PASTOR'S MESSAGE

June 22, 2025

CORPUS CHRISTI SUNDAY

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Some time ago, I had a conversation with someone who visited a beautiful cathedral in Orvieto, Italy. This person shared that while the interior was pretty, it wasn't particularly exceptional. I asked if he had seen the display of the Eucharistic miracle that occurred in that cathedral in 1263. He was unaware of it and felt disappointed about missing such a treasure. In 1263, a visiting priest celebrating Mass nearby began to doubt the true nature of the Eucharist. Right before the "Lamb of God," he broke the host, and astonishingly, it began to bleed over his hands and onto the corporal. The spectators were stunned and began to cry out. Unable to conceal the miracle, the priest interrupted the Mass and went to the Cathedral where Pope Urban IV was present. After the Pope investigated the blood-stained corporal, he declared it a Eucharistic miracle, displaying it in one of the chapels of the Cathedral of Orvieto. The Pope later instituted the feast of Corpus Christi (which we celebrate today) and commissioned St. Thomas Aquinas to compose prayers and hymns to commemorate this special occasion. St. Thomas wrote the opening prayer we recited at the beginning of Mass, along with five beautiful hymns for this feast day, including Lauda Sion, Panis Angelicus, O Salutaris Hostia, Tantum Ergo Sacramentum, and Adoro Te Devote.

As Catholics, we know by faith that the Holy Eucharist we receive at Mass is truly the body and blood of Christ. Consider this: when I receive the body and blood of Christ, do I recognize it as an incredible gift of grace that will continue to transform me? Or has receiving the Eucharist become so routine that I am no longer touched by it? In any relationship, becoming too

familiar with someone can lead us to take them for granted or neglect to put in the effort to keep the spark alive. For example, in marriage, after a year together, does the initial excitement fade, and do we fall into a mundane routine? How would your spouse feel if you went



away for a weekend without even a phone call? The same risks exist in our relationship with Jesus in the Eucharist. Do we take for granted that Jesus is always there for us, assuming He won't mind if we skip weekend Mass? When we prioritize attractive or exciting things in this world over encountering Jesus in the Eucharist, are we missing opportunities to deepen our love for Him? When we stay away from the Eucharist—either through lack of prayer or absence from Mass-our affection for our Lord can grow cool and distant, and the spark may no longer be there. Similar risks exist for priests. If a priest becomes enamored with worldly distractions and stops praying or reading the Scriptures, celebrating Mass can become routine and burdensome, stripping the joy from administering the Sacraments. Let us renew our commitment to cherish the gift of the Eucharist, ensuring that our relationship with Jesus remains vibrant and transformative, allowing His grace to continually ignite our hearts and deepen our love for Him.

Presently, he holds the role of pastor at Notre Dame Parish in St. Martinville, Louisiana.

Nearly 6,000 active Divine Word Missionaries minister in the far corners of the world. They build hospitals to care for the sick and schools to educate the poor. They teach the hungry to farm, and they provide life's necessities—water, food and shelter—in impoverished communities. These priests and Brothers help those neglected and forgotten by society to build a better future.

They also foster vibrant Catholic communities of service and faith around the world.



SIGN BEFORE THE GOSPEL

Question:


I have been going to Mass for years and have always wondered: why do we make the three signs of the cross before the Gospel?

Answer:

Certainly, many people go to Mass or other devotions, doing and saying things out of habit or reverence and not really understanding the reasons behind some of these things. But everything we do has a meaning or purpose that helps us to worship better, proclaim our beliefs, or focus the attention of the people on something that has a greater importance or significance. A review of the meaning of various gestures and practices can help us have a deeper appreciation for what we do.

There is a little prayer that goes with the three crosses before the Gospel: "May the words of the Holy Gospel be on my mind, on my lips and in my heart." In standing to hear the Gospel, we acknowledge that Jesus is present, and the words of the Gospel are addressed to us. All of the gestures and special postures we adopt before the Gospel are intended to help us prepare for hearing the Word as well as act on it. The incense, the Alleluia, the deacon or priest, and the special dialogue and announcement that introduces the Gospel help us focus our attention on the Good News we are about to hear. The three signs of the cross show our desire and good intention to hear and live the Gospel.

Devotions, Explained!

MARIAN CONSECRATION

Explained:

Marian consecration, the act of consecrating oneself to Jesus through the intercession of his Blessed Mother, is actually rooted in the words of Jesus himself when he beseeched the Apostle John to look upon Mary as his mother (John 19:27) and to "take her into his own home." He was actually instructing us all to do likewise — to "behold your mother" and take Mary into our hearts, for wherever she is beloved, Christ is known and praised.

St. Maximilian Kolbe described Mary as "the stairway to Heaven." Marian consecration, therefore, could be likened to climbing the stairs. Different formulas exist for spiritual development in preparation for the consecration, based on the writings of saints like St. Louis de Montfort, and there are different prayers for the act of consecration. However, there is no "right" way to consecrate oneself to Jesus through Mary, so long as the ultimate goal is closeness to Christ and the glorification of God.
