PASTOR'S MESSAGE

July 20, 2025

16TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Do you ever feel overwhelmed by busyness? I often find myself using various tools to stay organized, like reminder and to-do apps on my phone, a thick paper calendar, and an array of sticky notes on my desk. Yet despite these efforts, I sometimes feel disorganized, behind on my tasks, and overwhelmed. Before entering the seminary, I took a time management class that taught me valuable techniques like "First things first," "Don't sweat the small stuff," and "Begin with the end in mind." However, at the end of the day, I still felt busy.

Like me, aren't you sometimes hoping that a person, event, or resource will bring you the inner peace you desire? Do you often find yourself thinking, "Will this book, idea, course, trip, job, country, or relationship fulfill my deepest longings?" As long as we wait for that elusive moment, we will likely continue to feel anxious and restless, yearning for satisfaction. This compulsive cycle can lead to spiritual exhaustion and burnout.

We all can relate to Martha in today's Gospel. She was overwhelmed, feeling that there wasn't enough time in the day to accomplish everything she wanted. Martha believed her work for Jesus was critically important, leading her to express her frustration:

"Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving? Tell her to help me." Haven't we had similar moments of complaint to Jesus about our overwhelming workloads and lack of support?

Jesus responded to Martha, saying, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, and it will not be taken from her." If Jesus were to respond to your complaints about being busy, would you find comfort in his words? What might he be saying to each of us?

Jesus speaks to our desire to please. Many of our internal pressures come from our perceptions of what God expects from us and what others expect for us to feel lovable. While in the seminary, I committed to praying a

one-year novena, which took 30 minutes each day. After ten months, I found that the prayer became just another task on my to-do list. My spiritual director asked me, "Paul, are you doing this so that God will love you more? Will God love you more if you pray all four mysteries of the rosary every day? What happens if you miss one? Do you worry God will love you less?"

Wouldn't it be a relief to know we don't have to accomplish many tasks to please God? One quote I cherish from Mother Teresa is: "It's not how much you do,

but how much love you put into doing. It's not how much you give, but how much love you put into giving. To God, there is nothing small; the moment we give it to God, it becomes infinite."

Sometimes we say to God, "Lord, I commit to reading several chapters of scripture each day." But God may simply want us to take one verse and spend a few moments in dialogue with Him. We might think God is asking us to evangelize numerous people when He may actually be inviting us to speak lovingly about Him to just one person each day. When we truly understand that God loves us without our having to earn that love, we realize we don't need to

be overachievers. He simply asks us, "My son, my daughter, do you desire to be near me, as I am always near you?" If you struggle to feel close to God, consider what activities you might be using to fill the emptiness in your life.

The story of Mary and Martha isn't meant to be a psychological profile or a role-play scenario where we choose which character we identify with most. Instead, it's about two different responses to a single event. The lesson is not about personality types but about the kind of heart Christ longs for us to have. Let us take some time this week to ask Jesus how we can prioritize our day to focus on the one necessary thing: spending quality time with Him.



Ever Wonder About...

MARY MAGDALENE

Question:

July 22 is the feast of Mary Magdalene. I've heard a lot of stories about her, but who was she really?

Answer:

Mary Magdalene has been the subject of speculation and scholarship over the last 2,000 years. Mary Magdalene makes her first named appearance in Luke 8:2. She is one of several women following Jesus. Luke specifically mentions that Mary had previously been delivered from demonic possession. Whatever her life looked like before she met Jesus, it wasn't good! Because of this association with being a repentant sinner, Mary Magdalene has been associated with other similar stories in the Gospel, such as the woman caught in adultery or the woman who bathes Jesus' feet with her tears.

Mary Magdalene shows up again by name at the end of the Gospels, when she stands with the Blessed Virgin Mary at the foot of the Cross. Mary is also present in the garden of the resurrection. She is one of the woman who goes to bring spices to Jesus' tomb, where they find the stone rolled away. Mary stays in the garden weeping, believing his body has been stolen. Jesus approaches her and calls her by name, and she becomes the first witness to the resurrection! While many of the details of Mary Magdalene's life have been lost to time, she is an example of powerful conversion, deep faith, and intimate love for Christ.

Devotions, Explained!

ST. BRIDGET PRAYERS


Explained:

St. Bridget of Sweden (d. 1373) was a noblewoman of the Middle Ages whose renowned mysticism centered on the passion of Christ. A mother of eight and an attendant at the royal court in Sweden, as a widow she founded the Order of the Most Holy Savior, advocated for reform in the church and for the return of the Pope to Rome from France.

The St. Bridget Prayers refer to 15 prayers attributed to Bridget which evoke the imagery of Christ's suffering and death, plead for the forgiveness of the supplicant's sins, for a happy death, for fear and love of the Lord, and for a renunciation of worldly desires.

For many years, these prayers were associated with divine promises, though in 1954 the Catholic Church declared that it could not be said that these promises were of supernatural origin. The prayers themselves remain beloved and popular devotions to Christ's passion.
