I saw this reflection in "Living the Word" published by World Library Publishing and wanted to share it.

A Loophole for the Kingdom

"BLESSED ARE THEY WHO HUNGER AND THIRST FOR RIGHTEOUSNESS"

The famous comedian W.C. Fields (1880-1946) was not a religious man. It was therefore a surprise when an associate came across Fields reading the Bible. "Mr. Fields," the man said, "I never would have taken you to be a person of faith." "I'm not reading with devotion," Fields responded. "I'm looking for loopholes." W.C. Fields might have been interested in the gospel reading for today, as there is a "LOOPHOLE" in it.

The passage contains Jesus' eight beatitudes. Most of the beatitudes begin by describing a present good quality that will lead to happiness in God's kingdom: poverty of spirit, meekness, mercy, purity of heart, or peace.

But the fourth beatitude is different. This beatitude does not begin with a present virtue but with a desire: "Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied."

The fourth beatitude says that we are blessed, not if we have righteousness, but if we desire it.

The other beatitudes say we are blessed if we are meek, merciful, pure, and devoted to peace.

The fourth beatitude is a "loophole," an "escape clause" of sorts for us. It tells us that we need not despair if we are not completely merciful, pure, or peaceful. As long as we hunger and thirst for those gifts, we can still be included in God's kingdom.

Now some might conclude that such an "escape clause" undermines the high moral tone of the beatitudes. But what the fourth beatitude reflects is not a disregard for righteousness but the deep compassion of God, who recognizes how difficult it is to be good.



God does not reject what is weak and broken, but gives time for imperfect things to grow. We are imperfect. We struggle to be all that God desires.

We know that we should be merciful, yet we cling to our anger and long to get even. We know that we should be peacemakers, yet we explode with impatience and exasperation.

We know that we should be pure of heart, yet our lives are overcome with unwholesome desires that drag us down. When we fail to be the person we should be, the fourth beatitude is our "loophole." It tells us that even though we are not yet the merciful, peaceful, pure, and loving people God desires, God is still with us.

As long as we continue to hunger and thirst for righteousness, God will help us to grow and improve. God will work with us, so that some day our desire and God's grace will call us into the kingdom of God.


FEAST OF ST. BLAISE - Tuesday, February 3

We will have a special blessing of the throats at the 8 a.m. Mass on Tuesday, February 3.

Many Catholics might remember the Feast of St. Blaise because of the Blessing of the Throats that take place on this day. Two candles are blessed, held slightly open, and pressed against the throat as the blessing is said. St. Blaise's protection of those with throat troubles apparently comes from a legend that a boy was brought to him who has a fishbone stuck in his throat. The boy was about to die when St. Blaise healed him.

The Formula of blessing is:

Through the intercession of St. Blaise, Bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every decease of the throat and from every other illness. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.



Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

A priest I know was once falsely accused of a terrible crime. The claim was wild and easily disproved, but for a while, it didn't matter. In the atmosphere shaped by the abuse crisis of the early 2000s, the public assumption was guilty until proven innocent. His name was dragged through the mud, and his ministry placed on hold. I had the privilege — and the burden — of walking closely with him during that time.

He was angry. He was confused. He felt abandoned and deeply disoriented. The last thing on his mind was the words of Jesus in today's Gospel: **"Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute you and utter every kind of evil against you falsely because of me ... Rejoice and be glad"** (Matthew 5:11-12). Rejoice? He felt anything but.

And yet... something holy slowly grew in him. Not overnight, and not without pain. But as the truth came to light and his name was cleared, I watched him become more Christlike — more patient, more compassionate, more detached from human approval.

Maybe you haven't faced something so dramatic. But where do you feel judged? Misrepresented? Overlooked? Maybe someone else got the credit or the promotion. Maybe someone you love isn't getting their due. In those moments, the Cross of Jesus is near. When we feel accused, that's when we ask him for the grace not just to endure, but somehow, mysteriously, to rejoice and be glad.




