From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends,

There are at least two ways of thinking about how we see the world. The first may involve going to the optician to have our eyes checked. We undergo tests to see if our physical sight can be improved. But the second way transcends physical sight. In today's first reading Samuel the prophet visits Jesse to choose one of his sons to be anointed as king. He sees seven sons but rejects them all because he does not judge by physical appearance. God gives him spiritual insight, which looks to the heart and enables him to choose David.

Easter night can show us two different ways of seeing. The Vigil Mass begins in darkness. After the new fire is lit, the light is passed through the church and people can see as the physical darkness is dispelled. Our physical sight is given by the candles but our spiritual sight is given by Christ. He gives us a way of looking at the world which we call faith. But how do we come to faith?

We see the process of coming to faith dramatized in today's Gospel. Jesus is in Jerusalem for the feast of Tabernacles. As part of this festival the Jews carried water from the pool of Siloam to the Temple, which was illuminated by the blaze of four sets of great candles. Against that background Jesus claimed that he was the light of the world. Today the Gospel begins with the healing of a blind man. The healing of the blind man creates a stir. The man is interrogated by the Pharisees to find out what was done to him. They go back and forth between the man and his parents to make the man deny the miracle. Finally the man gets bolder and says, in effect, "Jesus has given me sight, and surely God does not listen to sinners." But they were blind to the facts and cast out the man.

Now, Jesus returns to the scene and challenges the man, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?" When the man wants to know who he is, Jesus tells him that he can see him now. But it is not just physical sight; he now has the spiritual sight to acknowledge Jesus in faith: "Lord, I believe," he says, and he worships him.

This Gospel reading is very appropriate in Lent because, on Easter night, hundreds of thousands of catechumens will profess their faith and be baptized. They will receive the light of Christ. The Gospel tells us how the blind man comes to faith gradually in the face of persecution and abuse. But at the same time the light of Christ shows up the darkness of unbelief. Some of the Pharisees cannot open their eyes to a new revelation. The parents of the blind man sit on the fence and are unwilling to speak.

It is not only those preparing for baptism who can recognize themselves in this account of the blind man. Lent is the time to examine our faith. We can easily be drawn to the darkness of unbelief by the pressures of a world which even persecutes the Church in many countries. We may be like the parents who want to keep quiet. Or we may be like the unbelieving Pharisees who turn away from the light. Easter offers us the opportunity to go beyond our physical sight and to see the world with the eyes of faith and, like the blind man, recognize Jesus as the light of the world.

Desde el escritorio del Pastor

Queridos Amigos,

Hay al menos dos formas de pensar sobre cómo vemos el mundo. El primero puede implicar ir al óptico para que nos revisen los ojos. Nos sometemos a pruebas para ver si nuestra vista física se puede mejorar. Pero la segunda forma trasciende la vista física. En la primera lectura de hoy, Samuel el profeta visita a Jesse para elegir a uno de sus hijos para ser ungido como rey. El ve a siete hijos, pero los rechaza a todos porque no juzga por su apariencia física. Dios le da una visión espiritual, que mira al corazón y le permite elegir a David.

La noche de Pascua nos puede mostrar dos formas diferentes de ver. La misa de vigilia comienza en la oscuridad. Después de que se enciende el nuevo fuego, la luz pasa a través de la iglesia y la gente puede ver cómo se disipa la oscuridad física. Nuestra visión física es dada por las velas, pero nuestra vista espiritual es dada por Cristo. Nos da una manera de mirar el mundo que llamamos fe. ¿Pero cómo llegamos a la fe?

Vemos el proceso de llegar a la fe dramatizado en el Evangelio de hoy. Jesús está en Jerusalén para la fiesta de los tabernáculos. Como parte de este festival, los judíos llevaron agua del estanque de Siloam al Templo, que estaba iluminado por el fuego de cuatro juegos de grandes velas. En ese contexto, Jesús afirmó que él era la luz del mundo. Hoy el Evangelio comienza con la curación de un ciego. La curación del ciego crea un gran revuelo. Los fariseos interrogan al hombre para averiguar qué le hicieron. Van y vienen entre el hombre y sus padres para hacer que el hombre niegue el milagro. Finalmente, el hombre se vuelve más audaz y dice, en efecto, "Jesús me ha dado vista, y seguramente Dios no escucha a los pecadores". Pero fueron ciegos a los hechos y expulsaron al hombre.

Ahora, Jesús regresa a la escena y desafía al hombre: "¿Crees en el Hijo del Hombre?" Cuando el hombre quiere saber quién es, Jesús le dice que puede verlo ahora. Pero no es solo la vista física; ahora tiene la visión espiritual para reconocer a Jesús en la fe: "Señor, creo", dice, y lo adora.

Esta lectura del Evangelio es muy apropiada en la Cuaresma porque, en la noche de Pascua, cientos de miles de catecúmenos profesarán su fe y serán bautizados. Recibirán la luz de Cristo. El Evangelio nos dice cómo el ciego llega a la fe gradualmente frente a la persecución y el abuso. Pero al mismo tiempo, la luz de Cristo muestra la oscuridad de la incredulidad. Algunos de los fariseos no pueden abrir los ojos a una nueva revelación. Los padres del ciego se sientan en la cerca y no están dispuestos a hablar.

No solo los que se preparan para el bautismo pueden reconocerse en este relato del ciego. La Cuaresma es el momento de examinar nuestra fe. Podemos ser fácilmente arrastrados a la oscuridad de la incredulidad por las presiones de un mundo que incluso persigue a la Iglesia en muchos países. Podemos ser como los padres que quieren callar. O podemos ser como los fariseos incrédulos que se apartan de la luz. La Pascua nos ofrece la oportunidad de ir más allá de nuestra vista física y ver el mundo con los ojos de la fe y, como el ciego, reconocer a Jesús como la luz del mundo.

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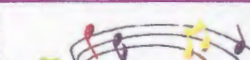
