

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

August 3, 2025

18TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

When we prepare for a journey, the first decision we often make is whether to travel light or heavy. For instance, when I visit my family in Baltimore, I pack just a small duffel bag with a couple of changes of clothes and my prayer book. Everything I need is already there. However, when I set out for a foreign country for five weeks, my mindset shifts dramatically. I find myself contemplating how much I can pack—yet the question remains: how much is truly too much?

Several years ago, I traveled to Mexico for a Spanish immersion program alongside five other seminarians and about 30 university students from Mississippi. Upon arriving at the Mexico City airport, we faced a lengthy walk—at least a mile—just to reach our bus. Many students had overpacked, dragging along two oversized suitcases each, packed to the brim with clothes—enough for two weeks! The challenge was amplified by the airport's lack of conveniences; there were no escalators, and some students even broke the wheels on their bags, struggling to carry their heavy luggage down stairways. By the time we reached the bus, we had filled the luggage compartment completely, forcing us to pile our bags onto the bus aisles, seats, and laps. After five weeks in Mexico, we found ourselves with even more luggage due to the souvenirs and new clothes we had accumulated. Clearly, we had overpacked for our trip.

This experience brings to mind a powerful lesson from the Gospel. Jesus speaks of a rich man who, despite already having enough, preoccupies himself with gathering more. In his pursuit, he builds a larger barn to store his excess harvests. Yet, just as the new barn nears completion, he dies. All the worry and effort put into accumulating wealth and security become meaningless. This theme echoes the first reading from Ecclesiastes, which beautifully states, "Vanities of vanities. Here is one who has labored with wisdom and knowledge and skill, and yet to another who has not labored it, he must leave property. For what profit comes to man from all the toil and anxiety of heart with which he has labored under the sun?"

This is a sobering reminder: "Thus will it be for all who store up treasure for themselves but are not rich in what matters to God."

Do we recognize that our time on this earth is a transient journey? Jesus gently reminds us that, after our brief sojourn here, we are headed home—a home where all we truly need awaits us in heaven. Unfortunately, many of us find ourselves fixated on our earthly possessions, neglecting to consider what we'll bring on our journey to eternal life. So how do we pack for that journey?

Look at the example of the sisters of Mother Teresa, true masters of packing for the journey home to heaven. Each sister possesses only three habits or saris—one for today, one for



tomorrow, and a third for feast days. They wash their habits daily and own just a pair of simple sandals. Their belongings can fit into a box the size of one used for a DVD player.

Moreover, these sisters voluntarily embrace simplicity and self-denial. I have the privilege of visiting their convent weekly to expose the Blessed Sacrament and perform benediction. They typically refrain from using air conditioning or fans, especially during prayer and sleep. For my benefit, they will turn on a fan and provide me with a foam pad to kneel on, while they kneel for an hour and a half on the hard concrete. They sleep on simple mats instead of comfortable beds, and although they receive generous food donations for the soup kitchen, they prepare only modest meals of grains and vegetables for themselves. They turn away from the distractions of newspapers, TV, and radio to focus instead on prayer, sacrifice, and serving the homebound and the poor. Despite their sacrifices, I have never observed sadness or discomfort among them.

Their way of life starkly contrasts that of the rich man in the Gospel. Where the rich man is consumed by the desire for security and comfort, the sisters intentionally empty themselves of earthly desires, making room for God to fill their hearts. It is essential for us to ponder: Are we overpacked with life's distractions? Are we living in a manner that prioritizes the accumulation of possessions over spiritual wealth?

As we travel our paths, let us strive to know the purpose of our journey. Let us pack lightly, taking only that which is necessary—faith, love, and compassion—as we prepare for our ultimate homecoming to heaven.



Ever Wonder About...

CONFIRMATION SPONSORS

Question:

What are the requirements for being a confirmation sponsor?

