My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,
I saw this reflection in "Give Us This Day" by Fr. Ronald Rolheiser and wanted to share it with you.

A Good King

We normally think of a king in terms of earthly power and worldly grandeur a kind of rockstar basking in his power and drinking in adulation. That is why the picture in the Gospels of Christ the King is so startling and paradoxical. We're presented with a picture of someone being stripped naked, publicly humiliated, and being sentenced to death. Not exactly our idea of a king! But that's what a true king looks like:

A good king is someone who is strong enough to be weak; who like God's presence in the world, can let vulnerability, silence and helplessness be the ultimate instruments in ordering, carrying, feeding, and blessing others.

A good king is someone who has a heart big enough to accept pettiness, who cares enough to accept humiliation, and who is faithful enough to do what's right even when it's misunderstood.

A good King is someone who is tall enough to let himself be small, secure enough to disappear in anonymity, and mature enough to be put off by immaturity.

A good king is someone who is selfless enough to absorb selfishness, loving enough to be gracious towards what's bitter, and forgiving enough to bless what's killing him.

A good king is someone who makes those around himself feel safe, who carries others rather than asking them to carry him, who feeds others rather than feeding off them, and who affirms others rather than seeking their affirmation.

A good king looks more like Christ on the Cross than like an earthly superstar in his glory. But that is what made Jesus' life and death redemptive.

Question for Reflection

How do I relate to Jesus as King? How does His reign take shape in my life?

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Not long ago, I was called to a hospital to anoint a woman in her early 80s. She was dying, and visibly in pain. But what struck me most wasn't her suffering — it was the atmosphere in the room. She had eight children and 30 foster kids, and many of them were gathered around her. You'd expect sorrow, fear, maybe even despair. But the room was filled with something else entirely — a quiet strength, a kind of sweetness. It was as if she was suffering not just with them, but for them. And they, in love, were suffering for her. The pain was real. But so was the peace. I didn't want to run. I felt as if I was in a little paradise, beeping machines and all.

I think of that moment when I hear today's Gospel. Jesus, hanging on the cross, doesn't look like a king. But one of the crucified, dying men beside him sees through the suffering and says, "**Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom**" (Luke 23:42). That word — *remember* — literally means to make someone a member again. He's asking to be joined to Christ, to become part of his Body. And Jesus says, "**Today you will be with me in paradise.**"

He doesn't say, "I'll take your suffering away." He says, "**You will be with me.**"

That's the strange power of Christ the King. He doesn't rule by avoiding suffering. He reigns by entering into it, and transforming it with love.

What are you suffering right now in your life? Likely you want it to stop. But if we are willing to suffer with him — paradise begins even today.



As Christians, we are called to care for others, to generously share our abundance with our brothers and sisters in need.

Holy Trinity's long established tradition of bringing non-perishable food

items to our Thanksgiving Day Mass, will continue **Thursday, November 27th, at 9:00 am.**

Parishioners are reminded that the offering of the food items is a part of the liturgy, and that all gifts should be held in the pews until it is time to bring them forward in procession. This ritual occurs after the homily and intersessions, at the Presentation of the Gifts.

After mass, we request assistance in transporting the food items down to the parish center auditorium/lobby where they will be collected and prepared for future distribution.

Below is a list of items needed:

Staples: cooking oil, peanut butter, jams & jellies, spaghetti and pastas, instant mashed potatoes, cereal, cake mix & frosting, rice, oatmeal, and powdered milk.

Canned Foods: soup, broth, gravy, tuna, salmon, spam, Vienna sausage, pasta sauce, pinto beans, chili beans, beef stew, green beans, corn, mixed vegetables, sweet potatoes, yams, canned fruit, apple sauce, and tomato/pasta sauce.



Our Lady of Guadalupe Novena & Mass

Please join the Guadalupanas Ministry in the beautiful tradition of praying a Novena in anticipation of The Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe on December 12.

Our Lady of Guadalupe, the Patroness of the Americas appeared to Aztec peasant Juan Diego on Tepeyac Hill in Mexico City 1531. Our Lady requested a church be built on the spot, logically no one believed Juan Diego and the bishop at the time was naturally skeptical of such story. Juan Diego noticed roses growing at the site of the apparition despite it being winter. He wrapped them in his tilma and took them to the Bishop. Upon presenting the tilma to the Bishop, the tilma had been miraculously imprinted with an image of Our Lady of Guadalupe. The tilma and image are preserved to this day at the Our Lady of Guadalupe Basilica in Mexico City.

Novena y misa de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe

Únase al Ministerio Guadalupanas en la hermosa tradición de rezar una novena en anticipación a la fiesta de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe el 12 de Diciembre.

Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe, patrona de América, se le apareció al campesino azteca Juan Diego en el cerro del Tepeyac, en la Ciudad de México, en 1531. Nuestra Señora pidió que se construyera una Iglesia en ese lugar, pero, lógicamente, nadie creyó a Juan Diego y el obispo de la época se mostró escéptico ante tal historia. Juan Diego observó que crecían rosas en el lugar de la aparición a pesar de ser invierno. Las envolvió en su tilma y se las llevó al obispo, y al presentarle la tilma, esta tenía milagrosamente impresa la imagen de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe. La tilma y la imagen se conservan hasta el día de hoy en la Basílica de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe en la Ciudad de México.
