

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

July 27, 2025

17TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Every day is a bit of an adventure. Some days feel like quiet, steady walks with the Lord. Others? They feel like a holy rollercoaster.

One such day, I arrived at a local nursing home to celebrate Mass. As I walked toward the multi-purpose room where the residents were gathering, someone quietly warned me, "Father, there's been a little accident—you might want to watch your step." But before they even said it, I already knew. You see, I could smell it. Out of the corner of my eye, I spotted a small spill being quickly cleaned up—someone had just gotten sick.

Still, gathered around a beautifully set altar—candles lit, cloth neatly draped—were about 25 residents, ready for Mass. I took a deep breath, smiled, and began.

But as soon as Mass started, so did a quiet humming—soft at first, then gently met by a sharp "Shhh!" from another resident. Back and forth it went, like a strange duet. Hum... shhh... hum... shhh... all throughout the liturgy.

But then came the Our Father.

And suddenly—silence. Even the hummer stopped. I looked out and saw something incredible: everyone, even the ones who had been dozing off, even the one who had been humming, reached out and took each other's hands. With reverence and unity, they prayed:

"Our Father, who art in heaven."



In that moment, I chuckled inwardly, overwhelmed by the quiet power of this prayer—how it could cut through confusion, forgetfulness, even dementia. The Our Father was like a bell that called every soul back to itself, back to God.

That scene brought back another memory—of visiting a woman in a different nursing home. She suffered from multiple ailments and rarely responded to my friendly chatter. But when I began to pray, "Our Father..." her voice rang out—clear, strong—all the way through "...on earth as it is in heaven." Then she paused... and began again, "Our Father..."

It was as if those words lived deep within her, like "Mama" or "Dada"—a primal prayer written on the soul.

And it's not just the elderly. After Sunday Mass, parents often tell me how their little ones are fascinated by this prayer. One day, while praying quietly in church, I saw a 4-year-old boy leading his mother from statue to statue—Saint Joseph, the Blessed Mother, the large crucifix—pausing reverently before each one. His mother whispered, "He never forgets to stop at the cross."

And I'll never forget Good Friday: a man in his 40s with Down Syndrome approached the relic of the True Cross. With deep affection, he leaned in and laid his cheek against it. Smiling, completely absorbed in the moment. His love for the Lord, expressed so simply, moved everyone around him to tears.

What did he see that many of us miss?

In today's Gospel, Jesus teaches us how to pray. And He gives us these words—not just for recitation, but for transformation. The Our Father is more than a set of phrases. It's a blueprint for discipleship. A daily surrender.

I've heard many confessions over the years—people struggling with anger, addiction, unforgiveness. And I often hear them say they've used Jesus' name or God's name in vain. But I've yet to hear anyone confess to saying Our Father in vain.

Except once

When I was in college, I attended a campus prayer group. During a silent moment, a young woman suddenly burst out, "I hate you, Father!"

It stunned everyone. But later I learned her story—she was a recent convert with a difficult past. She had fallen again into that life and was now caught between shame and grace. That cry—"I hate you, Father!"—wasn't aimed at her earthly dad, but at God. Her soul was in agony, torn between the pull of sin and the call of the Father's love.

In that moment, I imagined the defiance of Lucifer himself—the first to say: "I will not serve. My will be done." And I wondered: How often do we say those same words—not with our lips, but with our choices?

"My kingdom come. My will be done. On my earth, as it is in my heaven."

But Jesus invites us to a different path. He teaches us to pray:

"Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done. On earth as it is in heaven."

Every time we pray the Our Father, it chisels away at our pride and shapes us into children of the Father. It reorients our hearts. It wakes us up.

As today's Responsorial Psalm reminds us:

"When I called, you answered me; you built up strength within me. I will give thanks to you, O Lord, with all my heart... because of your kindness and your truth."

May we never take for granted the gift of this prayer.

May it be for us what it was for the elderly woman, the humming resident, the curious child, the man with Down Syndrome—the path back to the Father's heart.

And may we pray it, not by rote, but with our whole lives:

Our Father, who art in heaven...

