





November 1st

Sainthood isn't just for extraordinary people. It's within reach for all of us. We see a good definition of a saint in today's Psalm 24:1-6:

"The earth is the Lord's and all it holds, the world and those who live there. For God founded it on the seas, established it over the rivers.

Who may go up the mountain of the Lord? Who can stand in his holy place? The clean of hand and pure of heart, who are not devoted to idols, who have not sworn falsely. They will receive blessings from the Lord, and justice from their saving God. Such are the people that love the Lord, that seek the face of the God of Jacob."

It describes a person who longs to see God's face and who has not devoted his soul to what is vain. This person puts his hope and his heart into knowing and serving God. Sanctity is about seeking to please the Lord. Pursuing sainthood is just that: *a pursuit*. Giving your best effort for God means just as much as whatever you "achieve."

The feast of All Saints is about all the holy people who have gone before us – the well known and the hidden saints who are part of that great "cloud of witnesses" in heaven (Hebrews 12:1). It is also a good time to honor the people you have known who made serving the Lord their greatest desire.

It is our desire and effort that can sets us apart and place us on the road to sainthood.

A Prayer for All Saint's Day

Thank you, God, for the tremendous sacrifices made by those who have gone before us. Bless the memories of your saints, and may we learn how to walk and live wisely from their examples of faith, dedication, worship, and love. Amen.



November 2nd

"For this is the will of my Father, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in him may have eternal life, and I shall raise him (on) the last day."

(John 6:40)

What a hope-filled promise Jesus makes here! Everyone who lives and dies in Christ will be raised up on the last day. Because this promise is for everyone, it creates a special link between all of us who are baptized into Christ. It makes us all members of one family, binding us together in ways that go beyond simple church membership. And that means that our prayers for each other – the dead as well as the living - are more than good thoughts and wishful thinking. They have power because we are all united with each other.

The love of God is stronger than death. It reaches across time to bind us together. It bridges heaven and earth. Whether we are praying for someone we know here and now or someone who has already died, God hears us. Surely it pleases him to see his children caring for one another!
