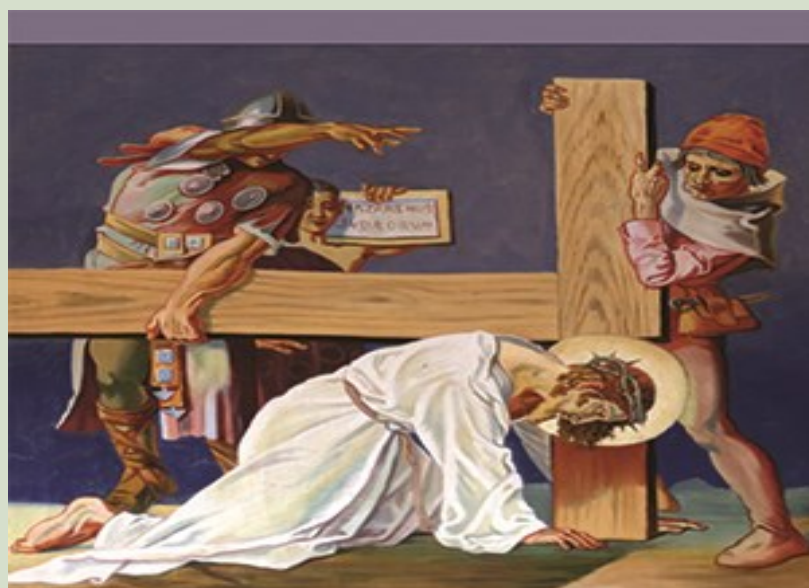

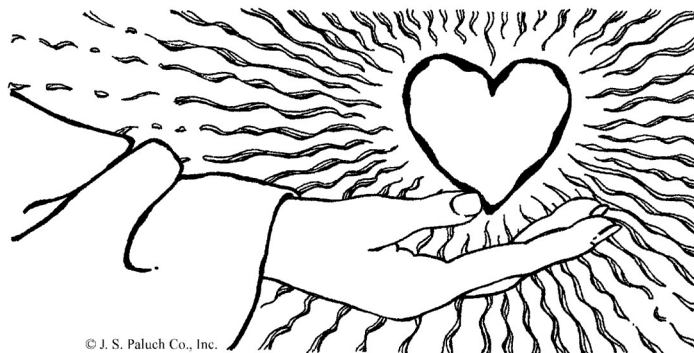

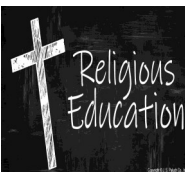

**DISCUSSIONS WITH DAVE...**

*I frequently am asked what the appropriate time is after communion to stop kneeling and be seated. I answer this first by asking you, "Why are you kneeling?"*

The answer of course is that those who are able to physically kneel are kneeling because the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ is present and exposed to us. He is within our midst and Truly Present on the Holy Altar. The faithful are encouraged to remain kneeling until the Eucharist is reposed in the Tabernacle and all fragments which remain in the sacred vessels have been purified by the priest, deacon or acolyte. After the principal veiled chalice is given to the altar server, you can be assured the vessels have been properly purified and can then be seated. Some of the faithful choose to remain kneeling until the priest, deacon or acolyte is seated. Traditionally, this was the custom as it gave validation to the people that the Eucharist was properly reposed in the Tabernacle and no fragments remain as all had been consumed. Some of the faithful choose to remain kneeling throughout the moment of silence and will go to a standing position for the closing prayer. This too is perfectly acceptable! The worship of our Lord through our outward signs of reverence (like kneeling) help deepen the love and respect we have for Him. ~ David Workman
