FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Dear Friends of Saint Anthony,

"Since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us rid ourselves of every

burden and sin that clings to us, and persevere in running the race that lies before us, keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus, the leader and perfecter of faith."

The "great crowd of witnesses" was not visible to mortal eyes when Paul and Barnabus preached in Antioch, or better, that crowd of witnesses were disbursed by the jealous religious leadership. This apparent defeat was the occasion of the opening of the Gospel to we Gentiles! It is impossible to overemphasize the importance of this page of salvation history.

What did the religious authorities in Antioch "reject, and condemn themselves as unworthy of eternal life? In a nutshell, the truth about God and man. In "At the Origin of the Christian Claim," Fr. Luigi Giussani, anticipating Pope Benedict XVI's "Deus Caritas Est" (No. 1), argues that the incarnation changes everything! If we accept the hypothesis that the mystery entered the realm of human existence as a man and spoke in human terms, the relationship between a person and God is no longer based on a moral, imaginative, or aesthetic human effort, but instead on an event, an encounter with Jesus, which gives life a whole new horizon and a definite direction. It's no longer about the Law, doctrine, dogma, or discipline accomplished by human effort, but receiving the transformative love of God.

At the origin of Saint Anthony's vision for his parish is the encounter the Apostles had at Pentecost, which alone equips us to "hear Jesus' voice, and follow him." Now that it is our turn, let us prepare to celebrate the restored Pentecost Vigil with an all night celebration, and our Feast day!

"God's vision still has its time, presses on to fulfillment, and will not disappoint. Alleluia!"
