

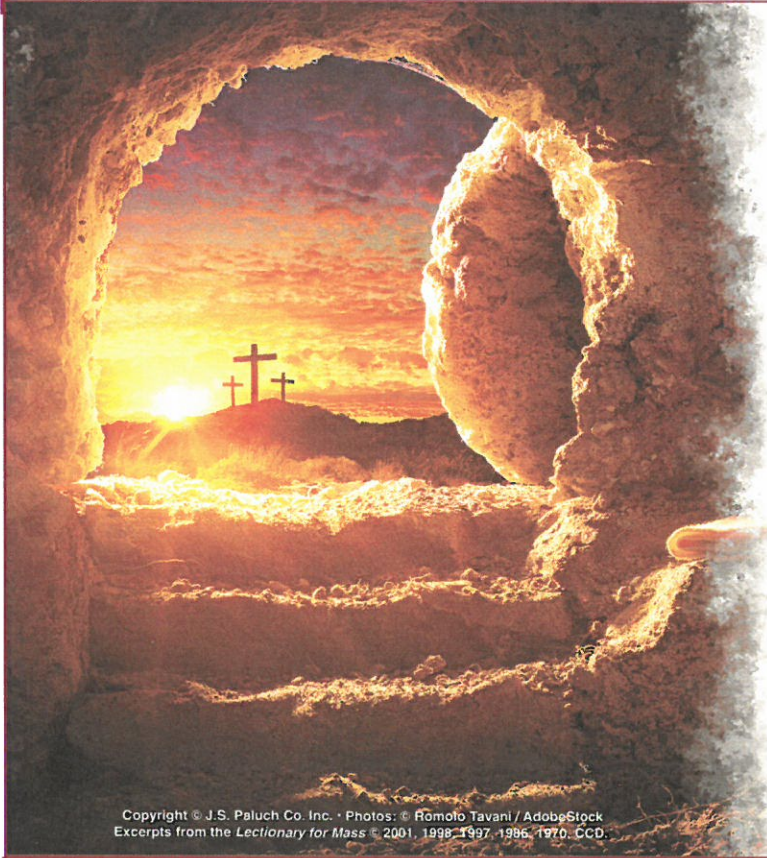

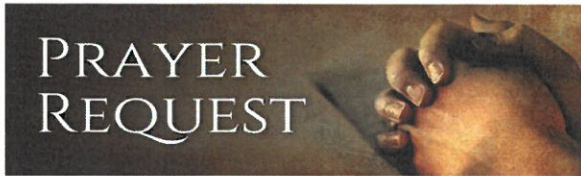

Dear Friends,

Early on Easter Sunday morning, Mary Magdalene headed towards the tomb in order to finish anointing of Jesus' body. She was the first one to do so. Was it because she wanted to spend private time with Jesus? Was she trying to spare his mother the agony of seeing him before he was as presentable as she could make him? Was it a bit of both? On her arrival, Mary found the stone rolled back and the tomb empty. The Gospels tell slightly different versions but agree that she hurried back to tell the disciples of her discovery. Mark and Luke tell us that they didn't believe Mary and that, when he subsequently appeared to them in the upper room, Jesus scolded his followers for their disbelief.

Mary Magdalene had accompanied Jesus to his crucifixion and, along with his mother and a few other women, had stayed there until he died. So often it's women who stand alongside someone who is suffering, offering whatever support they can. Of all Jesus' disciples, John was the only male representative. Perhaps embarrassment fueled the men's response now. Afraid for their own lives, they had run away and avoided Calvary. Mary had courageously witnessed horrors they had escaped. Mary's faithfulness made her the first witness to the resurrection.

Of the apostles, it was Peter and John that decided to investigate the truth of Mary's report. But they only fully began to believe her when they saw the evidence for themselves. Jesus had told them that he would rise from the dead, but they hadn't understood what he was saying. They could not, of themselves, predict the resurrection. Although Jesus had brought Lazarus back to life, it was not enough. They needed the evidence of their own senses.

In 2016 Pope Francis declared Mary Magdalene to be the "apostle to the apostles" because "she is the witness to the risen Christ and announces the message of the Lord's resurrection just like the rest of the apostles." Interestingly, it was only then, two thousand years after the event, that her feast was officially given the same status as those of the apostles. Talk about a "glass ceiling" – it even applies to female saints! When we think about it, if the apostles had not expected a woman to tell them of the resurrection – which they had not really expected in any case – it also shows the most unlikely people are able to turn our own lives upside down, inside out and back to front. God uses the most unexpected messengers to pass on the most important messages we are ever likely to hear. Sometimes it might be a child's innocent remark that suddenly appears to have the most amazing profundity and stops us in our tracks. Jesus had told his disciples that he would rise on the third day, but they didn't understand what he was saying.

