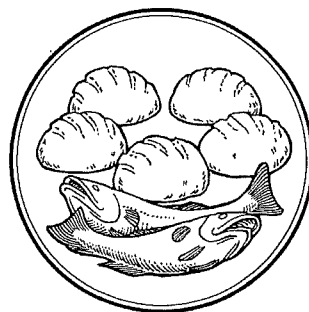

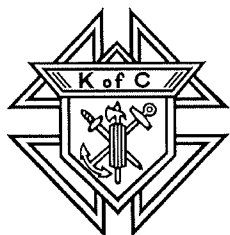

decision or seeking peace in a difficult season? Are you trying to understand patterns of consolation and desolation, of highs and lows, in your spiritual life? Do you simply want to grow closer to Jesus? Perhaps Spiritual Direction is something you should consider exploring.

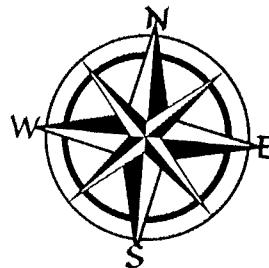
The Mechanics:

A Directee typically would meet with their Spiritual Director on a monthly basis, for approximately one hour per session. Discussions would be held in confidence except in cases involving potential harm to self or others. This is a ministry of the Diocese of Burlington with formation provided under the auspices of the Oblates of the Virgin Mary.

Spiritual Direction:

Listening for God's Voice

The Church continues to encourage the ministry of Spiritual Direction: *"As she has never failed to do, again today the Church continues to recommend the practice of Spiritual Direction, not only to all those who wish to follow the Lord closely, but to every Christian who wishes to live responsibly his baptism, that is, the new life in Christ."*
- Pope Benedict XVI.



What is Spiritual Direction?

Spiritual Direction is a time-honored ministry in which one trained person (the Director) assists another person (the Directee) in growing closer to God. The Director helps facilitate a conversation with the Lord, along with the Directee and the Holy Spirit. *"The focus of this kind of direction is the relationship itself between God and the person... Spiritual Direction of this kind focuses on what happens when a person listens to and responds to a self-communicating God"* (The Practice of Spiritual Direction, Barry and Connolly). Contrary to the name, the Director is not truly directive but seeks, through a contemplative, evocative approach, to assist the person to recognize the way the Lord is leading them.

Spiritual Direction is NOT a more religious form of therapy or counseling. A Spiritual Director is not a life coach, a giver of advice, or someone that will help you solve your problems. Spiritual Direction is a place to explore the movements of the Holy Spirit in your life. It is a place to ask the deeper questions: Where is God in my situation? What is He inviting me to see? How is He calling me into a deeper relationship with Him?

Why enter into Spiritual Direction?

Spiritual Direction can help us become more attentive to God's grace at work. Do you want help beginning or deepening daily prayer? Are you discerning a major

Faith without asterisks

English majors like myself can often have some strange predilections. For me, it's a fascination with punctuation. I do love to play around with all the different ways of structuring sentences; as far as I'm concerned, those marks are like road signs signaling where someone's thoughts are really intending to go. (You may have noticed that semi-colon in the last sentence. One of my favorites.)

There is one punctuation mark, however, that is perhaps the most interesting of all, and that is the asterisk. It doesn't do the job of a comma or colon, for example. In fact, what it does is take the reader right out of the sentence completely by pointing to something else. Grammatically, it indicates "an exception, limitation, or qualification" to what has gone before. In other words, it says that there's more (or less) to the story than meets the eye. It's the advertisement that looks great until you follow the asterisk, only to discover that that terrific price only applies to sales completed between 9:00 and 9:10 a.m. every other Wednesday morning.

The asterisk, whether we realize it or not, is also something that creeps into our thinking, even if we never use it in our writing. How many times do we look for the loophole in something we don't want to do, or rationalize behavior that on the surface is unacceptable. Up comes our mental asterisk and voila! Looks like we can do (or say) that thing after all. Convenient, but is it right?

Unfortunately, it's something that human beings have been doing with God's sentences since the beginning of time. Take any of the Commandments, or the prophets, or anything Jesus said we must do and someone, somewhere has come up with an asterisk for it. What ends up happening is that we fool ourselves into thinking we are faithful followers of God when in fact we are quite committed to our own way of doing things. In the Gospel of Mark, Jesus pointedly calls out the Pharisees on precisely this sort of thing:

"You disregard God's commandment but cling to human tradition."



He went on to say, "How well you have set aside the commandment of God in order to uphold your tradition!" (Mk 7: 8-9)

Much of our spiritual growth consists of identifying and rooting out all the asterisks we have placed on God's words in our lives. There's an old saying that says "the road to Hell is paved with good intentions." That is probably true, but I think we also need to beware of the paving stones that say "Yes, but...". This Christianity thing is not for the faint of heart by any means. Our unalloyed "Yes" may be the hardest thing we will ever be asked to do, but it is also the most necessary. If you want an example to follow, remember a young girl from Nazareth, whose unqualified "Yes" to God changed the whole world.

Pay attention to personal punctuation, it means more than you know.

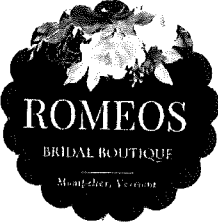
