My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,
I saw this powerful Christmas miracle in *Waiting in Joyful Hope 2013-14* by Jay Cormier published by Liturgical Press and wanted to share it.

JOYEUX NOEL

*"Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests."
Luke 2:14*

It happened on Christmas Eve 1914 during the First World War.

Three regiments - one French, one Scottish and one German - had been locked in battle for weeks in the dirty dark trenches along a French hillside. On Christmas Eve, a truce was called. As the night began, a German soldier sang "Silent Night" for his comrades - from the other side of the battle field, two Scottish bagpipes picked up the accompaniment; then the pipers began to play "Adeste Fidelis," and the tenor started to sing along with them. Soon soldiers from each side peered over "No Man's Land" and cautiously approached one another. Slowly, tentatively, the troops laid down their weapons.

The story of this remarkable cease-fire is beautifully told in the 2006 French film *Joyeux Noel*.

The troops exchanged photographs of their wives and girlfriends and shared precious bits of chocolate and champagne. A priest from the Scottish regiment offered Mass in the cold field and all three regiments joined in prayer. On Christmas Day, the two sides happily skirmished in a soccer game. French, Scot and German soldiers then helped one another bury their dead comrades whose corpses had been rotting between the lines.

But when the war resumed late on Christmas, the three sides could no longer draw weapons against the others. They were no longer enemies - Christmas had transformed them into fellow fathers and sons and farmers and artists and clerks.

The dawning of Christ illuminates our perspective of the world and of one another. In his light, we recognize one another as brothers and sisters and sons and daughters of his heavenly Father. The coming of Christ transforms the hopeless and cynical winter landscape into a new springtime when peace is not only possible but imperative.

In what concrete ways can Christmas "peace" transform your perspective and outlook?

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

A priest friend recently told me a remarkable story. One of his cousins reported having a vivid dream in which an angel told him the family needed to exhume their grandmother's body from a cemetery in New York and return it to her birthplace in Romania. She had been dead nearly ten years. As you might expect, the family thought it was, well, crazy. But astonishingly they exhumed her body. It was incorrupt, showing no signs of decomposition. That experience sparked healing, faith, and reconciliation throughout the family.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Joseph also receives a dream. He's confused, afraid. But in the quiet of sleep, God speaks: **"Do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home" (Matthew 1:20)**. When he wakes, Joseph acts. He doesn't overanalyze or dismiss the message. He trusts, and acts.

God still speaks — not necessarily through literal dreams but through those deeper intuitions of the heart. St. Ignatius of Loyola taught that God's voice draws us into peace, courage, and love. But we have to listen to it. Advent is a time for stillness. As we prepare for Christ's coming, we're invited to enter that quiet space where God's voice can be heard.

When and how do you become most receptive to God? Is it in silence? In prayer? In nature? At Mass? This week, go there. Be still. Listen. And like Joseph, have the courage to act on what God shows you.

THE REAL MEANING OF "THE TWELVE DAYS OF CHRISTMAS"

The carol dates back to the 16th century and its precise author is unknown. It has generally been assumed to consist of twelve nonsense verses built around a pretty melody.

The practice of the Catholic faith was banned in 16th century England. Priests were exiled and forbidden under pain of death from returning or performing the sacraments. It was a desperate, dreadful time. "The Twelve Days of Christmas" was written to educate the faithful in the doctrines of the faith and yet not be obvious to the persecutors. The numbers are simply a mnemonic to help Catholics remember some basic facts.

"**THE TWELVE DAYS OF CHRISTMAS**" celebrates the official Christmas season which starts liturgically on Christmas Day and ends twelve days later on the Feast of the Epiphany. "My true love" refers to God, "me" is the individual Catholic.

The "**TWELVE LORDS A LEAPING**" are the twelve basic beliefs of the Catholic Church as outlined in the Apostles Creed.

The "**ELEVEN PIPERS PIPING**" are the eleven Apostles who remained faithful after the treachery of Judas.

The "**TEN LADIES DANCING**" are the Ten Commandments.

The "**NINE DRUMMERS DRUMMING**" are the nine choirs of angels which in those days of class distinction were thought important.



The "**EIGHT MAIDS A MILKING**" are the Eight Beatitudes.

The "**SEVEN SWANS A SWIMMING**" are the Seven Sacraments.

The "**SIX GEESE A LAYING**" are the Six Commandments of the Church or the six days

of creation.

The "**FIVE GOLDEN RINGS**" are the first five books of the Old Testament called the Torah which are generally considered the most sacred and important of all the Old Testament.

The "**FOUR CALLING BIRDS**" are the Four Gospels.

The "**THREE FRENCH HENS**" are the Three Persons in God or the three gifts of the Wise Men.

The "**TWO TURTLE DOVES**" represent the two natures in Jesus: human and divine or the two Testaments, Old and New.

The "**PARTRIDGE**" is the piece de resistance, Jesus himself, and the "**PEAR TREE**" is the Cross.




