Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I saw this reflection on the Epiphany from "Waiting in Joyful Hope" by Jay Cormier published by Liturgical Press and wanted to share it.

WHAT DO THE THREE GIFTS OF THE MAGI MEAN?

Then Magi opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. Matthew 2:11 The gift-giving has mercifully come to an end.

For many of us, the most demanding part of Christmas shopping is deciding on the perfect gift, what best expresses our love and what will bring joy to those we love. Once we know the gift, the trek to the mall is considerably easier.

So what were the Magi thinking? Did they just wrap up what they happened to have in their baggage (the first recorded instance of "re-gifting"?) Were their gifts given with as much thought as a bottle of wine or a holiday fruitcake?

Or do the three gifts express something special about this Child that these men of learning perceived as a future king?

First, the gift of Gold: Well, you can never go wrong with cash, right? But, in antiquity, gold was more than currency. The most valuable metal on earth was a symbol of divinity - the ultimate gift, the perfect offering to royalty. This Child, who will be betrayed for silver, comes to transform our perspective of wealth to treasure again the things of God—compassion, forgiveness, and peace are the coin of the realm of the new-born King.

Frankincense comes from a small tree found only in Arabia and northern Africa. The hardened resin of the plant was used as an all—purpose medicine: it was applied to stop bleeding and heal wounds; it was used as an antidote for poisons and a salve for bruises and ulcerations. This Child comes to restore and heal not just the physical ailments of those he will meet in his gospel journey, but to heal humankind of our fears and doubts, to bridge the chasms that separate us from one another and from God.

Myrrh was an expensive extract from the resin of myrrh tree. It too was used as medicine and, more significantly, in embalming the dead. Only the very wealthy and royalty we embalmed; myrrh, therefore, was a gift reserved for kings. This Child comes to recreate us in the life of God; His death will be the defeat of death. His cross will be His—and our—glory.

The three gifts of the Magi are a Gospel unto themselves. They honor the Child who is Himself a gift from the God whose goodness knows neither limit nor condition. May we carry these gifts with us in the year ahead as we follow Christ the Morning Star on His journey to Jerusalem and beyond.

QUESTION FOR REFLECTION:

What was the most satisfying and rewarding gift you gave this Christmas?

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

When I was 22, I went on a pilgrimage to Rome for the Jubilee Year of 2000. I was traveling light with just a backpack, one blue shirt and black pants, little money, and no Italian. I had a few close friends and one goal: to reach the Eternal City. Despite the challenges and deprivations, I felt alive in a way I had never known before.

When do you feel most alive? I'd wager it's not when you're most comfortable or surrounded by stuff. Rather, it's when your life is aimed at something great; when you're on a meaningful and challenging journey with good friends.

That's the image the Magi give us in today's Gospel. They set out from the East not with certainty, but with hope. They study the signs, discipline their attention, and journey together, offering the best they have when they find the newborn King.

The Church gives us their story at the start of the year to reawaken something in us. We are not meant to drift. We're meant to journey as pilgrims. The Jubilee Year of 2025 may have ended, but our pilgrimage has not. Like the magi, the closer we get to Christ, the more alive we become.



THE GIFTS OF CHRISTMAS

*The Gold symbolized

*Frankincense symbolized His divinity
and is considered a holy anointing oil.*

*Myrrh symbolized His suffering and death,
since Myrrh was a substance used to embalm
before burial.*

Epiphany Household Blessing

The Epiphany household blessing is an ancient practice in the Church. This tradition is a beautiful way to observe the coming of the magi while invoking God's blessing on your home and all who enter it. All that is needed is chalk and a prayerful heart!


Epiphany Blessing, Explained

The Epiphany household blessing is a centuries-old tradition that invokes God's blessing on all who enter one's home.

All you need for an Epiphany blessing is chalk. There are a few different formulas for blessings out there, but the essence of the ritual is always the same: a priest or the head of the household calls down God's blessing on the house and everyone who comes into it, and an inscription is made above the door in chalk.

The inscription reads: the first two digits of the year + C + M + B + the last two digits of the year. The initials C, M and B represent the names of the magi — Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar — and also signify the Latin phrase *Christus mansionem benedicat*: "May Christ bless the house."