Question:


This time of year, I attend a lot of weddings. Why do Catholic weddings need to take place in a church?

Answer:

Technically, there is a clause in Church law that could allow for weddings to take place outside of a church, in a suitable space under special circumstances, but it requires the rare permission of the bishop. But the meaning of marriage goes very, very deep, and the Church has a vested interest in protecting that meaning. As Catholics, we don't see a wedding as an event that needs a pleasing backdrop.

Marriage is a sacrament, both an occasion of joyful promise and symbolic solemnity. It is a spiritual event. The loving bond of marriage symbolizes the mystical union between Christ and his Church. The man and woman profess lifelong vows of fidelity, and they receive supernatural grace from God to keep their promises. Receiving the sacrament of Marriage in a church has broader symbolic meaning for the couple as well. Marriage isn't simply two people in isolation from the world around them. Marriage is the joining of families and the beginning of a new, holy mission in the life of the couple. Weddings are sacred occasions, and it's fitting that they occur in sacred spaces.




Confirmation Registration for the 2025-2026 School Year is now LIVE!


Volunteers Needed! RAPTISMAL HOSPITALITY TEAM

Devotions, Explained!

OUR FATHER

Explained:

The Our Father, also known as The Lord's Prayer, is found in the Gospels of Matthew and Luke. Universally beloved in most traditions of Christianity, its words are those of Jesus Christ himself as he answers his disciples' queries on how best to pray.

The version presented in the Gospel of Matthew is longer and more detailed than that which is contained in the Gospel of Luke. Both versions instruct the faithful to address God as "Father," to pray for the coming of His kingdom, to rely on His providence, and to embrace a spirit of forgiveness towards others, in the hope that we ourselves will be forgiven (Matthew 6:9 -13, Luke 11:2-4). This last element, forgiveness, is also emphasized by Jesus in the Gospel of Mark (Mark 11:25) as an essential part of all prayer.

The Catechism quotes Tertullian when it calls the Our Father "the summary of the whole Gospel." (CCC 2761).

You could volunteer in: Liturgy

The Liturgy Commission provides meaningful opportunities for worshipping and praising God.

Altar Servers

Adult servers assist the presider at 4 pm Saturday Vigil and 7:30 am Sunday Mass. Youth, fifth grade and older, serve at the Sunday 9:30am, 11:30am, and 6pm Masses and special events.

Arimatheans

This ministry assists bereaved families preparing for funeral liturgies and wakes, greets families, and assists the priest at the funeral Mass. Flexible schedule is preferred.

Audio/Visual Ministry

These adults and high school student volunteers enhance worship and encourage active and full participation from the assembly through operating our Audio, Camera Operations, and Graphics systems.

Church Décor

This committee is responsible for preparing the liturgical décor of our church.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion

These ministers assist the presider in offering Holy Communion at Mass.

Lectors

These ministers proclaim the scriptures at weekend Masses, and at various special worship services throughout the year.

Linen Care

This ministry washes, irons, and folds altar linens and altar server albs.

Music Ministry

- Children's Choir (children in 4th-6th grades) rehearses Tuesday
 afternoons 5-5:45pm & sing once a month for our 9:30am Family Mass
 and in the Music Ministry's special liturgies throughout the school year.
- Adult Choirs (high school & adults) rehearses Wednesday evenings at 7-8:30pm & sing for the 9:30 am Mass and in the Music Ministry's special liturgies.
- St. George Singers (Auditioned high school and adults) rehearses as needed. Sings once every six weeks. Focus is on music sung in the A Cappella and Cathedral tradition. Contact Director of Music for info.

Sacristans

These volunteers prepare liturgical items used for weekday and weekend liturgies and help to ensure the liturgies run smoothly.

Ushers

Ushers seat the Assembly; coordinate all Stewardship of Finance collections and special collections, aid the Assembly's communion procession, and generally assist in hospitality.

Wedding Coordinator Ministry

This ministry prepares the church and wedding party for the marriage ceremony. Attendance at both the rehearsal and ceremony is required. New parishioners to the ministry will start as assistants to a lead coordinator.
