"For it is through the Holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her." (Matthew 1:20)



"No longer will they have need to teach their friends and relatives how to know the Lord. All, from least to greatest shall know me, says the Lord..." (Jer 31:34)

Jeremiah describes a startling shift, from a religion of external forms and observances to a faith where God's precepts are written on the heart, and people will truly "know the Lord". This new way of relating to God enables humankind to grasp and receive more readily the gift of God's mercy: "I will forgive their evildoing and remember their sin no more."

The Hebrew verb "to know" conveys far more than simply having factual information about a person or thing. This kind of knowing involves the whole person, body, mind, and spirit. So we are invited to enter into an intimate, loving relationship with the God who loves and desires us, and wants to forgive us and restore us into a covenant relationship of promise and trust.

In Psalm 46 we are told "Be still and know that I am God!" The word for know in this verse is the same as that used by Jeremiah in today's passage; it is significant that *knowing* God is linked in the psalm with the still surrender of trust and prayer. This sort of surrender to God is costly because we have to let go of our surface preoccupation and plunge into the unknown. It is a kind of dying to self, a letting go of the controls so that the Spirit of God can take possession of us. In the Gospel Jesus speaks of the seed falling to the ground and dying before it can spring up and bear fruit. This obviously applies to himself, but also challenges us to die to ourselves in order to live for him. Knowing God in the surrender of deep prayer is one way of doing this.

I surrender myself to you O God, body, mind, and spirit. You know me totally; teach me how to know you and teach me how to let go into you.
