

## April is Child Abuse Prevention Month



Number of kids abused out of every 1000: Alaska is 14.5 National is 9.2 Learn More

Alaska kids are 56% more likely to be abused than the national average Nearly 49% of Alaskan victims are between the ages of 0-4

Neglect is the most common form of maltreatment, followed by physical abuse

More than 800,000 children are confirmed as victims of abuse or neglect each year in the U.S.

1 in 3 girls and 1 in 5 boys will be sexually abused or assaulted before they reach the age of 18.

113 Alaskan children were removed from their homes by OCS in the month of February 2021
