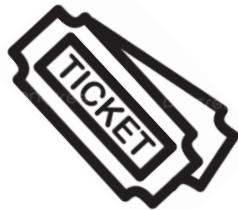

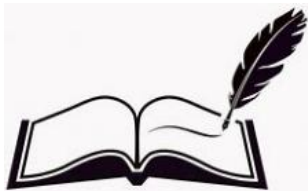

All Saints and All Souls Days

In 2025, because All Saints' Day falls on Saturday (November 1st), it is NOT a Holy Day of Obligation. Since All Souls' Day falls on Sunday, November 2nd, the Sunday Obligation applies!



PRAYING FOR THE DEAD: PURGATORY

In paragraph 1030, the Catechism of the Catholic Church states (CCC) that *"All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven"*. This is the state we describe as PURGATORY.

WHY?

To put it simply, we pray for the dead to ease their suffering in purgatory and to hasten their admittance into Heaven, where we hope eventually to join them.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC), paragraph 958, teaches us "In full consciousness of this communion of the whole Mystical Body of Jesus Christ, the Church in its pilgrim members [that means us], from the very earliest days of the Christian religion, has honored with great respect the memory of the dead; and 'because it is a holy and a wholesome thought to pray for the dead that they may be loosed from their sins,' she offers her suffrages [that is intercessory prayers] for them" (Lumen Gentium 50; cf. 2 Macc. 12:45). Our prayer for them is capable not only of helping them, but also of making their intercession for us effective.

All Saints' Day v. All Souls' Day

What's the Difference?



All Saints' Day
November 1

What is it?

All Saints' Day is a solemn holy day dedicated to the saints of the Church and all those who have reached heaven.

How is it observed?

A Catholic Holy Day of Obligation, all Catholics are required to attend mass. All Saints' Day is celebrated by honoring the saints by visiting their holy shrines and offering prayers seeking their intercession.



All Souls' Day
November 2

What is it?

All Souls' Day is dedicated to those who have departed from this world, and who wait in faith for the promised Resurrection.

How is it observed?

All Souls' Day is not a holy day of obligation, but is recognized in the Catholic Church on November 2. On this day, we pray for our loved ones to enter heaven.



HOW?

The Mass is the highest form of prayer in the Church, and the most effective prayer that could be said on behalf of those who have gone before us. In Masses for the dead, and especially funeral Masses, "the Church offers the Eucharistic sacrifice of Christ's Pasch for the dead so that, since all the members of Christ's Body are in communion with one another, what implores spiritual help for some, may bring comforting hope to others." ("General Instruction of the Roman Missal," 379)

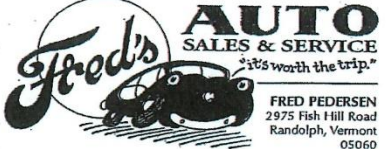
