

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

A few years into my priesthood, I hit a wall. I had taken on too many commitments: Masses, meetings, ministries, projects. I couldn't keep up. I was double-booking, forgetting things, running late, and letting people down. My boss at the time, a wise priest, and our shared secretary, noticed. For my birthday, the two gave me a stack of 100 flashcards, each with one word printed in a different language: "NO." It was funny, but also painfully true. If I couldn't say no, my yes was in danger.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus says, "**Let your 'Yes' mean 'Yes,' and your 'No' mean 'No.' Anything more is from the Evil One**" (Matthew 5:37). He's not just giving advice about polite speech. He's showing us something about the freedom of Christian discipleship. The follower of Christ is called to speak clearly, simply, and honestly. There is joy in that kind of freedom.

The Church Fathers often linked this kind of straightforward truthfulness with spiritual maturity. The devil is the father of lies, but Jesus is the Word made flesh. When we hedge, flatter, exaggerate, or avoid, we open space for the shadows to creep in. That little stack of flashcards reminded me that God does not want us enslaved to the expectations of others or to the fear of disappointing them. He wants us to enjoy the peace of saying yes and meaning it, and saying no, and meaning it, too.

Lenten Challenge: Practice one moment of honest, peaceful speech this week. Maybe it's a sincere "yes" to something important, or a humble "no" to something you cannot do. Let it be a quiet step into the freedom Jesus offers.

General Guidelines and Practices

Lenten Fasting and Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of universal fast and abstinence. Fasting is obligatory for all who have completed their 18th year until the beginning of their 60th year. Fasting allows for one full meal and two smaller meals not to equal one full meal. Abstinence from meat is obligatory for all who have completed their 14th year of age.

Fridays in Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from meat for all who have completed their 14th year. As always, anyone for whom fasting or abstinence would pose a health risk is excused. For example, pregnant women (breastfeeding mothers) or people receiving medical treatment are not obligated to fast. Nevertheless, people especially in this category are invited to practice another form of fasting besides food.

ASH WEDNESDAY

Lent in a very special way points out that we are pilgrims. For seven weeks we walk with Christ, in response to his invitation, "Let us go up to Jerusalem." The penance, the fasting, and all the other aspects of Lent are the hardships of the journey. The Church gives us the cross of ashes on Wednesday to show that we have pledged ourselves to walk with Christ during Lent.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

Consist of the Gathering Song, Opening Prayer, one Reading, sung Responsorial Psalm, Gospel, Homily, Collection, Prayer of the Faithful, Our Father, Final Blessing, Blessing of the Ashes and the distribution of Ashes. In addition, these services will be led by either a priest or a lay person.



COUNTING TO FORTY

There are 46, not 40, days between Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday. So how do we get 40? Not through mathematics, but through theology! Every Sunday is the memorial of the Passion, death and Resurrection of Jesus—every Sunday, in a sense, is Easter, even during the Lenten Season. When we subtract the six Sundays of Lent (including Palm Sunday) from the total, we end up with exactly 40 days. Traditionally, these 40 days include two periods of fasting: The Lenten fast, which takes us through the Wednesday of Holy Week (which concludes at sunset on Holy Thursday right before the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper); and the more ancient Paschal fast during the Triduum itself (Good Friday—Holy Saturday).

Does this mean that Sundays of Lent don't count - that we should indulge in the things we give up during the rest of Lent on those days? Of course not! The Sundays of Lent are the heart of the Lenten season. Although we don't have to adhere to our Lenten promises on Sunday, it makes sense to continue our Lenten practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving on these days. Lent is an exercise in grace - not mathematics!
