TIMES OF REFRESHING

WE ARE ALL “FISHERS OF MEN” Our Gospel this week recounts the revelation of one of the missions that Jesus left us – to be “Fishers of Men”. Let us think of what it takes to fulfill it. Did Jesus mean solely that we work to have priests and religious in our families? Or are we all called to bring forth people who will bring the image of Christ to one and all so that we may nourish each other and together journey towards our salvation.

Often enough this passage is used for Vocations to the priesthood or religious life. However, I would venture to think that before anyone who is called to this life has to be inspired, encouraged and led to it by their families, friends and the greater community. Therefore, the recruitment of people called to a lifetime of service to the Church is a “shared responsibility”.

I always said that none of our priests and religious simply woke up one fine morning and said, “Ah, it’s a good day today, I think I will become a priest.” The vocation begins in the home with what we see, what we experience and the guidance of those who consider themselves as co-workers in God’s army (That’s us, folks). Therefore, let us remind ourselves that how we live out our Christianity is what draws other people to Jesus who will individually let His Will be known.

OUR MOM WENT HOME TO JESUS AND BE REUNITED WITH DAD On Friday, the 28th of January, as my brother and I tended to our Mom and surrounded by our household staff, our Mom went home to the Lord and back in the arms of Dad who passed away 4 months ago. My siblings, 2 brothers in California and our sister in Switzerland, all had the opportunity to say goodbye and express their love and gratitude as I put the cell-phone on her ear. It was very peaceful, no struggle, no pain. She simply held on to a wooden “comfort cross” that she picked up on a trip to Bethlehem many years ago. All throughout the ordeal which only spanned less than 2 months, Mom never wavered in her faith. Hers was a strong determination to hold on to Jesus despite the challenges. This is what she has always done in her life.

She was cremated the following day as we began the traditional 9 day mass and novena by Zoom attended by family and friends from all over the Philippines and the world. The outpouring of grief was always supported by the memories of how our mother touched so many people’s lives through her involvement in the Philippine travel and tourism industry, the Home for the Blind (her main charity of almost 40 years), the 43 year old company that she founded, her active participation with the Catholic Charismatic Movement (Bukas Loob Sa Diyos. Loosely translated to “opening oneself to God”) and countless other “encounters” with others that only now we are beginning to know.

In the Philippines, we have a tradition that 40 days after a person’s demise, we celebrate a mass which supposedly ends the “period of mourning”. After my brother (who is a Doctor of Medicine) declared our mother to have passed, we counted the 40 days and found out that it will fall on March 8. Guess what? I am flying back to the US on March 9 – a flight I booked way back in the middle of December. Did God plan all of this? Absolutely!

I would like to take this opportunity to thank our Ss. Peter and Paul family, Bishop Weisenburger, many dear friends in Tucson and the Philippines who made it, not only possible, but also very comfortable for me to be back home and with our Mom. Know that your assistance in bringing me home will always be one of the GREATEST GIFTS that I have ever received.

Did you know that...?

- ▶ Over \$500,000 goes directly to Catholic Community Services to help fund programs that serve the poor among us.
- ▶ Bookkeeping services are provided to over **40** parishes, mostly in our smallest communities where they either can't find a bookkeeper or it's simply too expensive.
- ▶ Over \$300,000 to parishes and schools in the form of grants goes for programming, services, repairs or equipment they otherwise could not afford.
- ▶ A full-time staff of Human Resources experts handle employment matters for our parish and Catholic School employees. **78** Parishes, **35** Missions, **25** Catholic Schools.
- ▶ Our schools, which serve a largely lower-income population, are kept strong and viable by services and funding provided by our Catholic Schools Office. **6** High Schools, **19** Elementary Schools.
- ▶ It costs \$40,000 per year to educate each seminarian, our future priests. There are currently **9** young men preparing for the priesthood in our Diocese.
- ▶ The department of Pastoral Services conducts several conferences throughout the year that gives our lay leaders, religious brothers and sisters, and clergy, an opportunity to grow in their faith through education, formation and certification.

The Annual Catholic Appeal serves as a unified effort in which all faithful Catholics throughout our diocese come together to provide critical financial support for the ministries of our parishes, our social services programs, and our diocesan services.

- ▶ Más de \$500,000 se asignan directamente a Servicios Comunitarios Católicos para financiar programas que sirven a los pobres de nuestra comunidad.
- ▶ Se ofrecen servicios de teneduría de libros a más de **40** parroquias, mayormente en las comunidades más pequeñas donde no pueden encontrar un tenedor de libros o el servicio es muy caro.
- ▶ Las parroquias y escuelas reciben más de \$300,000 en subsidios para programas, servicios, reparaciones o equipos que de otra manera no podrían adquirir.
- ▶ Un equipo de expertos en Recursos Humanos de tiempo completo se hace cargo de asuntos laborales de nuestras parroquias y de las escuelas católicas. **78** parroquias, **35** misiones, **25** escuelas católicas.
- ▶ Nuestras escuelas sirven mayormente a una población de bajos ingresos y se mantienen viables y sólidas por los servicios que reciben de nuestra Oficina de Escuelas Católicas. **6** escuelas preparatorias, **19** escuelas primarias.
- ▶ Cuesta \$40,000 al año educar a cada uno de los seminaristas, nuestros futuros sacerdotes. Actualmente son **9** los jóvenes que se preparan para el sacerdocio en nuestra diócesis.
- ▶ Servicios Pastorales conduce varias conferencias a lo largo del año para nuestros líderes laicos, hermanas y hermanos religiosos y miembros del clero. Estas conferencias son para ellos oportunidades de crecimiento en la fe mediante la educación, la formación y la certificación.

La Campaña Católica Anual es un esfuerzo conjunto en que todos los fieles católicos de nuestra diócesis se unen y aportan apoyo económico esencial para los ministerios de nuestras parroquias, programas de servicio social y servicios diocesanos.
