I saw this story in Celebration, as Ecumenical resource, and wanted to share it.

Family Value - Family Valuables

I am reminded of a story (a true one) included by Rabbi Neil Kurshan in his intriguingly entitled book, Raising Your Child to be Mensch (Atheneum Press, New York: 1987).

Mensch is a Yiddish word for a person having admirable characteristics such as fortitude and firmness of purpose. A young woman about to be married had come to Kurshan for counseling; when she told the Rabbi that she hoped she would not make the same mistake her parents did, he pressed her to elaborate.

The woman explained that each summer her parents traveled to Europe while she remained behind with a nanny.

One year, when the girl was 11, the housekeeper suddenly quit just shortly before the annual trip to Europe. Upset that their vacation may be jeopardized, the parents quickly found a replacement.

A few days before their departure, the girl noticed that her mother had wrapped the family jewels and silverware and placed them in the safe.

Since this had never been done before, she asked why. Her mother explained that she could not trust the new housekeeper with the family valuables.

Though certainly not intended, that insensitive remark shocked and hurt the little girl so much that she never forgot it.

Wasn't she a family valuable?

Didn't she have more value than knives and forks?

Obviously, the young woman's childhood experience was not unique nor was it the most tragic or traumatic of all the childhood experiences.

Nevertheless, her story, considered within the context of the joint feast of the Holy Family and the New Year, gives us cause to reflect upon the environment and those experiences that constitute our own families.

In the course of our reflection, we are to be mindful that each family member has God - given value; each is a family valuable, and should be tendered and treasured as a family valuable.

Question for Reflection

Who in your family do you need to value more?



Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

When I was ten, my dad gathered our family around the table in small-town Vermont and told us we were moving to the big desert city of Phoenix, Arizona. We were leaving behind family, friends, and everything familiar. None of us knew what to expect.

But something beautiful happened. As we made the move together, our family grew closer. In retrospect, I'm amazed at my parents' courage to go on that adventure. Even as a kid I realized our family found, in that challenge, a deeper unity and mutual love.

In today's Gospel, Joseph is told: **"Rise, take the child and his mother, and flee..." (Matthew 2:13, 20)**. First to Egypt, then later to Israel. The Holy Family is frequently challenged to move and change, to adapt to God's will for them, in order to find safety in the midst of threat. It's not just an idiosyncratic story about survival. It's a spiritual pattern for all of us. Every Christian family is called to be a kind of sanctuary, especially in a world full of noise, busyness, and fear.

May I make a practical application for us? The Lord's Day, Sunday, is perhaps the most practical way we imitate this dynamic we see in Joseph and his family. Sunday is not meant to be just like every other day, filled with errands and stress. It's meant to be a day set apart; a holy "escape" into rest, worship, joy, and peace. A day to rise, take your family, and flee, into God's presence

Liturgy 101

History of the Feast of the Holy Family



The Holy Family began to be the focus of devotion in the seventeenth century. Pope Leo XIII instituted a feast in honor of the Holy Family 1893 in response of disturbing changes in family life, including secularization and an increase in divorce. Pope Benedict XV introduced the feast into the universal calendar in 1921 and it moved to a Sunday in 1969 in the reforms of Vatican II. The goal of the feast is to strengthen family life by proposing Jesus, Mary and Joseph as the ideal family. The sense in which the Holy Family is ideal is in their obedience to God, their justice and their love for one another.

Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God - January 1st



The first of January has many observances; we mark the conclusion to the octave, the week - long celebration of the feast of Christmas; it is New Year's Day; and we observe the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. In 431, the Council of Ephesus declared the Virgin Mary to be the Theotokos, meaning "God bearer." The church has always venerated Mary as the Mother of God; it is the most fitting that this particular liturgy is celebrated on the octave day of Christmas, during a season that revels in the coming of the Word, made flesh in the virgin's womb.






