My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I saw this reflection in Living With Christ published by Bayard Inc. and wanted to share it.

Good News! We're All Sinners!

One of the most frequent objections I heard to the new translation of the Roman Missal concerned the reinsertion into the Penitential Act of the phrase "through my fault, through my fault, through my grievous fault." "Who do they think they are?" the objections grumbled.

The short answer is "sinners."

"I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and in what I have failed to do."

Look around our world: there's a lot of evidence of human sinfulness. Each of us knows that sometimes it's my fault;

Sometimes it's our fault;

And sometimes it's not our fault, but we are all in this together.

We all bear the consequences of each other's sins, whether the "other" is perpetrating ethics cleansing on the other side of the world, or abusing a child or spouse in the apartment down the hall, or tweeting the latest gossip, or looking the other way instead of recognizing the face of Christ in one of the least.

"God, I think you know that I am not like the rest of humanity."

The problem with this stance is that I am like them.

I might wish I weren't, but the truth is, we're all sinners. We tell this truth at the beginning of our celebration, and we tell another, bigger truth: God in Christ has offered mercy to all of us.

In whatever words, that's worth celebrating.

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Every now and then readers of these reflections write letters in which they object to something. Years ago, this Gospel of Luke 18 prompted such an email. A man wrote to me: "I find it deeply offensive that you suggest we are still sinners once we are God's sons and daughters." His objection stirred in me a profound awareness of the paradox at the heart of our faith. Are we sinners or beloved children of God?

In this Gospel (Luke 18:9-14), a tax collector appears as one who has missed the mark. His sins have isolated him. His breast-beating is not an act of self-flagellation for pride's sake but a heartfelt admission of his failure and unworthiness. Remarkably, Jesus honors the candid humility of the parable's penitent. Why? Because we are always in need of mercy, always. But even more, perhaps because on the cross, Jesus will fully embrace a similar place of humiliation and rejection. He will enter into the most shameful, offensive place of the sinner so that we might "go home justified."

There is a sacred tension in admitting that we are sinners and yet have profound hope. We are beloved sons and daughters of God, growing precisely through our honest acceptance of failure. When we cry, "Have mercy on us," during Mass or when we repeat the "Jesus Prayer" in quiet moments, or in the confessional, we embrace our imperfections as fertile ground for divine grace. In doing so, we follow Christ's example — finding true exaltation in the humble acknowledgment of our human frailty.





St. Frances Xavier Cabrini Pilgrimage



On Sunday, November 9, 2025 the Italian Catholic Federation Branch #115 at Mary Star of the Sea Church is planning to attend the Annual Pilgrimage in honor of St. Frances Xavier Cabrini at the St. Francis Xavier Catholic Church in Burbank, California. A library with her memorabilia was built adjacent to the Chapel. Mass, rosary, procession and benediction will take place. Free bus transportation. The bus departs at 10:00 A.M. from the Boys and Girls Club. A luncheon will follow the mass. Price \$30.00 per person. Call Barbara West (310) 548-1693 for additional information and reservations. The Chapel was originally built in 1916 by Mother Cabrini when she returned to the Burbank area and it was located at the top of Mount Rafael. Mother Cabrini prayed daily in this Chapel. In 1952 the annual "pilgrimage" was started by the Los Angeles District of the Italian Catholic Federation with a procession to the top of the mountain reciting the rosary, singing and benediction. In 1973 the chapel was relocated at the bottom of the mountain on the church grounds to make way for new land developments. St. Frances Xavier Cabrini was born in Lodi, Italy in 1850. She took her religious vows in 1877 and founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart. Mother Cabrini arrived in New York in 1889 along with six other sisters. She first founded an orphanage in West Park, New York, this was the first of 67 institutions she founded throughout the United States, South America and Europe. She died in 1917 and was beatified in 1938 and canonized saint in 1946. She is the first American saint and patroness saint of all immigrants and the Italian Catholic Federation.