Even the raising of Lazarus does not seem to have sparked the idea that Jesus was prefiguring his own resurrection. Of course, it made sense in hindsight, but it's easy to be wise after the event. Mary Magdalene was the first witness to the resurrection, but she also teaches us that we should be alert and listening to all the unexpected messengers who, knowingly or unknowingly, reveal to us our amazing God. **Wish y'all A Blessed Easter!**

Queridos Amigos,

Temprano en la mañana del Domingo de Resurrección, María Magdalena se dirigió hacia el sepulcro para terminar de ungir el cuerpo de Jesús. Ella fue la primera en hacerlo. ¿Fue porque quería pasar tiempo privado con Jesús? ¿Estaba tratando de ahorrarle a su madre la agonía de verlo antes de que estuviera lo más presentable posible? ¿Fue un poco de ambos? A su llegada, María encontró la piedra removida y el sepulcro vacío. Los Evangelios cuentan versiones ligeramente diferentes, pero coinciden en que ella se apresuró a volver para contarles a los discípulos su descubrimiento. Marcos y Lucas nos cuentan que no le creyeron a María y que, cuando posteriormente se les apareció en el aposento alto, Jesús reprendió a sus seguidores por su incredulidad.

María Magdalena había acompañado a Jesús a su crucifixión y, junto con su madre y algunas otras mujeres, se había quedado allí hasta que murió. Muy a menudo son las mujeres las que están al lado de alguien que está sufriendo, ofreciendo todo el apoyo que pueden. De todos los discípulos de Jesús, Juan era el único representante masculino. Quizás la vergüenza alimentó la respuesta de los hombres ahora. Temiendo por sus propias vidas, se habían escapado y evitado el Calvario. Mary había presenciado valientemente los horrores de los que habían escapado. La fidelidad de María la convirtió en el primer testigo de la resurrección.

De los apóstoles, fueron Pedro y Juan quienes decidieron investigar la veracidad del informe de María. Pero solo comenzaron a creerla completamente cuando vieron la evidencia por sí mismos. Jesús les había dicho que resucitaría de entre los muertos, pero ellos no habían entendido lo que decía. No podían, por sí mismos, predecir la resurrección. Aunque Jesús había resucitado a Lázaro, no era suficiente. Necesitaban la evidencia de sus propios sentidos.

En 2016, el Papa Francisco declaró a María Magdalena como la "apóstol de los apóstoles" porque "ella es testigo de Cristo resucitado y anuncia el mensaje de la resurrección del Señor al igual que el resto de los apóstoles". Curiosamente, fue solo entonces, dos mil años después del evento, que a su fiesta se le dio oficialmente el mismo estatus que a las de los apóstoles. Hable acerca de un "techo de cristal", ¡incluso se aplica a las santas! Cuando pensamos en ello, si los apóstoles no esperaban que una mujer les hablara de la resurrección, lo que en realidad no esperaban en ningún caso, también muestra que las personas más inverosímiles son capaces de poner nuestras propias vidas patas arriba, de adentro hacia afuera, y de atrás hacia adelante. Dios usa a los mensajeros más inesperados para transmitir los mensajes más importantes que probablemente escucharemos. A veces puede ser el comentario inocente de un niño que de repente parece tener la profundidad más asombrosa y nos detiene en seco. Jesús les había dicho a sus discípulos que resucitaría al tercer día, pero ellos no entendían lo que decía.

Incluso la resurrección de Lázaro no parece haber despertado la idea de que Jesús estaba prefigurando su propia resurrección. Por supuesto, tenía sentido en retrospectiva, pero es fácil ser sabio después del evento. María Magdalena fue la primera testigo de la resurrección, pero también nos enseña que debemos estar alerta y escuchando a todos los mensajeros inesperados que, a sabiendas o no, nos revelan a nuestro Dios asombroso. ¡Deséale a todos una bendita Pascua!

