

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

November 9, 2025

DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA

Each year, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome, the oldest church in the West and the cathedral of the Bishop of Rome. Officially titled "Basilica of the Most Holy Savior and of Saints John the Baptist and John the Evangelist in the Lateran," it is commonly called St. John Lateran. Built in the time of Constantine and consecrated by Pope Sylvester in 324, this archbasilica is honored as "the mother and mistress of all churches of Rome and the world" (omnium urbis et orbis ecclesiarum mater et caput). Because it is the Pope's cathedral—not St. Peter's, as is often assumed—today's celebration is a Feast of the Lord and takes precedence even over the Sunday liturgy when it falls on a Sunday.

Historically, the Lateran site was gifted to the Church after Constantine's edict of 313 granted Christians freedom of worship. The imperial Laterani palace became the locus of a basilica, baptistery, and the papal residence, where popes lived until the Avignon period. First dedicated to Christ the Savior, the basilica later bore the added patronage of St. John the Baptist and St. John the Evangelist. Initially a local Roman observance, the feast was extended to the entire Roman rite in 1565 as a concrete expression of communion with the See of Peter, which, as St. Ignatius of Antioch wrote, "presides in charity."

Yet the Church does not keep this feast merely to admire venerable stones. The liturgy teaches that the temple of stones symbolizes the living Church. The apostolic witness proclaims the People of God as a "spiritual edifice" built of "living stones" on the one foundation, Jesus Christ, the cornerstone (cf. 1 Cor 3:9–11, 16–17; 1 Pt 2:4–8; Eph 2:20–22). Pope Benedict XVI captured the perennial relevance: God desires to build a spiritual temple in the world—a community that worships in spirit and truth—and the beauty of sacred buildings both expresses and fosters our conversion, drawing us into ordered communion with Christ, especially in the Eucharist where the Church is built up in truth and charity and conformed to the Lord by the Holy Spirit.

Today's readings illuminate this mystery. Ezekiel's vision of lifegiving waters flowing from the Temple, down the Kidron toward the Dead Sea, transforms barrenness into fruitfulness—an image of grace flowing from God's dwelling to renew creation. The psalm celebrates the river that gladdens the city of God, evoking Israel's desert memory of water as blessing and presence. St. Paul then turns the lens to the new Temple: the community itself, animated by the Spirit, founded on Christ. In the Gospel, Jesus cleanses the Temple and, when challenged, points to his Body as the definitive dwelling of God among us: "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." In Christ crucified and risen, the Temple is fulfilled—and in his Body, the Church, God's presence abides.



What does this mean for our spiritual life? First, it grounds our identity. The Church is not just a building we attend; it is the Body we belong to. We are living stones, being fitted together—even unfinished, still under construction—so God may dwell in us. Second, it calls us to holiness that is tangible. If we are Gods temple, then our words, choices, and relationships should communicate his presence. Can others sense Gods holiness when they encounter us? Third, it summons us to communion and mutual upbuilding. Stones do not stand alone; we support and are supported. Encouragement, prayer, reconciliation, and practical service "edify" the Body. Finally, it renews our reverence for sacred spaces. Churches are not mere assembly halls; they are places where the Eucharistic Christ forms us into what we receive—his very Body.

Concrete steps follow naturally from the feast's questions. What images come to mind when I think of "Church" — a structure, an event, or a people? Do I live as a member of Christ's Body? How can I better reflect God's presence — in patience, purity of heart, acts of mercy, faithful worship? How can I support other "stones" — by interceding for them, speaking life, sharing burdens, and serving my parish's needs, including care for the church building itself?

Today, we remember that we are saints in the making. The Master Builder is still at work: some of us need finishing touches; some need structural repair; all of us must remain firmly set on the foundation, Jesus Christ. As we honor the dedication of St. John Lateran — cathedral and basilica, mother and head — we ask Mary Most Holy to help us become, like her, a true "house of God," a living temple of his love, so that the river of grace flowing from Christ's heart may run through us and bring life to the world.



Ever Wonder About...

CREMATION

Question:

Can Catholics be cremated?

Answer:

As the practice of cremation becomes more and more common, it's important to know what the Church asks of families who have chosen this for a loved one who has died.

As the US Bishops observe on their website, "Ideally, if a family chooses cremation, the cremation would take place some time after the Funeral Mass, so that there can be an opportunity for the Vigil for the Deceased in the presence of the body." However, if cremation takes places before the Funeral Mass, the cremated remains can be present at the Funeral Mass and the appendix to the Order of Christian Funerals provides adaptations for the texts and rituals that are part of the Funeral Mass and the Committal.

