Nothing but God, will fit into the God - shaped hole.


Advent is our time to unclog that hole, and to clear out all the litter.

What obstructions are blocking the space we give to God in our lives? Are we offering him a temporary parking place until Christmas, or a permanent dwelling?

Advent is a season of joyful expectation as we wait and prepare for the coming of the Savior.

This Advent let us strive to seek God more and more, and our own willingness less and less.

✠ Liturgy 101: THE NATURE OF ADVENT ✠

Like Lent, Advent is a season of preparation for a festal season that follows. Unlike Lent, Advent is not so much penitential as it is anticipatory.

The readings of the season shape the character of each week. **The first week** is clearly focused on the Second Coming of Christ, as the apocalyptic nature of the readings indicates. The return of the Lord is not a reason for fear or worry, however; those who follow the Lord faithfully hope and long for the Second Coming, when God will put all things right.

The second and third weeks of Advent present us with the figure of John the Baptist, who calls us to repentance and conversion of heart.

The final Sunday of Advent moves clearly into anticipation of the celebration of Jesus' first coming at Bethlehem. This is not a matter of pretending that Jesus has not been born but rather a time to focus on the joy His coming brought to the world.

Perhaps a good way to describe the whole season of Advent is to call it a time for "**Joyful Longing.**"

We **LONG** for the kingdom to come into its fullness. We **YEARN** for the suffering and evil that mark human existence to be overcome completely. We **LAMENT** these evils in our world as we long for the Second Coming. **WE YEARN** for the kingdom to come more fully in **OUR** own hearts and lives through repentance and deeper conversion. And all this yearning is hope—filled, because we know that Christ has already come into our world to inaugurate the kingdom of God in our midst. The first coming of Christ grounds our hope in the Second Coming.

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

A few years ago, my house was broken into on Super Bowl Sunday. Turns out, it's a great day for burglars. If the TV isn't on, people are probably watching the game somewhere else, so ... easy pickins'. I'll never forget walking into my bedroom and realizing someone had been there. My stuff was thrown all over the floor. The closet was torn apart. It was disorienting and disturbing — someone had invaded the space I thought was secure. After that, I bought an alarm system. And every Super Bowl Sunday since, I'm extra careful to lock the doors and keep the lights on. That experience made me more alert. Not scared. Just attentive.

That's much like the spiritual place Jesus wants us to be on this first Sunday of Advent. He doesn't start the season with soft candlelight and cozy manger scenes. He starts with two brutal images: a flood and a thief. In other words, chaos and violation.

Why? Because life will flood us. Chaos *will* come. And in the midst of it, Christ will come like a thief — not to steal from us, but to steal us back. He is the intruder we should want. The one who breaks in, not to ransack, but to rescue.

Christ presents himself as the thief but also the new Noah. He builds the ark of the Church to carry us through the flood. And he invites us to join him. How? By participating fully in our parishes. By making our homes places of prayer. By guarding our hearts with truth. By refusing to let spiritual complacency leave us exposed. By repentance.

This Advent, don't just stay vaguely "awake." Prepare. Build. Watch. The flood will come. But so will he.



Our Lady of Guadalupe Novena & Mass

Please join the Guadalupanas Ministry in the beautiful tradition of praying a Novena in anticipation of The Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe on December 12.

Our Lady of Guadalupe, the Patroness of the Americas appeared to Aztec peasant Juan Diego on Tepeyac Hill in Mexico City 1531. Our Lady requested a church

be built on the spot, logically no one believed Juan Diego and the bishop at the time was naturally skeptical of such story. Juan Diego noticed roses growing at the site of the apparition despite it being winter. He wrapped them in his tilma and took them to the Bishop. Upon presenting the tilma to the Bishop, the tilma had been miraculously imprinted with an image of Our Lady of Guadalupe. The tilma and image are preserved to this day at the Our Lady of Guadalupe Basilica in Mexico City.

Novena y misa de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe

Únase al Ministerio Guadalupanas en la hermosa tradición de rezar una novena en anticipación a la fiesta de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe el 12 de Diciembre.

Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe, patrona de América, se le apareció al campesino azteca Juan Diego en el cerro del Tepeyac, en la Ciudad de México, en 1531. Nuestra Señora pidió que se construyera una Iglesia en ese lugar, pero, lógicamente, nadie creyó a Juan Diego y el obispo de la época se mostró escéptico ante tal historia. Juan Diego observó que crecían rosas en el lugar de la aparición a pesar de ser invierno. Las envolvió en su tilma y se las llevó al obispo, y al presentarle la tilma, esta tenía milagrosamente impresa la imagen de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe. La tilma y la imagen se conservan hasta el día de hoy en la Basílica de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe en la Ciudad de México.
