From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends,

In the Holy Land, pilgrims still visit the tomb of Lazarus. It lies in the village called Bethany in the New Testament, approximately one and a half miles east of Jerusalem. According to a tradition dating back to the fourth century AD, this is the spot where Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead. The tomb lies inside a cave, which pilgrims access by clambering down steep, irregular stone steps. A favorite trick played by pilgrimage leaders is to get pilgrims who have managed to climb down to the floor of the cave to peer into the tomb, with its open hole in the stone wall, and repeat at full voice the words of Jesus: "Lazarus, come out!" Unknown to the pilgrims, someone is waiting behind the wall, and when the pilgrims shout for Lazarus to come out, the person emerges out of the dark – often accompanied by the screams of terrified pilgrims, frightened out of their wits by this unexpected piece of theatre.

It is easy to imagine just how petrified and astounded people would have been to see Lazarus suddenly emerge from his tomb after four days. It is curious that Jesus waited until he knew Lazarus was dead before going to Bethany. Jesus himself is quite clear that this whole situation will lead to God's glory and the glory of the Son. He says repeatedly throughout this story that this great sign will lead people to faith – as it does for his disciples, for Martha and Mary, and for the people standing round the tomb. He wants them to believe that he is the one sent by the Father. And the story concludes by telling us that many of the people who witnessed this miracle did in fact come to believe in him.

Raising the dead to life is a sure sign of the presence and action of God. In Ezekiel, the Lord says: "you will know that I am the Lord, when I open your graves and raise you from your graves, my people ... and I shall resettle you on your own soil." Here in Bethany, we see Jesus exercising that divine power, fulfilling God's promise.

The Gospel readings of last two Sundays and today's, have presented us with various images of what coming to faith in Christ is like: having a spring of water inside us, welling up into eternal life; moving from blindness to sight, from darkness to light and in the story of Lazarus, it is described as being a movement from lying down to being lifted up, from death to life. This is the difference believing in Christ makes to our lives – whether we are new to faith in Christ or old hands.

Tradition tells us that Lazarus relocated to Larnaca in Cyprus after the resurrection of Jesus. The church in Larnaca claims to be the site of Lazarus' tomb – where they buried him when he finally did die. It is a place of real calm and peace. Surely when Lazarus faced death once more, he would have felt no fear. Jesus had already brought him back to life once. He knew that was a sign of an even greater miracle: that Jesus would bring him to eternal life, bring him to the kingdom of his promise. We get a taste of that eternal life whenever we put our faith in Christ, when even in our darkest situations, we hear his voice, just as the dead Lazarus did, and respond to his call. In our need, Jesus raises us to new life, unbinding us, letting us go free. Faith in Jesus Christ empowers us to new life in true freedom: freedom from fear, freedom from the power of death, freedom to live by the Spirit which God has placed in us – the Spirit of the risen Christ.

Desde el escritorio del Pastor

Queridos Amigos,

En Tierra Santa, los peregrinos todavía visitan la tumba de Lázaro. Se encuentra en el pueblo llamado Betania en el Nuevo Testamento, aproximadamente a una milla y media al este de Jerusalén. Según una tradición que data del siglo IV dC, este es el lugar donde Jesús levantó a Lázaro de la muerte. La tumba se encuentra dentro de una cueva, a la que acceden los peregrinos trepando por escalones de piedra empinados e irregulares. Un truco favorito jugado por los líderes de peregrinación es conseguir que los peregrinos que han logrado descender al piso de la cueva se asomen a la tumba, con su agujero abierto en el muro de piedra, y repitan a toda voz las palabras de Jesús: "Lázaro, ¡salga!" Desconocido para los peregrinos, alguien está esperando detrás de la pared, y cuando los peregrinos gritan a Lázaro para que salga, la persona emerge de la oscuridad, a menudo acompañada por los gritos de peregrinos aterrorizados, asustados de su ingenio por este inesperado pedazo de teatro.

Es fácil imaginar cuán petrificados y asombrados habrían sido ver a Lázaro emerger repentinamente de su tumba después de cuatro días. Es curioso que Jesús haya esperado hasta saber que Lázaro estaba muerto antes de ir a Betania. Jesús mismo tiene bastante claro que toda esta situación conducirá a la gloria de Dios y la gloria del Hijo. Él dice repetidamente a lo largo de esta historia que esta gran señal llevará a las personas a la fe, como lo hace para sus discípulos, para Marta y María, y para las personas que están de pie alrededor de la tumba. Él quiere que crean que él es el enviado por el Padre. Y la historia concluye diciéndonos que muchas de las personas que presenciaron este milagro llegaron a creer en él.

Resucitar a los muertos a la vida es un signo seguro de la presencia y acción de Dios. En Ezequiel, el Señor dice: "sabrán que yo soy el Señor, cuando abra sus tumbas y los levante de ellos, mi pueblo ... y los reubicaré en su propia tierra". Aquí en Betania, vemos a Jesús ejerciendo ese poder divino, cumpliendo la promesa de Dios.

Las lecturas del Evangelio de los últimos dos domingos y de hoy nos han presentado varias imágenes de cómo es llegar a la fe en Cristo: tener un manantial de agua dentro de nosotros, que brota en la vida eterna; pasar de la ceguera a la vista, de la oscuridad a la luz y en la historia de Lázaro, se describe como un movimiento de acostarse a ser elevado, de la muerte a la vida. Esta es la diferencia que el creer en Cristo hace en nuestras vidas, ya sea que seamos nuevos en la fe en Cristo o que seamos viejos.

La tradición nos dice que Lázaro se mudó a Larnaca en Chipre después de la resurrección de Jesús. La iglesia en Larnaca afirma ser el sitio de la tumba de Lázaro, donde lo enterraron cuando finalmente murió. Es un lugar de verdadera calma y paz. Seguramente cuando Lázaro enfrentara la muerte una vez más, no habría sentido miedo. Jesús ya lo había devuelto a la vida una vez. Sabía que era una señal de un milagro aún mayor: que Jesús lo llevaría a la vida eterna, lo llevaría al reino de su promesa. Probamos esa vida eterna cada vez que ponemos nuestra fe en Cristo, cuando incluso en nuestras situaciones más oscuras, escuchamos su voz, tal como lo hizo el Lázaro muerto, y respondemos a su llamado. En nuestra necesidad, Jesús nos resucita a una nueva vida, nos desata, nos deja en libertad. La fe en Jesucristo nos da poder para una nueva vida en verdadera libertad: libertad del miedo, libertad del poder de la muerte, libertad de vivir por el Espíritu que Dios ha puesto en nosotros: el Espíritu del Cristo resucitado.
