

I called you by your name

We live in a society where there is a growing division between who have and those who have not. When we see large cities struggling with the problem of overcrowding, and homelessness, and so much loneliness, isolation, when we see so much violence and killings, communities crumbling with families breaking away, the educational system crumbling down, then the degradation of moral life is inevitable. We feel powerless and even lose the sense of responsibility for the common good, especially educators, doctors, nurses, hospice caretakers, volunteers, and social workers. Jesus is our guru. He is personally inviting us not to give up hope because the Lord who empowered the King Cyrus saying, "***I called you by your name... though you do not know me.***" (Is. 45:4) is our Lord. As a citizen of the world, we keep on doing what we are supposed to do on earth. We belong to two worlds, the secular world, and God's world.

We are called to be loyal to both, but we must realize that there is only one world, that counts, and it is God's world. So, as we live in this world, we obey its laws and follow the rules of our respective governments and do what we can to promote the goodness of God through our action and words. Also, we really fulfill the duties of the spiritual part of God's kingdom under God's ownership. There is always a higher law, a deeper value and a persistent call that is made to each one of us to be honest to God and God alone. We bow and respect other human beings, but we kneel before God. Worship is due to God alone and that is why we come every week to the Eucharist. The whole week we respect our duties, love our family, and obey the rules and regulation of the street, community, state, and government; but on Sunday, we come to Church to kneel down in front of our loving God, to worship him because our knees shall bend, and our mouths confess that He is the Lord of all.

Our faith has to be dynamic, leading us to actions for others, as Saint Paul saw in the community of the Thessalonians for which he admired them saying, "***We thank God, for you have shown your faith in action and worked for love.***" (1 Thess. 1:3) He is not only praising their progress in the spiritual field but also love and dedication to the people of the community. The Thessalonians were also God's chosen ones, given faith, love and hope to find true peace. We too are God's chosen ones, anointed with the Holy Spirit to give God glory and honor.

Our words and witness have an impact. We cannot betray our conscience and should make clear what belongs to God (love, prayer, sacrifice, and obedience) and to the Government, what we are asked to fulfill as a citizen. The one thing for sure is that the more we cheat God, the further we drift away from Him. Each one of us is sometimes caught up on the horns of a dilemma in minor and major issues; but a deeper value and a higher call seem to beckon us. Let us allow The Holy Spirit to guide us and choose the higher and deeper value, choose God.

On this day of World Mission Sunday, Our priority is to help His Mission, to preach the Gospel. By helping the Mission of Jesus, we are rightfully choosing to honor and praise our Lord first; then everything else will be fine.

Te llamé por tu nombre

Vivimos en una sociedad donde existe una división cada vez mayor entre quienes tienen y quienes no tienen. Cuando vemos grandes ciudades luchando contra el problema del hacinamiento y la falta de vivienda, y tanta soledad y aislamiento, cuando vemos tanta violencia y asesinatos, cuando vemos comunidades desmoronándose con familias separándose, los problemas educativos Si el sistema se desmorona, la degradación de la vida moral es inevitable. Nos sentimos impotentes e incluso perdemos el sentido de responsabilidad por el bien común, especialmente los educadores, médicos, enfermeras, cuidadores de cuidados paliativos, voluntarios y trabajadores sociales. Jesús es nuestro gurú. Él nos está invitando personalmente a no perder la esperanza porque el Señor que le dio poder al Rey Ciro le dijo: “*Te llamé por tu nombre... aunque no me conoces*”. (Is. 45:4) Como el ciudadano del mundo, seguimos haciendo lo que se supone que debemos hacer en la tierra. Nosotros pertenecemos a dos mundos, el mundo secular y de Dios.

Estamos llamados a ser leales a ambos, pero debemos darnos cuenta de que sólo hay un mundo que cuenta, y es el mundo de Dios. Entonces, mientras vivimos en este mundo, obedecemos sus leyes y seguimos las reglas de nuestros respectivos gobiernos y hacemos lo que podemos para promover la bondad de Dios a través de nuestras acciones y palabras. Y además, realmente cumplimos con los deberes de la parte espiritual del reino de Dios y bajo la propiedad de Dios. Siempre hay una ley superior, un valor más profundo y un llamado persistente que se hace a cada uno de nosotros a ser honestos con Dios y sólo con Dios. Nos inclinamos y respetamos a los demás seres humanos, pero nos arrodillamos ante Dios. La adoración se debe sólo a Dios y es por eso que venimos todas las semanas a la Eucaristía. Durante toda la semana respetamos nuestros deberes, amamos a nuestra familia y obedecemos las reglas y regulaciones de la calle, la comunidad, el estado y el gobierno; pero el domingo venimos a la Iglesia a arrodillarnos frente a nuestro amoro Dios, a adorarlo porque nuestras rodillas se doblarán y nuestra boca confesará que él es el Señor de todos.

Nuestra fe tiene que ser dinámica, llevándonos a acciones por los demás, como vio san Pablo en el comunidad de los Tesalonicenses por lo cual los admiraba diciendo: “*Damos gracias a Dios porque nos a mostrado nuestra fe en acción y trabajado por amor*”. (1 Tes. 1:3) No sólo alaba su progreso en el campo espiritual sino también el amor y la dedicación a las personas de la comunidad. Los tesalonicenses también fueron los elegidos de Dios, a quienes se les dio fe, amor y esperanza para encontrar la paz verdadera. Nosotros también somos los elegidos de Dios, ungidos con el Espíritu Santo para darle a Dios gloria y honor.

Nuestras palabras y testimonio tienen un impacto. No podemos traicionar nuestra conciencia y debemos dejar claro lo que es de Dios (amor, oración, sacrificio y obediencia) y del Gobierno, lo que como ciudadano debemos cumplir. Lo único seguro es que cuanto más engañamos a Dios, más nos alejamos de Él. Cada uno de nosotros en algún momento se ve atrapado en los cuernos de un dilema en cuestiones menores y mayores; pero un valor más profundo y un llamado más elevado parecen llamarnos. Dejemos que El Espíritu Santo nos guíe y elijamos el valor más elevado y profundo, elijamos a Dios.

En este día del Domingo Mundial de las Misiones, Nuestra prioridad es ayudar a Su Misión, predicar el Evangelio. Al ayudar a la Misión de Jesús, con razón elegimos honrar y alabar a nuestro Señor primero; entonces todo lo demás estará bien.





La adicción a la pornografía afecta la salud mental de los jóvenes

Proteger a los niños de la pornografía es cada vez más difícil en el mundo de hoy cada vez más sexualizado y digitalizado. Cuando los jóvenes se vuelven adictos a la pornografía, ésta cambia la química de su cerebro y obstaculiza su capacidad de crecer de manera saludable y normal. Ver pornografía también puede desdibujar los límites para un/a joven, dejándolo/a más vulnerable al abuso sexual. De hecho, los abusadores suelen utilizar la pornografía para insensibilizar a sus víctimas.
