My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I saw this reflection in "Give Us This Day" published by Liturgical Press and wanted to share it with you.

#### A DAY FOR PRAYING, NOT BLUSHING

Christians believe that in our worship we express what we believe and who we are. This is the meaning of the ancient maxim *lex orandi, lex credenda*. That principle is on full display in today's Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls).

By setting aside a single day exclusively for those who have passed from this life, we are testifying to our obligation to pray for them. That obligation is founded on our understanding of what it means to be a member of the Body of Christ. We are linked to each other in a bond which death itself cannot break. Death does not diminish our responsibility to support each other as fellow pilgrims. We take that responsibility seriously when we gather for the Eucharist, visit cemeteries, and pray for the dead.

This day of prayer for the dead invites us to recover the deeper meaning of our funeral rites—not merely as memorials or celebrations of life, but as moments of prayerful trust in God's promise of eternal life. While there are good reasons to recall the virtues of someone when they have died, Catholic funerals are first of all about the Body of Christ praying for one of its members. We are

Catholic funerals are first of all about the Body of Christ praying for one of its members. We are confident that just as our prayers assisted the deceased in life, so too they do in death. Purgatory is about God trying to convince us that He loves us.

confident that just as our prayers assisted the deceased in life, so too they do in death. Today also reminds us that those we pray for are in a state of purgation (not punishment). They are waiting, as the Catechism puts it, "to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven."

Some years ago, when pressed by a group of teenagers to explain purgatory, I simply said to a girl sitting in the front row, "I can see that you are really someone special." She blushed, just as I had anticipated. Then I said, "We all blush in such moments because deep within us are dark doubts that we are loveable and good. Purgatory is about God trying to convince us that He loves us, that we are loveable, thus purifying us of the darkness and doubts so that we can look into His face and not blush." Today let us pray in a way that expresses what we believe and reminds us of who we are.



# Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

I lost my wallet this year. It was such an annoyance to replace everything in it. A friend, moved by sympathy, gave me a beautiful new one. One month later I lost that one, too, with all my newly replaced cards. No matter what I did, I couldn't find what I had lost. I resigned myself to never seeing either of my wallets again.

Fortunately, the Lord Jesus is not like me in this regard. In today's Gospel (John 6:37-40), he says, "This is the will of the one who sent me, that I should not lose anything of what he gave me." Jesus, unlike me, is ever vigilant with what the Father has given him. He searches for every lost soul — as the shepherd leaves the ninety-nine to pursue the one lost sheep, or the woman rejoices upon recovering a lost coin — and even descends to the depths of loss on the cross and into the realm of the dead to recover that which seems forever lost.

On All Souls' Day, as we remember our faithful departed, these words kindle a hope beyond hope in our hearts. Even the dead are not lost to Jesus, though they may seem so to us. Nothing entrusted to him by the Father is ever truly lost. So, we may hope that every soul, no matter how wandering or forgotten in life, is secure in his loving care and destined to be raised on the last day. Of what the Father gives him, he loses nothing.





#### St. Frances Xavier Cabrini Pilgrimage

On Sunday, November 9, 2025 the Italian Catholic Federation Branch #115 at Mary Star of the Sea Church is planning to attend the Annual Pilgrimage in honor of St Frances Xavier Cabrini at the St. Francis Xavier Catholic Church in Burbank, California. A library with her memorabilia was built adjacent to the Chapel. Mass, rosary, procession and benediction will take place. Free bus transportation. The bus departs at 10:00 A.M. from the Boys and Girls Club. A luncheon will follow the mass. Price \$30.00 per person. Call Barbara West (310) 548-1693) for additional information and reservations. The Chapel was originally built in 1916 by Mother Cabrini when she returned to the Burbank area and it was located at the top of Mount Rafael. Mother Cabrini prayed daily in this Chapel. In 1952 the annual "pilgrimage" was started by the Los Angeles District of the Italian Catholic Federation with a procession to the top of the mountain reciting the rosary, singing and benediction. In 1973 the chapel was relocated at the bottom of the mountain on the church grounds to make way for new land developments. St. Frances Xavier Cabrini was born in Lodi, Italy in 1850. She took her religious vows in 1877 and founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart. Mother Cabrini arrived in New York in 1889 along with six other sisters. She first founded an orphanage in West Park, New York, this was the first of 67 institutions she founded throughout the United States, South America and Europe. She died in 1917 and was beatified in 1938 and canonized saint in 1946. She is the first American saint and patroness saint of all immigrants and the Italian Catholic Federation.




