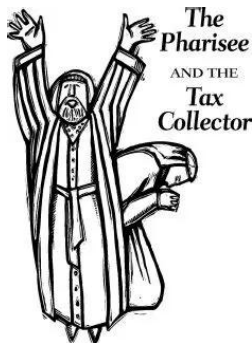

SAINTS SIMON & JUDE

Simon and Jude are named in the apostolic catalogue but little else is said about them. Jude at least is also the name of a short epistle in the New Testament; Simon otherwise seems to disappear although we have tradition and legend associated with each.

There are all sorts of traditions about where Simon the Zealot (distinguished from Simon Peter) preached, though Persia seems to be most commonplace. It was said that he was sawed into pieces: His icon usually represents him holding a bucksaw, a traditional symbol of his martyrdom.

If Simon suffers from silence, Jude suffers from confusion. St. Jude is known as the “patron of hopeless causes and things despaired of.” Jude is distinguished from Judas Iscariot by also being referred to as “Thaddeus” (great-hearted) (Mark 3:18), the “son of James” or “son of Alpheus” (Luke 6:16), or simply “Judas (not Iscariot)” (John 14:22).

Like Simon, we know little about Jude’s subsequent activities. One tradition says Abgar, King of Edessa in today’s Turkey, was seriously ill. He sent for Jesus to come to him, but Our Lord pressed his face to a cloth on which his image was imprinted, and sent this pre-Veronica’s Veil with Jude to Abgar, who was healed. That is why Jude is often depicted with a medallion bearing the image of Jesus either in his hand or around his neck. He is often also shown holding a halberd — a battle axe on a long pike — because that is often cited as the means of his martyrdom in Persia around AD 65. One tradition holds that Simon and Jude opposed idol worship in Persia and so were killed by the priests of the pagan cult. Because Jude is the “patron of hopeless cases,” he is often attired in green, the color of hope and life.

reminder to join with the whole church in petition for our brothers and sisters who have died."

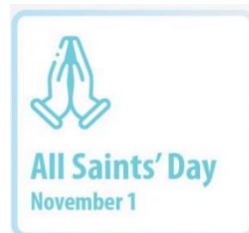
All Saints and All Souls Days – similarities and differences

In 2025, because All Saints' Day falls on Saturday (November 1st), it is NOT considered to be a Holy Day of Obligation. However, there will be an All Saints' Day Mass at 9:00 am at St. John the Evangelist. The 5:30 pm Vigil Mass will occur as per the normal schedule. Since All Souls' Day falls on Sunday, November 2nd, the Sunday Obligation applies!

In part due to their proximity on the calendar, All Saints Day (November 1) and All Souls Day (November 2), are often spoken of in the same breath, which can muddy the distinctions between them.

The ways to make the most of All Saints Day and All Souls Day are essentially the same – namely the Mass and



All Saints' Day

What is it?

All Saints' Day is a solemn holy day dedicated to the saints of the Church and all those who have reached heaven.



All Souls' Day
November 2

What is it?

All Souls' Day is dedicated to those who have departed from this world, and who wait in faith for the promised Resurrection.

prayer – but these have different characteristics depending on the day.

ALL SAINTS DAY: One significant distinction is

that All Saints Day is normally a holy day of obligation, which means we are obligated to attend Mass (traditionally there was also a requirement for fasting on the vigil of All Saints Day, but this was removed by the United States Conference of Bishops in 1983).

All Saints Day Mass is an opportunity to thank God for the witness of the saints, and to ask for their intercession.

ALL SOULS DAY: On All Souls Day we are encouraged to attend Mass, but it is optional. On this day the focus is on

TWO PRAYER DIRECTIONS: The main difference between the prayer proper to each day is that on All Saints Day we are praying to the saints, asking for their intercession.

On All Souls Day we are petitioning for the departed souls of others (what a soul-boggling privilege!).

JUMPSTART ON ALL SOULS DAY: There is one way of bringing the two days together.

The Church teaches that saints can pray for souls in purgatory. Therefore, to get a jumpstart on All Souls Day (November 2) we can pray to the saints on their day (November 1) asking them to intercede for the souls in purgatory. Even heaven has its workarounds.

4 THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT HALLOWEEN AS A CATHOLIC

- Halloween** has been a Christian celebration since the early 8th century. Pope Gregory III first instituted it.
- "Halloween" comes from "All Hallows' Eve," referring to the night before All Hallows' Day, or All Saints' Day!
- Allhallowtide is the three days of All Hallows' Eve (Halloween), All Hallows' Day (All Saints' Day), and All Souls' Day. This is a time for honoring the saints and praying for the dead. [@catholicjesustok](#)

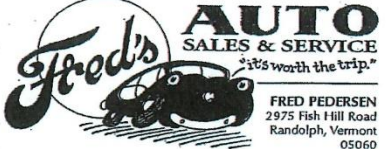
