Dear Friends of Saint Anthony,

The Feast of Epiphany, or "Three Kings" day, is in its own way at the very heart of the meaning of Jesus' incarnation. To paraphrase Meister Eckhardt, if Jesus' eternal birth does not happen in me, how is it salvation? It wasn't salvation for King Herod, the chief priests or the scribes, but it was for the Wise Men and shepherds. What was different about them?

The Wise Men knew that the meaning and purpose of their learning and understanding had to point beyond itself; and the shepherds too, knew that their dignity did not depend on human respect or esteem, so could go serenely about their work as humble servants of God and neighbor. King Herod, the chief priests and the scribes must have thought "it doesn't get any better than this!"

That particular lie and invitation to despair, now lives on as "scientism" which actually boasts of "ARTIFICIAL" intelligence (AI) without getting the joke; and rejects the good, the true, the beautiful because they point to the transcendent. Like the Hobbits we are called to be, when the Herods of our day ask "where the Christ is to be born?" we must be prepared to say, "Thanks for asking!" Jesus is to be born in you, and me, and in everyone made in his image and likeness who desires infinite and eternal love. Why settle for anything less?

Family Service Counselor (Cemetery Service Planning)

Catholic Cemeteries of the Archdiocese of Washington is hiring a Family Service Counselor at Mount Olivet Cemetery in Washington, DC. Family Service Counselors support families by meeting with them in person or remotely to plan for burial services or prepare advance (pre-need) arrangements. They help families select burial sites and explain our varied goods and services. They escort burials on the day of the service, and assist families with the purchase of beautiful memorials. They perform a variety of administrative, operational, and other tasks in support of the ministry, at the direction of a manager. Our priority is to meet with candidates who have prior office experience, and good verbal and written communication and interpersonal skills. Excellent customer service skills and attention to detail are essential for this role. We require a valid driver's license, and a high school diploma or a GED. A background check will be performed. Prior cemetery experience is a plus, but not required. We offer careeroriented training and generous benefits. Our cemeteries are extensions of our parish communities, and we minister to people during one of the most profound and meaningful times of their lives.