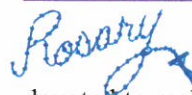

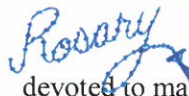

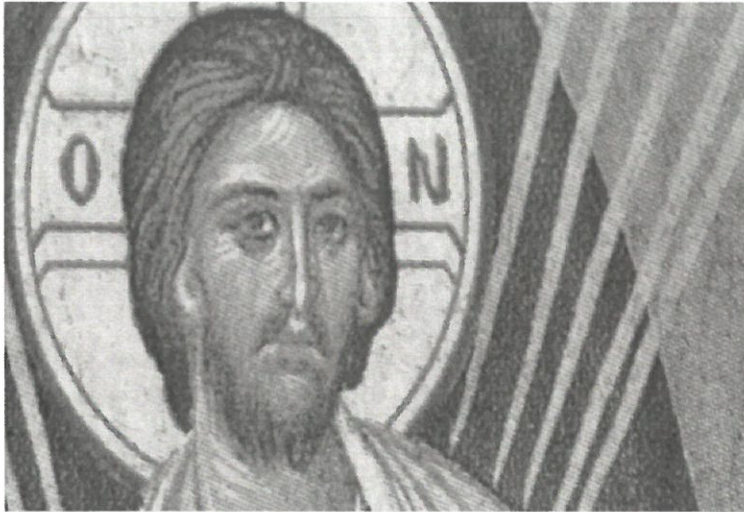

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION - Over the centuries, the Church has demonstrated a wonderful ability to adopt a culture's favorite symbols and customs and assign them new meaning. Easter eggs have a very ancient pedigree: nature's perfect package, emblem of new life, dyed and decorated and given as gifts in ancient Egypt, Rome, China, and Persia. Just as the long hard winter is over, the egg bursts with promise of life and nourishment. Long ago, Christians came to see the egg not as a symbol of spring's rebirth, but of ours, and as a sign of Christ's tomb. A Polish legend says that Mary, in compassion for the soldiers at the cross, gave them eggs, but that her tears stained their shells with brilliant color. Legends have their origin in tales told around a hearth, but they often contain a profound truth. The idea of Mary, the first Christian, engaged in a merciful act of forgiveness and tenderness even in the shadow of the cross, describes the age-old wish that Christ "Easter in us." —James Field, Copyright © J. TESOROS DE NUESTRA TRADICIÓN: *A lo largo de los siglos, la Iglesia ha demostrado una capacidad maravillosa para adoptar los símbolos y costumbres favoritos de una cultura y asignarles un nuevo significado. Los huevos de Pascua tienen un pedigrí muy antiguo: el paquete perfecto de la naturaleza, emblema de una nueva vida, teñido y decorado, y se regala en el antiguo Egipto, Roma, China y Persia. Justo cuando el largo y duro invierno ha terminado, el huevo estalla con la promesa de vida y alimento. Hace mucho tiempo, los cristianos vinieron a ver el huevo no como un símbolo del renacimiento de la primavera, sino del nuestro, y como un signo de la tumba de Cristo. Una leyenda polaca dice que María, en compasión por los soldados en la cruz, les dio huevos, pero que sus lágrimas mancharon sus conchas de color brillante. Las leyendas tienen su origen en cuentos contados alrededor de un hogar, pero a menudo contienen una verdad profunda. La idea de María, la primera cristiana, comprometida en un acto misericordioso de perdón y ternura, incluso a la sombra de la cruz, describe el antiguo deseo de que Cristo sea la "Pascua en nosotros".*

Our Gospel reading from John captures the initial confusion of Jesus' followers on Easter morning. Mary thinks the body has been stolen, and the two disciples see an empty tomb, but do not understand. We can sympathize with their initial misreading, as they are interpreting what happened within how they understand the way the world works: Jesus was crushed by the authorities—end of story. Jesus' later appearances to them will dramatically shift their perception of God, the world, and themselves.

This work of re-interpreting the world in light of the death and resurrection of Jesus continues today. In his passion and death, Jesus showed that true power, God's power, emerges through humility and forgiveness. We join in the death and resurrection of Jesus when we surrender the attractions of power, status, and comfort, and embrace non-violence, service, and care for the suffering. The path to bringing peace and goodness to the world is not through seeking control, but through sacrificial love.

