From Our House to Yours

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I saw this reflection Captured Fire by S. Joseph Krempa and wanted to share it with you. The Lord says that we are supposed to be the “salt of the earth” and “the light of the world.” But how are we salt and light? Isaiah points out some ways “corporal works of mercy”: feeding the hungry, sheltering the homeless, clothing the naked, visiting those in prison, visiting the sick, burying the dead. Those are classical works of mercy. They are tangible ways of being salt and light. These are things that we do personally or that we support through the parish, the poor box, and Catholic charities.

There are other works of mercy- “spiritual works of mercy.” These works are needed because they address needs deeper than the body, they help the soul.

Correct the sinner. *The correction that parents and friends give to those who are on the wrong track. It’s a work of mercy to try to be a moral “wake-up call” for somebody about whom we care.*

Instruct the ignorant. *When people speak about our Church and are misinformed, it is a work of mercy to give them the truth.*

Counsel the doubtful. *Sometimes when people are too emotionally involved to make a clear decision, we can see the way more clearly than they.*

Comfort the sorrowful. *People carry pain in so many ways, not only from death in a family but from illness, a job loss or from transition. Are we willing to be strength to them when they are weak?*

Bear wrongs patiently and forgive all injuries. *People are so quick today to lash out, to even the score, to retaliate, to strike back. To say “it stops here” is a work of mercy.*

Pray for the living and the dead. *We can always lift up in prayer our leaders, our friends and people whom we don’t have a chance to speak.*

People have many physical needs - “Corporal works of mercy.” Many more people are desperately in need of the “Spiritual works of mercy” The Lord calls us to be salt and light to our world, to light up consciences, minds and lives through the works of mercy—corporal and spiritual.

In what ways can I be “salt of the earth” and “light of the world” to those I encounter?



Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

I recently learned why zebras have stripes. Scientists used to think it was for camouflage, but new research suggests something more interesting: the stripes help zebras blend in with one another. When a predator looks at a herd, the overlapping stripes make it hard to single out one animal. But if a researcher spray-paints a dot on just one zebra, predators lock on it and eventually attack. The lesson? In the wild, blending in is protection. Standing out can be dangerous.

Human beings are not so different. Most of us would rather blend in than stand out, especially when it comes to our faith. We know that giving bold witness to Jesus — through our words, values, or public choices — can make us targets for criticism, isolation, or judgment. That's why Jesus' words in today's Gospel are so challenging: **"You are the light of the world. A city set on a mountain cannot be hidden"** (Matthew 5:14).

A city on a hill draws attention. It also draws fire. But that's part of the cost of discipleship. Jesus doesn't call us to be tribal or boastful. He calls us to stand in the open with humble confidence, so that people might see our good deeds and glorify our Father in heaven. Today, let's ask for the courage not just to believe in Christ, but to be seen believing in him.
