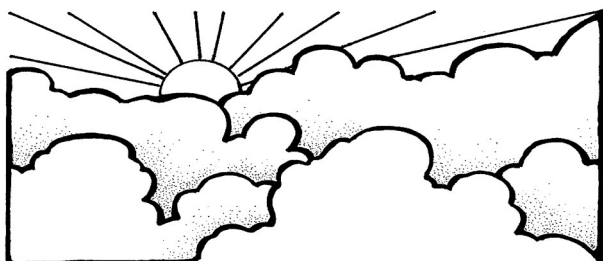

DISCUSSIONS WITH DAVE...

Recently, the Year 2 Confirmation class and OCIA(RCIA) class met in the church for a walk through Mass and to review the various items and objects found in our church. Even though both classes were on different evenings, many of the same questions were asked by both groups! The first question was about the crucifix which hangs above our altar.

What do the letters INRI above Jesus' body mean?

The four letters are taken from the Latin words, "Iesus Nazarenus Rex Iudaeorum" which translates to "Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews". It was customary for those being crucified that their "crime" be posted on the cross. The sign was written in Aramaic, Latin and Greek. Given we are a Latin Rite church, it is widely accepted for these letters to be placed on crucifixes as a reminder to us that He did not commit a "crime". Rather, as gospel writer John points out, was given a title. He was, is and continues to be our King who suffered an unimaginable death for our sins so that we may share eternal life with Him in Heaven.
