I saw this reflection in Living Faith published by Fr. Dennis Gallagher, A.A. and I wanted to share it with you.

To Bear Witness

Now I have seen and testified that he is the Son of God. JOHN 1:34

Television cameras often zero in on athletes pounding their chests after a successful play. Less obvious are those who point their finger in the direction of a teammate who made the play possible. These are the ones who exemplify team sports at their best.

When John the Baptist points at Jesus in today's Gospel, he chooses to draw attention away from himself and toward the Lamb of God who takes away the world. It sounds to little to say that the forerunner is *giving credit where credit is due*, for the very substance of John's being is to bear witness to the One who alone can save.

A couple simple questions for reflection: Does my way of being point unambiguously to the One from whom I draw life? Is my life, fundamentally, an act of bearing witness?



Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

It's common to hear belief in Jesus and the Church mocked as blind faith and credulity. But in reality, it is deeply human and rational. Think about it: we rely on the testimony of others constantly. I trust chemists who certify the safety of toothpaste and cleaning products. I trust engineers when I use a microwave or drive over a bridge. Why? Because they have studied and seen what I have not, and their testimony proves itself in daily life. That kind of trust is not irrational; it is how human knowledge works.

In today's Gospel, John the Baptist declares: **"Now I have seen and testified that he is the Son of God" (John 1:34).** That is the language of an eyewitness. It invites us into a very human act: trusting someone who has directly encountered something — or Someone — we have not yet fully seen ourselves.

The Church's faith is built on this kind of reliable sight-based testimony. The Apostles did not make abstract claims. They saw, followed, suffered for, and proclaimed Jesus Christ. Over centuries, their witness — carried in Scripture, in the lives of the saints, and in the sacramental life of the Church — has proven dependable. We come to know its truth by assenting to it, by living and studying it, praying with it, trusting it.

Faith in Christ is not a childish leap into the dark. It is a step into the light of testimony that proves itself over time.

Liturgy 101

MINISTRY OF JESUS TOLD IN ORDINARY TIME

The story of the ministry of Jesus begins on the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time with John's account of Jesus' baptism. The Gospels for the Sundays that follow, trace Jesus' ministry through the Gospel of Matthew. Although time and again we might catch a glimpse of the future, a hint of what lies ahead for Jesus and for those who are his disciples, during this interim period we hear excerpts from the "sermon on the mount."

Jesus' instruction is meant to show his listeners what it means to live in the reign of God, a reign that does not conform to the selfish and manipulative standards that so often rule human life and society. He calls us first to renounce our own sinfulness (Third Sunday) and then to accept the values found in the Beatitudes (Fourth Sunday). He challenges us to be our best selves (Fifth Sunday), to do more than simply obey the rules (Sixth Sunday). In fact, he asks us to do what might seem impossible; he asks us to love our enemies (Seventh Sunday). Being a disciple of Jesus, entering into the reign of God demands undivided commitment (Eighth Sunday). The only way to be genuinely successful at it is to be grounded in him (Ninth Sunday).

Most of our life is "ordinary time," and lest we become complacent or even bored with it, we need direction that will help us live that life to the fullest. The Gospel readings for this section of Ordinary Time do this for us. They invite us to look at the teachings of Jesus.



WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY JANUARY 18-25

"Has Christ Divided Us?"

1 Corinthians 1:13)

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity has a history of over 100 years, in which Christians around the world have taken part in an octave of prayer for visible Christian unity. Representatives from the Orthodox, Protestant and Roman Catholic Churches agreed in 1967 to jointly observe a time of prayer called the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. Since 1968, the World Council of Churches and the Pontifical Council for Promoting Christian Unity have collaborated annually to promote prayer for the unity of the Christian Churches. By annually observing the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, Christians move toward the fulfillment of Jesus' prayer at the Last Supper "that they all may be one." (cf. *John 17:21*)