Answer:

Although many dioceses have specific requirements for who can be a sponsor for the Sacrament of Confirmation, the Code of Canon Law identifies certain requirements that are true for all dioceses and parishes. First, the sponsor should be chosen by the one to be confirmed (or, in some cases, by the parents or even the pastor). Second, a sponsor must be at least sixteen years old (unless the local bishop has chosen another age, or a special exception has been made). Third, the sponsor must be a Catholic who has been confirmed and who has already received the Sacrament of the Eucharist. Beyond this, they must lead "a life of faith in keeping with the function to be taken on." Fourth, they can have no sort of canonical penalty or impediment. Finally, they cannot be either the father or mother of the one to be confirmed (See Canons 893, \$1 and 874,

In some cultures, it is customary for one of the confirmand's godparents to act as sponsor, although this is not required by Church law.

To learn about the requirements for your parish or diocese, you can consult your pastor or your parish or diocesan director of religious education or the diocese's office liturgy and worship.


VOCATIONAL PRAYER MINISTRY








Devotions, Explained!

HOLY HOUR

Explained:

A holy hour is the practice of spending one hour's time in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, praying and meditating on the agony of Jesus Christ. More broadly, a holy hour can also refer to any 60 minutes set aside in prayer and reflection, whether in church or elsewhere.

The holy hour devotion dates to the late 17th century, when St. Margaret Mary Alacoque received visions of Jesus Christ. In these visions, the Lord requested that St. Margaret Mary spend one hour every Thursday evening lying prostrate and meditating upon his agony in the Garden of Gethsemane. This practice calls back to the Gospel of Matthew, which tells of Jesus' desire for the disciples to "remain here and keep watch with me" (Mathew 26:38) as he awaited his passion.

Holy hours can be made privately or in community, and the USCCB has created a variety of different holy hour formats that can be found at usccb.org/prayer-and-worship/prayers-and-devotions/eucharistic-devotion.

The Social Responsibility Commission provides opportunities to serve and support our community's material and spiritual needs.

Advent Giving Tree

The Advent Giving Tree Ministry works to bring Christmas blessings to the poor and needy in our community. Volunteers help buy, sort and distribute gifts.

Bereavement Ministry

This group assists St. George families during times of bereavement by preparing food and offering support. Volunteers needed to serve, prepare and organize reception.

Catholic Daughters of the Americas (CDA)

CDA promotes justice, equality, and the advancement of human rights and dignity. The CDA's annual fundraiser is the Pancake Breakfast with Santa.

Elizabeth Ministry

Elizabeth Ministry is an outreach to parents during special times. Volunteers affirm, support, encourage, and assist families during childrearing years.

Eucharistic Ministry to the Homebound, Long Term Care Facilities, Hospitals

This ministry serves homebound parishioners, nursing homes/assisted living facilities and hospitals. Volunteer Extraordinary Ministers bring the Eucharist to residents or patients and homebound parishioners.

Habitat for Humanity of Greater Baton Rouge

Habitat for Humanity is a non-profit, Christian-based housing ministry that works with deserving, low-income families through building simple, decent homes.

Interfaith Federation of Greater Baton Rouge

This is an interfaith group that advocates changes in laws and attitudes, sponsors race-relation activities, promotes ecumenism and serves at the Holy Grill.

Knights of Columbus Council #4030

The KCs are a national organization that performs charitable works in the parish and local community. The KCs provide an opportunity for fellowship and prayer for its membership.

Long Term Care Facilities Visitation

This ministry serves several area retirement communities, assisted living facilities and nursing homes. Volunteers gather residents for Eucharistic Services and Masses, and set up.

Prayer Blanket Ministry

Volunteers sew, crochet or quilt blankets for parishioners facing serious illness. Patterns and fabric are provided.

Prison Ministry

This ministry visits the men incarcerated at Louisiana State Penitentiary at Angola on the second Saturday of the month. The visits include attending liturgical services in the chapel, offering Holy Communion, visiting the Catholic men, including Death Row.

Respect Life Committee

This ministry promotes awareness for the respect of all life from conception to natural death; proclaiming that every life is a precious gift from God through education, prayer, and advocacy efforts.

St. Vincent de Paul

The SVDP ministry is the face of Christ to the poor and needy in our community and provides assistance to individuals and families within our parish boundaries.


