It seems a beautiful thing that at least so many of us could be in spiritual communion through viewing and participation in the liturgies of Holy week and Easter. It was a poignant experience of the need for the body of Christ to be present as the Body of Christ to one another in order to derive the fullest and most real experience, and we pray and trust that we will soon be able to celebrate this fullest sense of being church.

The liturgy of the Easter season is consistent in its emphasis that the risen Christ is present and active in the world by being present and active in the life and activity of the community. The visible manifestation of an invisible reality (sacrament) finds fulfillment in the reality of the church and makes of it a sacrament for the world's salvation "VATII. The church belongs in the world just as Christ belonged and belongs in the world. The mission of us all as church is to be the active and saving presence of Christ in the world.

But all good work for the culture of Christ/Reign of God must also have deep rootedness in, intimacy with God in Christ. During a time that we cannot celebrate the sacraments most joyfully united, nor be very active in the world, we can use this more reflective space to pray and grow in our love and union. Our "works" flow from our awareness of being forgiven, of being loved and cherished by God this awareness is quickened when we take the time to reflect, ponder, pray, meditate; in other words, just being with God in the depths of our being. So continue the brave journey of stillness, quiet and more expansive God, conscious, realizing that this is the heart of everything, the foundation of our lives.

You are not alone when engaged in prayer contemplation, of course the Holy Spirit, our comforter, is present when we take these steps. We are bound spiritually to Christ and are one another (like even our computers can reveal!). Union most deeply and quietly with God is meant to heal loneliness, offer consolation, inspire wisdom and resolve, be all the peace we desire.

We are bathed in the light of the Gospel! We can be signs to one another and our world, still, especially in bleaker times, when we practice finding our equanimity through exploring our relationships to God in all the less public and more private ways we can. Christ remains with us always as we carry out our holy mission in the world, even while not too physically in it. We are totally engaged even, and especially, through prayer.

God's mercy and abundance of holy life bless and sustain you, as we assist our world and each other now.



We find hope and inspiration in the despair, and courage and purpose in the darkness.


