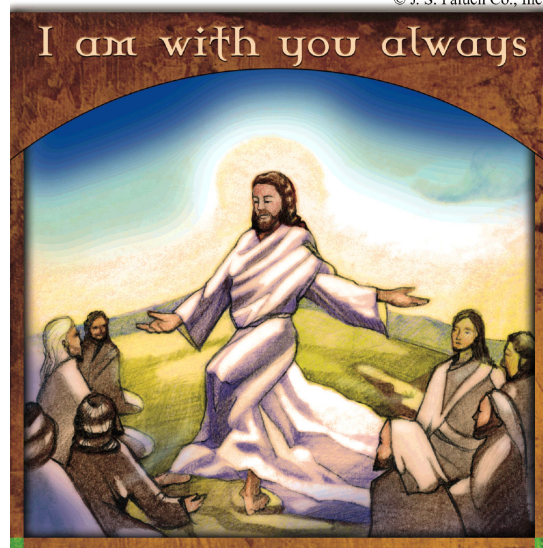

ATTENTION

These precautionary measures, to mitigate the spread of Covid-19 are now in place:

Those who are symptomatic or who have been exposed to another with the virus within 14 days are not permitted to enter church. All are asked to check their temperature at home before coming to church, and to remain at home if you have any symptoms or feel sick.

Those who are at risk because of an underlying health issue or who are over the age of 60 are strongly encouraged to avoid the risk of attending public celebrations of the Mass.

The faithful are obliged to wear a mask entering the church lobby and during the celebration of Mass. Families are to maintain six-foot distancing between their family and others families or individuals throughout Mass; one pew is to be left vacant in between congregants.

Distribution of Holy Communion from the chalice is prohibited to the assembly; communicants are to receive the Body of Christ in the hand.

Please note: all four Missouri Bishops have dispensed the faithful from the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday until further notice. The COVID-19 pandemic presents a serious threat to our physical health!

- Any bags of chips
- Applesauce
- Fruit cups
- Pudding

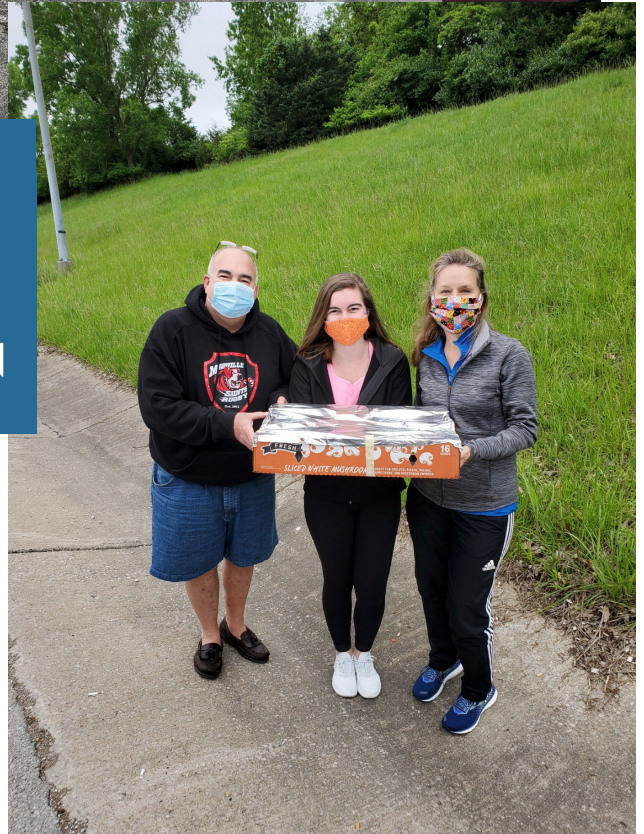
We are also still collecting men's hygiene products for Peter and Paul homeless shelter in the city. Needs include:

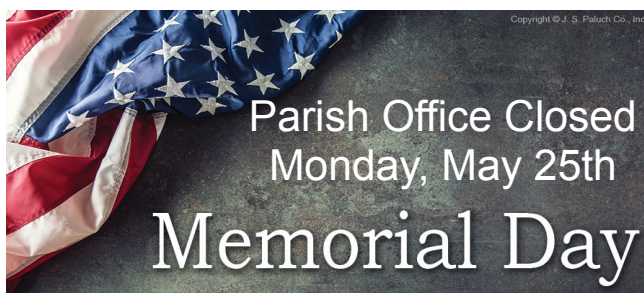

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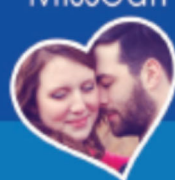
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
