I saw this reflection in "Once Upon a Gospel" by William Bausch published by 23rd Publications and wanted to share it with you.

ST. JOHN LATERAN: MOTHER CHURCH WHY DO CATHOLICS "CELEBRATE" A BUILDING?

Today's feast, November 9, which this year takes precedence over the usual Sunday celebration may strike us as unusual because of its distinctive title: Dedication of St. John Lateran. Who is he? What could Holy Trinity in San Pedro, have to do with an almost 2000 year-old church in Rome? The answer is a great deal.



Background: Christianity was illegal

You will recall that for the first three hundred years Christianity was illegal. It was an off-again, on-again persecuted religion with penalties of torture and death. In fact, the Roman Empire unleashed some ten prosecutions against it, catching not only Peter and Paul but all those whose names we will mention in the first Eucharistic prayer. The Christians, during this time, had to go underground. They had no temples, no churches, no public places of gathering and worship. But in the year 313 the Roman Emperor, Constantine, became a Christian, even though a heretical one. He granted religious tolerance to Christianity and eventually his successor granted it full freedom.

Religious Freedom... granted via the edict of Milan in 313

Once Christianity was politically free to worship openly and publicly via the edict of Constantine in 313, it needed to build its own churches, especially when it became the national religion. Now there was a palace in Rome, formerly owned by the Laterani family that was used by Constantine and his mother, St. Helena. He turned a wing of that palace over to the church, making it the first public church in Rome that was Christian. There the pope presided and resided as did all popes after him-except for a forty-year hiatus when the popes lived in Avignon, France - until 1871 when Pope Pius IX, during the Italian Revolution, fled to Vatican Hill, where the popes have lived ever since. To this day, St. John Lateran remains the pope's official church in his capacity as Bishop of Rome and to this day the Holy Thursday ceremonies are held there. It is called St. John Lateran Basilica in honor of St. John the Baptist and the original Laterani family name. It has inscribed over its door the words, "The Mother Church of Rome and of all churches in the world." We celebrate this feast of St. John Lateran, because it is the first Christian church, the mother church.

Why Celebrate a Building?

One reason the Catholic world celebrates a church building in another part of the world is this; we need symbols and rituals in order to live; and would sooner do without food and water. For example, the poor of France know the Eiffel tower could be melted down and the money given to them, but they would resist, knowing they do not live by bread alone. The Dome of the Rock of the Arabs, The Wailing Wall for the Jews, Westminster Abbey for the Anglicans, Sancta Sophia for the Turks are all more than a building. They enshrine national history and aspiration.

Church as Sign of Service

Another reason we celebrate this feast of our mother church, St. John Lateran, is that it reminds us that we ourselves are unfinished temples. We indeed have a great history of grandeur. Over the centuries the church has been responsible for more good, decency and help than will ever be realized. The constant media focus on our failings should not blind us to the enormous good we have done throughout the ages, and still do. Realize that Catholic Relief Services is the largest private relief service in the world. Think of all the Mother Teresas there are, the countless Catholic hospitals, schools, clinics, and leprosaria. Perhaps the biggest assistance to AIDS patients is the Catholic church, although you would never know it. We have taught people to read and write and sing. We have healed, consoled, buried, and converted. We're in every part of the globe ministering to others, day and night, endlessly. We have done Christ's work.

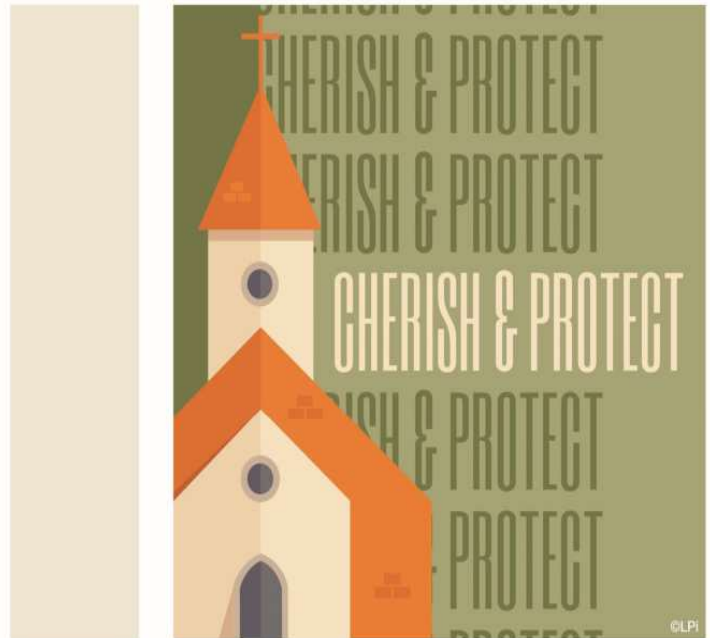

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

When I was 22, I entered St. Peter's Basilica for the first time. It floored me. I could hardly take it in, its grandeur, majestic arches, vibrant colors, and the light that danced through its high windows. Somehow, amidst such splendor, I felt an overwhelming sense of belonging, as if I had finally come home.

Jesus reorients how we Catholics see sacred buildings. In today's Gospel he says, **"Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up" (John 2:13-22)**. His riddle implies, shockingly, that his own body is now the fundamental dwelling place of God and humanity. The temple in Jerusalem has been superseded.

In our churches today — whether they mirror the basilica's grandeur or embrace humble simplicity — we experience architectural symbols of Christ's risen body. It is no accident we call them "churches": they make visible in brick-and-mortar Christ's body which is made up of the living stones we call Christians. Each church building, like St. John Lateran in Rome, or St. Peter's, or any other, is meant to be a vibrant sign of Christ's resurrected body. We should cherish and protect our churches as places where heaven touches earth, where we, as a community, are raised to the fullness of life in Christ.



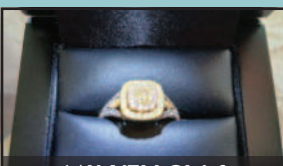