BOTH PETER AND CORNELIUS

Peter's speech in today's passage from Acts summarizes the ministry, death, and resurrection of Jesus. The speech occurs within his encounter with Cornelius, a Roman centurion and his household. We can perhaps imagine being Cornelius, led by God to hear the story of Jesus. Or we can imagine being Peter, led by the Spirit to share the Good News of Jesus. As followers of Christ, we are called to embrace both, in our imaginations and our lives.

We are continually called to hear the story of Jesus. We know that God's Good News has entered us, but also know that it has not. There is much in our hearts that needs conversion and begs for God's mercy, so we always seek God's challenging and healing word. We are also continually called to share the story of Jesus, sometimes directly but more often in our actions. Our lives can speak of God's love, healing and encouraging others. We are both Peter and Cornelius.

Nuestra lectura del Evangelio de Juan capta la confusión inicial de los seguidores de Jesús en la mañana de Pascua. María cree que el cuerpo ha sido robado, y los dos discípulos ven una tumba vacía, pero no lo entienden. Podemos simpatizar con su mala interpretación inicial, ya que están interpretando lo sucedido dentro de su forma de entender el funcionamiento del mundo: Jesús fue aplastado por las autoridades—fin de la historia. Las apariciones posteriores de Jesús cambiarán radicalmente su percepción de Dios, del mundo y de ellos mismos.

Este trabajo de reinterpretación del mundo a la luz de la muerte y resurrección de Jesús continúa hoy. En su pasión y muerte, Jesús mostró que el verdadero poder, el poder de Dios, surge a través de la humildad y el perdón. Nos unimos a la muerte y resurrección de Jesús cuando renunciamos a los atractivos del poder, el estatus y la comodidad, y abrazamos la no violencia, el servicio y la atención a los que sufren. El camino para traer la paz y la bondad al mundo no pasa por buscar el control, sino por el amor sacrificado.

PEDRO Y CORNELIO

El discurso de Pedro en el pasaje de hoy de los Hechos resume el ministerio, la muerte y la resurrección de Jesús. El discurso se produce en el marco de su encuentro con Cornelio, un centurión romano y su familia. Podemos imaginarnos que somos Cornelio, guiado por Dios para escuchar la historia de Jesús. O podemos imaginarnos siendo Pedro, guiado por el Espíritu para compartir la Buena Nueva de Jesús. Como seguidores de Cristo, estamos llamados a abrazar ambas cosas, en nuestra imaginación y en nuestra vida.

Estamos continuamente llamados a escuchar la historia de Jesús. Sabemos que la Buena Nueva de Dios ha entrado en nosotros, pero también sabemos que no lo ha hecho. Hay mucho en nuestros corazones que necesita la conversión y pide la misericordia de Dios, por lo que siempre buscamos la palabra desafiante y sanadora de Dios. También estamos continuamente llamados a compartir la historia de Jesús, a veces directamente, pero más a menudo en nuestras acciones. Nuestras vidas pueden hablar del amor de Dios, sanando y animando a los demás. Somos tanto Pedro como Cornelio.

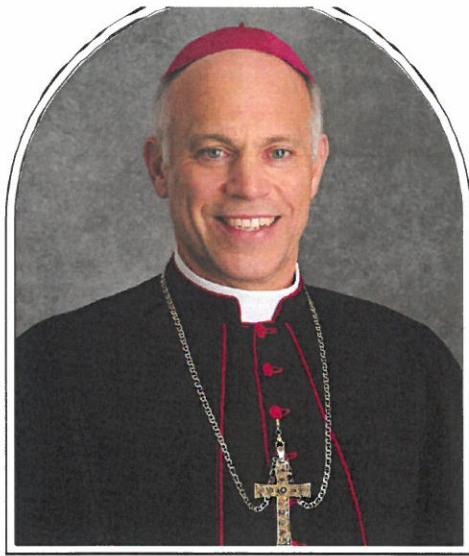

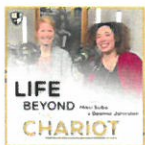

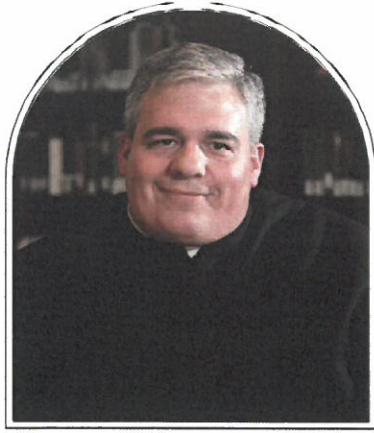
