdiocese of Los Angeles began implementing the VIRTUS® Protecting God's Children sexual abuse prevention program in 2004 to send a message to potential predators that child sexual abuse is not tolerated. Through this program, adults learn that through early identification, awareness, and education they can be "proactive" in protecting children and young people from child sexual abuse. Since the program began, more than 405,000 adults have been trained in abuse prevention. Additionally, more than 165,000 Catholic school and religious education students are trained annually with an age-appropriate curriculum on boundary awareness and how to communicate if violations of those safe boundaries occur. To work or volunteer in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, all clergy, staff, and volunteers:

- Must attend original 3 hr. VIRTUS® "Protecting God's Children" Adult Awareness Session.
- Must recertify every four years on/or before the expiration date on the face of their current certificate.
 See the sample dateline below. The participant has 30 days after their expiration date to complete the recertification; if not, they must retake Protecting God's Children.




