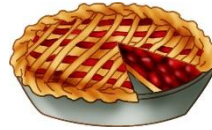

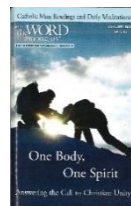

## Preserving the Flow of Prayer in the Mass

*"The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life." (Lumen Gentium, 11)*

The Second Vatican Council reminds us that the Holy Eucharist is the source and summit of our Christian life. Saint John Paul II further taught in *Dies Domini* that the Sunday Eucharist is the foundation of the whole liturgical year, so it should be the high point of each week. My goal as a priest is to help us all become saints. To do this, I want to work to make the Sunday Mass the true center of our week and the focal point of our lives.

As one part of this, I have been reflecting on how announcements affect the liturgy. We already tend to avoid them before Mass to ensure we are prayerfully preparing to enter the sacrifice of the Mass. I have also observed that announcements after Communion can disrupt the flow of the liturgy, especially if they are long or numerous. The rubrics of the Mass state that announcements at this time are permitted "if they are necessary" and should be "brief."

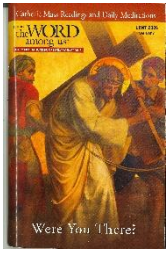
To align our parish practice with this guidance and preserve the continuous flow of prayer, I want to establish a new norm to generally omit spoken announcements. If there are any that are necessary, I will try to keep them brief because the time immediately following Holy Communion is meant to be a period for prayerful thanksgiving. We want to maintain this spirit of recollection through the Prayer After Communion and the Final Blessing. This allows the grace of the Mass to remain our main focus as we go forth to proclaim the Gospel to all the nations. This change places a greater emphasis on the parish bulletin. Please make a habit of taking the bulletin home (or accessing it online) and reading it each week to stay informed about parish events. I will rely on you to seek out this information so that we can keep the liturgy focused on prayer. I plan to speak at the end of Mass only if there is an important schedule change

or an urgent matter that arose after the bulletin was printed. I hope this adjustment allows us all to enter more deeply into the sacred mysteries we celebrate.

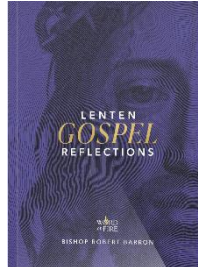

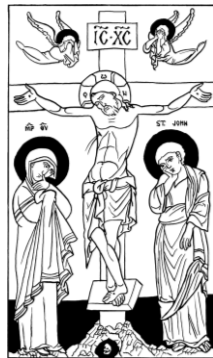
