Spiritual Director training update

Offering the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius

his Spring, 12 men and women will complete year two of the three-year Spiritual Direction training program being offered by the Oblates of the Virgin Mary and facilitated by the Diocese of Burlington. This initiative was launched to increase the availability of trained spiritual directors in our Diocese.

The training has been substantial, including full and rigorous weekends of formation, practicums, lectures, reading, lots of time focused on praying with the scriptures, human psychology and development, completing the Ignatian Spiritual Exercises, and being prepared to lead others through the Exercises. In addition, this past year the students have engaged in spiritual direction, while under supervision.

The next step in their training will be to direct someone through the Ignatian Spiritual Exercises. This is a scripturally based retreat St. Ignatius developed to help individuals deepen their relationship with God. Each day features taking time in prayer and in the scriptures, within a structure St. Ignatius developed. The process includes regularly meeting a director (the person leading you through the Exercises). There are two ways to undertake this retreat: a 30-day directed retreat or via a "19th Annotation," where an individual undertakes the retreat while continuing their daily responsibilities. Since most people don't have the freedom to take 30 days away for a retreat, the 19th Annotation has been a very popular way of experiencing the Exercises. It should be noted that this is a substantial (and rewarding) undertaking.

The Exercises, when undertaken via the 19th Annotation, typically last six to eight months and require setting aside approximately one hour daily for prayer and meditation on specific scripture passages, or other themes assigned by the director.

The 19th Annotation is done at home and meetings with the director can be done in person or online. If this is something that the Lord is inviting you to consider, feel free to reach out to myself or any of the 12 individuals who will be offering this retreat, listed on the right.