The primary concern is that the cremated remains should be treated with the same respect given to any human remains. The Order of Christian Funerals instructs, "This includes the use of a worthy vessel to contain the ashes, the manner in which they are carried, and the care and attention to appropriate placement and transport, and the final disposition. The cremated remains should be buried in a grave or entombed in a mausoleum or columbarium. The practice of scattering cremated remains on the sea, from the air, or on the ground, or keeping cremated remains on the home of a relative or friend of the deceased are not the reverent disposition that the Church requires" (no. 417).

It is becoming more and more common for parishes or diocese-sponsored cemeteries to include columbaria to house cremated remains in a way that respects Church teaching, allowing family and friends the opportunity to honor the remains of the one they have lost with dignity, reverence, and care.

Devotions, Explained!

SIMBANG GABI

Explained:


Simbang Gabi is a Filipino tradition through which Advent expectation realizes the fulfillment of Christmas joy. During Simbang Gabi, early morning Masses are offered over a series of nine days leading up to Christmas. Celebrations follow Mass, where delicacies like baked rice cakes and breakfast rolls are enjoyed.

Traditionally, Simbang Gabi Masses are held before dawn, a practice that originated in the 17th century in the Philippines when most of the faithful had to work the rest of the day in the fields.

During Mass, the priest wears white vestments and the Gloria is sung, a practice for which the Holy See has given special permission. Traditionally, the nine-day sequence ends with Midnight Mass on Dec. 24.

The tradition has been adapted to fit the needs of Filipino communities throughout the world, and the Masses might not even be offered in the morning at all, but in the afternoon or evening.

Meet this Ministry: ADVENT GIVING TREE

THE ADVENT GIVING TREE MINISTRY WORKS WITH LOCAL AGENCIES IN BATON ROUGE BRINGING CHRISTMAS BLESSINGS TO THE POOR AND NEEDY IN OUR COMMUNITY. PARISHIONERS ARE NEEDED TO HELP BUY, SORT, AND DISTRIBUTE GIFTS. MINISTRY CHAIRPERSON HANNAH HELTZ EXPLAINS:

HOW MANY MEMBERS DO YOU HAVE IN THIS MINISTRY?

We have a planning committee of four (Ann Bertsch, Sue Dille, Leslie Denham, and Hannah Heltz) plus our church liaison, Kristel Neupert. We meet at the start of school each year to get the calendar updated and to discuss the local charities we will support that year. We also may discuss changes needed for the upcoming season.

HOW OFTEN ARE THIS MINISTRY'S MEETINGS, AND WHAT ACTIVITIES DO MEMBERS WORK ON THROUGHOUT THE YEAR?

In September, letters go out to the charities asking for their requests. In October, we have additional help in getting all of those ornaments made! There are usually more than 1,000 gifts! And finally, in November, the trees go up in the Narthex — usually just before Thanksgiving.

That's when the gifts start pouring in thanks to our generous parishioners, and this is when the bulk of our volunteers are needed to help sort, check-in, bag, and distribute the gifts to each group!

HOW DO THE MEMBERS LIVE OUT THE GOSPEL IN THIS MINISTRY AND ENCOURAGE FELLOWSHIP?

This ministry really requires much more than our volunteers, θ despite hiccups each year it always works out. We always have outstanding volunteers, but the entire parish helps by fulfilling the gift requests. Seeing the gifts pile up in the Narthex always gets people excited, and it helps to remind us that while sharing gifts is important, giving to those less fortunate is really at the heart of this ministry.

WHAT GOALS DOES THIS MINISTRY HAVE FOR THIS YEAR AND NEXT?

Our primary goal is to keep this ministry alive for many years to come. This past year, I learned that some parishes have not been able to continue this tradition because they didn't have the organizers needed. Ann Bertsch, Rosmary Guptill, and Sue Dille were instrumental in organizing this ministry and getting it started. When it is time for them to pass the baton, we plan to be prepared by continuing to find additional help θ leadership for this project.

DESCRIBE A SUCCESS THIS MINISTRY HAS EXPERIENCED RECENTLY.

Every year, we have a few struggles, but God ALWAYS provides! This past year, we experienced two significant "God winks!" The first was a clerical error that we caught toward the end of this



process. Approximately 50 gifts were not among the ornaments made, so we reached out to various groups including ACTS women, and in less than a week all gifts were received!

The second is something that happens most years. We will find a request that is very specific and sometimes difficult to fulfill. We enjoy trying to make sure these gifts are fulfilled. This year, one of our gift requests was for a T-shirt from Glaser's farmers market in New Roads. It turns out that Glaser's has been closed for a few years, but we did find a phone number to reach out. Thankfully the phone number worked. The Glaser family was thrilled, and they were able to locate a T-shirt! Their family was happy to be a part of our advent giving tree, and our gift recipient was over the moon to receive it! She had been going to the farmers market with her mother for years. Not only did we provide a gift, but we also reconnected them with the Glaser family who remembered them!
