

Food for Thought in the Year of *Eucharist* Revival and Renewal

As a whole, Christians miss the important fact that the Blessed Virgin Mary plays a key role in the beliefs of Christians. Whether they want to admit it or not does not change the truth of it.

The Church Fathers and theologians carefully distinguish between the type of worship due to God, latria, and the veneration given to the Saints, dulia. Catholic theology includes a type of veneration, hyperdulia, which is paid specifically to the Mother of God, the Blessed Virgin Mary, because it is pleasing to Jesus that we honor His Mother.

This is pointed out in her response to the Angel Gabriel in her Fiat and is further confirmed by Jesus as He manifested His Father's command to honor Father and Mother; and as He passed her care to His disciple John, as He died upon the cross, thus preserving her honor then and now.

The many different titles attributed to her have developed from her personal life, her places of honor in the life of the Church, her role in the plan of our salvation and her intercession to God on our behalf. These devotions to her are not just the result of the writings of the saints and the Church Fathers, but also in conjunction in the belief in Marian apparitions and the reports of miracles and healings.

Our Lady has been granted a special role in union with God. When we honor Mary, when we pray the rosary and the stations, and the many other prayers associated with her, we honor God; and thus we honor her too as children of God, sons and daughters of God, her children. Mary has much to tell us and intercede upon for us as any mother would, but we must be listening and asking for her guidance in finding Jesus. She has much to say concerning her Son and the Eucharist, too.

Below is one title and prayer taken from among the 50 or so titles listed for her, not including the Rosary and the Stations of the Cross, etc.

OUR LADY AND THE MOST BLESSED SACRAMENT

Virgin Immaculate, perfect lover of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, we ask you to obtain for us the graces we need to become true adorers of our Eucharistic God. Grant us, we beg of you, to know Him better, to love Him more, and to center our lives around the Eucharist; that is, to make our whole life a constant prayer of adoration, thanksgiving, reparation, and petition to Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. Amen.

V. Pray for us, O Virgin Immaculate, our Lady of the Most Blessed Sacrament.





PSALM: "My soul is thirsting for you, O Lord my God." (Psalm 63)


SECOND READING: Discern what is the will of God. (Romans 12:1-2)


(Matthew 16:21-27) GOSPEL: Take up the cross and follow the Lord.
