

## Embracing the Spirit: A Call to Renewal By Fr. Joseph Benitez

Bishop Fulton J. Sheen once shared a profound insight: even as God's chosen people, we sometimes find ourselves acting more like God's frozen people. We may go through the motions in our prayer lives, our relationships, and our celebrations of faith, inadvertently missing the vibrant joy that comes from a true connection with God. Today offers us a remarkable opportunity to invite the Holy Spirit to breathe new life into our hearts and set ablaze the fire of divine love within us.

As we gather to celebrate the Feast of Pentecost, we stand at the pinnacle of the Easter season. The term Pentecost is rooted in the Greek word meaning "fifty," marking fifty days since the Passover. Originally a Jewish celebration known as Shavuot, it commemorated the harvest and the Giving of the Law at Mount Sinai—a pivotal moment when the people of Israel entered into a sacred covenant with God and each other. They received the Ten Commandments, a divine guide for living in relationship with God and one another.

For us as Christians, Pentecost signifies the extraordinary moment when the Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles and the Blessed Virgin Mary, fulfilling Christ's promise to empower them before His ascension. This moment, celebrated fifty days after the resurrection, transformed not only the apostles but also the entire trajectory of the Church.

In today's readings, we discover two profound outpourings of the Holy Spirit. The first occurs when Jesus, in a breath of love, meets with the apostles after His resurrection. His abundant grace bestows upon them the Holy Spirit and gifts that reshape their understanding of their mission.

The foremost gift given is forgiveness. With the Holy Spirit's outpouring, the apostles experience the grace of clemency, much like the grace we receive in the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation. This marked a significant turning point: from personal restoration comes a mission of healing and forgiveness in the world.

From this forgiveness emanates an unparalleled peace—the peace that only Christ can provide. It's not just a fleeting absence of turmoil, but a deep-seated tranquility that redefines our existence. As Jesus declared, "My peace I bequeath to you, my own peace I give you" (John 14:27). This peace becomes our foundation, inviting us to navigate life's challenges with confidence and hope.

With peace comes joy—an exhilarating, transformative joy that defies all worldly understanding. The apostles journey from despair to triumph, from fear to courage, and from



sorrow to profound joy. This extraordinary joy is a testament to the power of the Holy Spirit to change our lives.

The second outpouring of the Holy Spirit unfolds on the day of Pentecost, a familiar yet awe-inspiring moment. With the ascended Jesus, the silence breaks like a powerful wind and flames descend upon the apostles. Transformed from reluctant fishermen to bold ambassadors of Christ, they are empowered to proclaim the Gospel fearlessly. Once bound by fear, they venture out into the world, courageous and unwavering, sharing the message of love with all they encounter.

Pentecost is often called the "Birthday of the Church," but its essence is a daily invitation to renewal. Each day, we can experience the gifts of the Holy Spirit in our lives. Linked by our faith to the apostles, we receive the Holy Spirit anew in our Baptism and Confirmation. God's love knows no bounds, pouring out the Spirit into our hearts each day.

We live animated by the Spirit, who guides, inspires, and uplifts us on our faith journey. The Holy Spirit unites us as a community of believers, enabling us to testify to Christ's work as a united body in faith and worship.

Moreover, the Holy Spirit sanctifies the Church, preserving its holiness through the grace of the sacraments. This ongoing renewal ensures that we remain faithful to the Gospel, even amidst changing times and challenges.

We are called to embrace the incredible gift of God's Spirit within us, to live as spirit-filled individuals. Let us invite the Holy Spirit to ignite a fire of passion and commitment within us. Together, let's embark on a journey of transformation, empowering ourselves to live fully in the light of God's love and to share that light with the world. Now is the time to awaken from our slumber and step boldly into the vibrant life that God has set before us!

## Question:

**INCENSE** 

Why do we use incense at Mass?

About

#### Answer:

The use of incense in religious ceremonies and worship is a practice that predates Christianity, and which is also found in many other religious traditions today.

Ever Wonder

Incense, which is made from resin infused with aromatic spices and oils, is one of those fundamentally human symbols that incorporates more than one of our senses, helping us to reflect on realities that transcend the everyday details of our lives.

The use of incense in the Church's liturgy — in the Mass, as well as in devotions to the Eucharist and the Liturgy of the Hours — is inspired by the use of incense in the Jewish tradition. In the writings of the Old Testament, we hear about incense being used in the worship of the temple, and Psalm 141 asks, "Let my prayer be incense before you; my uplifted hands an evening offering" (vs. 2). The image here is that, as the incense gently rises to heaven, our prayers also rise to God as something sweet and pleasant.

Another ancient use of incense that has also become part of our Catholic tradition is the idea that when we incense something, it's because it is something special or sacred. This is why the Book of the Gospel is incensed during the Liturgy of the Word and the bread, wine, priest celebrant, and congregation are incensed at the presentation of the gifts. To this, we can also add the incensing of the Blessed Sacrament during eucharistic adoration and benediction, and the body of the deceased at the end of the Mass of the Resurrection (the Funeral Mass).



## Devotions, Explained!

#### **DAILY EXAMEN**

#### Explained:

The daily examen is a spiritual practice derived from the writings of St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Society of Jesus. A Basque nobleman, Ignatius underwent a series of religious conversions as a young man following a wound sustained in the Battle of Pamplona in 1521. His Spiritual Exercises were first published in 1548 and form the basis of what is known today as "Ignatian spirituality."

Many different versions of the examen have been developed over the centuries, but all are centered on the same five elements which themselves reflect Ignatius' process of selfreview and spiritual discernment.

In completing the daily examen, an individual places himself in the presence of God, prayerfully reflecting on the blessings of the day, the actions he took, and the invitation God has for his future decisions.




