

A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

July 25, 2021

ARE YOU ATTACHED? (PART 1)

"The soul that is attached to anything, however much good there may be in it, will not arrive at the liberty of Divine union. For whether it be a strong wire rope or a slender and delicate thread that holds the bird, it matters not, if it really holds it fast; for until the cord be broken, the bird cannot fly." (St. John of the Cross)

Are we aware of any physical or emotional habit that we have that gets in the way of us being available to God?

An attachment is what results from habitually choosing that which we desire. If we allow our bodily or emotional appetites to take delight in a particular habit, we become attached to it. St. John of the Cross uses an image of a little bird tied by a thin thread of string as an analogy of our attachments that keep us from fully loving God. Even though the string is very thin, the little bird is unable to fly.

Attachments are often difficult for us to recognize or admit in ourselves. We can become quite adept at rationalization and transferring the responsibility for our situation on someone else or something else.

We are created with appetites. God made us with the natural ability to be drawn to what we perceive as good. We have natural appetites and voluntary appetites. A natural appetite comes from natural inclination within our senses, such as desiring water when we are thirsty. There are also desires that arise because we made a decision such as choosing a sin or choosing to give in to a natural appetite in an indulgent way. These are called voluntary appetites.

Here are some concrete examples of "sensory attachments and desires" offered in no particular order:

- Being very talkative
- Desiring wealth
- Desiring food prepared in a particular way
- Desiring excessive amounts of food or drink
- Wanting the most comfortable amenities
- Desiring a promotion at work
- Wanting to go first
- Desiring disordered sexual gratification
- Desiring the finest clothes and other belongings
- Clinging to a person in a selfish way
- Wanting others to notice you
- Being overly curious about the latest gossip

- Regularly being attached to your mobile phone, tablet or social media
- Desiring always the easiest way
- Desiring the best of things
- Having an extreme love of your possessions



If our disordered desires and attachments are not purified on this side of the earth, our Heavenly Father provides Purgatory as the place where we are purged of anything that we are attached to other than God. Many people will not obtain the perfection of divine union until after death and after the purifying fires of Purgatory. In the end, they will be saints in Heaven. But why choose to wait until death to be purified in Purgatory when you can obtain the infinite blessings of God's inner life while still walking this earth? Why wait? Why hesitate? Why not make the perception of divine union the one and only goal in life?

Cardinal Rafael Merry del Val composed the following prayer to help free him from unhealthy and disordered attachments. A portion of this prayer is included below for your personal prayer and reflection. What is the Holy Spirit saying to you as you pray?

O Jesus! meek and humble of heart, Hear me.
From the desire of being esteemed, deliver me, Jesus.
From the desire of being loved...deliver me, Jesus.
From the desire of being extolled...deliver me, Jesus.
From the desire of being honored ...deliver me, Jesus.
From the desire of being praised ...deliver me, Jesus.
From the desire of being preferred to others...deliver me, Jesus.

From the desire of being consulted ...deliver me, Jesus. From the desire of being approved ...deliver me, Jesus.

IT'S ALL IN THE BASKET

St. Therese of Lisieux made a point of going the extra mile in kindness towards those people who really got under her skin. It was part of her own brand of Everyday Stewardship — thanking God for all His creation, even the parts with which, in her own humanness, she struggled to cope.

I think about this a lot when I challenge myself to give thanks for things that bother me and people who challenge me. When I do this, I envision Christ giving thanks over those insufficient loaves. How many of us would see that paltry little basket and kick a rock in frustration because we can't feed all our people? "You didn't give me enough, Lord! You didn't give me enough patience, enough money, enough creativity, enough stamina to be a good steward. If you had given me more, I could also give more!"

In those moments of despair, we need to take a good look at the life God has given us. We need to look at the trials and the challenges and the shortcomings. The hopes that didn't pan out, the disappointments that keep cropping up. Somewhere therein lies what we need to be the steward God asks us to be, just as St. Therese's own stewardship was defined by the people she simply couldn't stand.

God does not give us all we want. He does not give us all we ask for. He does us one better: He gives us all we need. It's all in the basket.

GOSPEL MEDITATION 17TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

St. Oscar Romero said, "We cannot do everything, and there is a sense of liberation in realizing that. This enables us to do something and to do it very well. It may be incomplete, but it is the beginning, a step along the way, an opportunity for the Lord's grace to enter and do the rest."

There were a group of ladies many years ago who made quilts. They were beautiful creations reflecting inspirational designs artfully composed from the simple scraps of fabric each woman would bring to their individual pieces. There was no plan for the finished project as each finished work became the combined creation of what each woman contributed. They abounded in vibrant colors and dazzled the beholder with intricate patterns and their myriad textures. They were so beautiful that they became coveted family treasures passed from generation to generation. Those women never realized the power of their work. Countless babies rested in the comfort of those quilts warmly nestled in the legacy of tradition they were fortunate to inherit. They adomed countless homes with their beauty and brought joy and solace to many faces.

We cannot do everything. We are not meant to. Our work in life is to contribute our individual piece, a piece that reflects the unique thumbprint I claim as my own. We only have to do small things well. Then, as St. Oscar Romero reminds us, the Lord's grace will enter and do the rest. 


