

Our school utilizes the SchoolMessenger system to deliver text messages, straight to your mobile phone with important information about events, school closings, safety alerts and more.

You can participate in this free service\* just by sending a text message of "Y" or "Yes" to our school's short code number, 67587.

You can also opt out of these messages at any time by simply replying to one of our messages with "Stop".

#### Information on SMS text messaging and Short Codes:

SMS stands for Short Message Service and is commonly referred to as a "text message". Most cell phones support this type of text messaging. Our notification provider, SchoolMessenger, uses a true SMS protocol developed by the telecommunications industry specifically for mass text messaging, referred to as "short code" texting. This method is fast, secure and highly reliable because it is strictly regulated by the wireless carriers and only allows access to approved providers. If you've ever sent a text vote for a TV show to a number like 46999, you have used short code texting.


Raffle ends February 1, 2023 One winner will be chosen.

## 2nd Grade Makerspace STEM challenge ... Create paper cup, Sphero-controlled robots!

Students worked in groups where members took turns completing the steps to create the robot: they used a ruler to measure and cut construction paper to 4" wide, evenly cut the bottom of the cup off, cut slits on opposite sides to create arms, rolled and attached the construction paper to create the head, cut slits for spiked hair and drew a face at the top between the two arms. Then each group placed a Sphero robot under the paper cup robot and connected and controlled its movements using an iPad. The students were so excited to control their cute, little robots!
