Dear Friends of Saint Anthony,

'Since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us rid ourselves of every burden and sin that clings to us, and persevere in

running the race that lies before us, while keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus, the leader and perfecter of faith."

The great cloud of witnesses includes the "three Kings of Orient" and all those who recognize life as a journey returning back to the beginning because of Christmas Day. The magi alone "saw" Jesus' star at its rising, and they left everything, "followed" the star, and bought gifts. The priests and scribes knew much more, but it didn't move them, and Herod's fear moved him to genocide. The religious authorities failed, and the political authorities murdered.

The more things change, the more they stay the same! Can we ask God to "rend the heavens and come down," and not expect change? What if the dramatic increase of the "Nones" indicts an "I'm OK, you're OK" religion that demands nothing, risks nothing, and changes nothing? What if the pandemic of fear's cancellation of public worship means part of Herod lives on in us?

Now that it is our turn, let us rejoice that with the three Kings we are "returning to the place we've always belonged, right here with You" singing to baby Jesus: "And it was all so simple, It was easy to love, No space between us. It was easy to trust" because "here's where the dead things come back to living, I feel my heart beating again. It feels so good to know you are my friend."

Epiphany means that "God's vision still has its time, presses on to fulfillment, and will not disappoint!" Merry 12th Day of Christmas forever!
