Northland Center for Advanced Professional Studies (CAPS)

This program is, in essence, an internship experience for its aspirants. Students who apply and are accepted participate for 1/2 of their school day in the internship and must adhere to the CAPS' programs expectations, including the attendance requirement.

Areas of study, or "threads" include: medicine and health care, technology, digital media and design, global business and entrepreneurship, global logistics, and engineering and advanced manufacturing.

There is no cost for the program to the student.



A+ Scholarship Program

This program is sponsored by the state of Missouri, benefitting both the engaging student(s) and those receiving assistance. If successfully completed, the student may attend any community college in the state of Missouri at very little cost for two years, or the student may receive a scholarship for their A+ completion if their college of choice is a 4-year A+ recognition school.

Expectations include performing 50 hours of unpaid tutoring verified by an educator, a positive citizenship record with no drug / alcohol offenses, 2.50 cumulative GPA, 95% attendance, a predetermined math ACT score, and completion of a "career pathway plan."

Financial Assistance

The financial aid application opens

November 1st, 2023 and closes December 15th, 2023

73% of our students received aid last year!

Families may apply for aid based on financial need. If eligible, the aid provides part, rather than all, of the cost of tuition.

Two types of financial aid are available to those who qualify:

Grants - Grants are awarded based on financial need and are a direct reduction of tuition.

Work Study - Work Study is also based on financial need and will reduce tuition by the number of hours a student works for the school. Up to 40 hours per year, for a total of \$1,000 is available for those that qualify.

A financial aid application must be completed in order to be considered for grants and/or work study, and your student must be enrolled.

Academic Scholarships

We offer several academic scholarships based upon the High School Placement Test results. In order to qualify for the scholarships, your student must take the test at St. Pius X High School.

- Outstanding Overall Placement Test Scholarship (2) Two incoming freshmen are awarded a \$2,000 renewable scholarship based on their overall outstanding performance on the High School Placement Test.
- NCS Highest Individual Scholarship One incoming freshman from each
 Northland Catholic School will be awarded a \$1,500 renewable scholarship
 based on having the highest overall score from their grade school on the
 High School Placement Test.
- Highest REMS (Reading, English, Math & Science) Score Scholarship - Incoming freshmen achieving the top score in each of the respective testing topics (Reading, English, Math & Science) will be awarded a \$750 renewable scholarship per topic (up to \$1,500).


