My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I saw this reflection by Captured Fire and wanted to share it with you.

"Of the cup I drink, you shall drink," says the Lord

Today's Gospel reading presents us with a fact about suffering that we don't often notice, a fact which we experience more often than we think. Suffering can be tragic; suffering can be oppressive. Our readings though, remind us that suffering can also be redemptive. The word "redemption" is a legal word from Old Testament times. It means ransom or exchange.

Suffering has a redemptive dimension to it that can bring salvation and release to others. We know that men and women who gave their lives in war helped to preserve our freedom. We know that people whose death in what seemed like senseless tragedies have caused us as a result to examine and improve how we build, how we live, how we drive, how we travel. We know how parents have to endure pain and suffering as they enable their children to grow and mature. We know that people in authority have to absorb much conflict to enable a cause or organization to continue and thrive. Suffering can be redemptive. The suffering of some can bring health, safety, peace and healing to manv.

In the Gospel, Jesus is teaching a deeper truth about the redemption of the soul. He speaks to James, John and the rest of the Apostles and really to all of us as well. We might imagine that since Jesus died and rose from the dead, the price has been paid for our redemption and all we have to do is accept it into our lives. But we are not supposed to be simply consumers of Christ's redemption. We are to be partners with Christ in spreading the work of His redemption and that entails suffering. It is a suffering that is not in vain. We are all in the business of redemption. From all kinds of bondage, our suffering and sacrifice can truly help set others free.

For whom are you willing to suffer? For what cause might you be willing to give your life?

October 19th: World Mission Sunday: As we approach the celebration of World Mission Sunday on October 19, 2025. Pope Francis has given us a powerful theme that resonates deeply in this Jubilee Year: "Missionaries of Hope Among All Peoples." In his message, the Holy Father reminds us that hope is at the heart of the Christian mission, calling every baptized person to be "messengers and builders of hope" in a world that often finds itself overshadowed by uncertainty and despair.

Reflecting on the significance of this Jubilee Year, Pope Francis urges us to keep our gaze fixed on Christ, the center of history, emphasizing that His mission continues today through the Church: "Through his disciples, sent to all peoples and mystically accompanied by him, the Lord Jesus continues his ministry of hope for humanity. He still bends over all those who are poor, afflicted, despairing and oppressed, and pours upon their wounds the balm of consolation and the wine of hope."



Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

A woman in my parish has an adult son who has rejected his faith. She prays for him every day. She lights candles, says rosaries, and asks God again and again to bring him back. But nothing changes. Is God listening? Is He delaying? She told me once that she feels like the widow in Jesus' strange parable — crying out for justice, but hearing only silence. And yet, she said, she is at peace. I asked why. She responded, "God is already answering. I just can't see it yet."

She embodies something of the mystery in Jesus' parable this week in Luke 18. A powerless widow demands justice from a corrupt judge. This isn't about wearing God down until He gives in. It's about faith in the justice that is already coming. The widow isn't just persistent; she believes that justice is inevitable. And when Jesus points to the judge's words — his fear of being "struck" — He hints at something deeper: God's justice does not creep in gradually. It strikes. It comes like lightning.

Blessed Mary is, of course, the ultimate widow demanding justice. At the foot of the cross she stands before what looks like the ultimate injustice — the brutal execution of her son. But she did not despair. She did not beg for a last-minute rescue. She knew that justice was not delayed. In fact, it was happening. The power of the cross was already unleashing justice upon the world — suddenly, decisively, like a blow that would topple every corrupt power, making even the most corrupt fear her strike.

This parable asks us: will the Son of Man find faith on earth? Or will we mistake God's silence for absence? The cross proves that justice is not slow. It is only hidden. The lightning has already struck. In the cross, justice is speedily being done.







On Sunday, November 9, 2025 the Italian Catholic Federation Branch #115 at Mary Star of the Sea Church is planning to attend the Annual Pilgrimage in honor of St. Frances Xavier Catholic Church in Burbank, Califomia. A library with her memorabilia was built adjacent to the Chapel. Mass, rosary, procession and benediction will take place. Free bus transportation. The bus departs at 10:00 A.M. from the Boys and Girls Club. A luncheon will follow the mass. Price \$30.00 per person. Call Barbara West (310) 548-1693) for additional information and reservations. All are welcome.

The Chapel was originally built in 1916 by Mother Cabrini when she returned to the Burbank area and it was located at the top of Mount Rafael. Mother Cabrini prayed daily in this Chapel. In 1952 the annual "pilgrimage" was started by the Los Angeles District of the Italian Catholic Federation with a procession to the top of the mountain reciting the rosary, singing and benediction. In 1973 the chapel was relocated at the bottom of the mountain on the church grounds to make way for new land developments. St. Frances Xavier Cabrini was bom in Lodi, Italy in 1850. She took her religious vows in 1877 and founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart. Mother Cabrini arrived in New York in 1889 along with six other sisters. She first founded an orphanage in West Park, New York, this was the first of 67 institutions she founded throughout the United States, South America and Europe. She died in 1917 and was beatified in 1938 and canonized saint in 1946. She is the first American saint and patroness saint of all immigrants and the Italian Catholic Federation.




