#### SOLEMNDTU OF MARU



#### Dear Friends of Saint Anthony,

"Since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us rid ourselves of every burden and sin that clings to us, and persevere in running the race that lies before us, while keep-

ing our eyes fixed on Jesus, the leader and perfecter of faith."

The great cloud of witnesses includes, ultimately, all of us! In baby Jesus "the grace of God has appeared, saving all, ... not because of any righteous deeds we had done but because of his mercy." Wow! As providence has it, the drama of being human, and its resolution in the encounter with the person Jesus Christ, is all caught up in the mystery of the Immaculate Conception and its connection to Christmas. Better, it is expressed beautifully in the original, but unpublished version of "O Little Town of Bethlehem."

As Professor Michael Pakaluk of CUA explains in "Putting The Immaculate Conception in Christmas," (https://www.thecatholicthing.org/author/mpakaluk/) Episcopal Priest Phillips Brooks' original handwritten third verse of the hymn was: "Where children pure and happy, Pray to the Blessed Child, Where misery cries out to Thee Son of the Undefiled, Where Charity stands watching, and Faith holds wide the door, the dark night wakes the glory hearts, and Christmas comes once more."

To recognize baby Jesus as "Son of the Undefiled" enables us to relate the sinless Mary's "How can it be?" (literally, "the hopes and fears of all the years") to our situation, even as Lauren Daigle does when she sings Mary's question, and, receiving the promise ourselves, respond with praise and witness to "what we have seen and heard"! Surely, "God's vision still has its time, presses on to fulfillment, and will not disappoint!" Merry 8th Day of Christmas!!!
